- donations received, including Gift Aid, were £1,177.50.




After schools in the Philippines re-opened during the year following the relaxing of COVID-19 pandemic restrictions, the trustees recommenced funding feeding programmes for under-nourished children attending the Don Calixto Sr. Yongco Elementary School and the San Remigio Central School, and started funding a similar programme at the Cubacub Elementary School.

Both the Schools the trustees had been supporting - the San Remegio Central School and the Don Calixto Sr Yongco Elementary School – re-opened during this year after the relaxing of restrictions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, and funding of the feeding programmes in the school was recommenced. A third school, Cubacub Elementary School, was also added to the feeding programme.

In total, more than 440 children benefitted from this programme.

- organised fundraising events raised £3,572.98;
- sponsorship events organised raised £209.10; and
- donations received, including Gift Aid, were £2,433.97.






- organised fundraising events raised £3,173.22;
- sponsorship events organised raised £632.13; and
- donations received, including Gift Aid, were £2,330.56.






Though both the Schools the trustees have been supporting - the San Remegio Central School and the Don Calixto Sr Yongco Elementary School – remained closed during this year due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the schools have continued modular or remote learning throughout the last academic year.

The trustees have continued to provide the funding for bags of food essentials that has enabled the feeding once a week of 150 children, who have been identified by a government programme as being under-nourished, at Don Calixto Sr Yongco Elementary School. The bag is handed out to parents when they collect the learning modules at the School.

The trustees also provided funds to the San Remegio Central School to enable them to purchase a photocopier, toners and 300 reams of bond paper that has allowed them to produce the learning materials needed by their scholars.

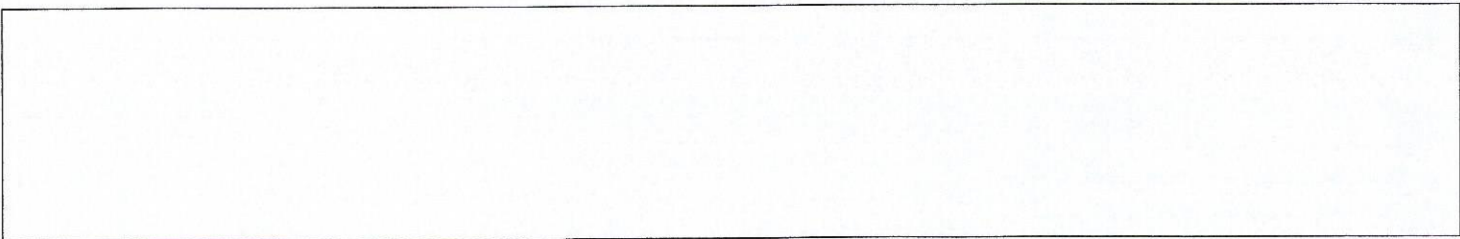

- donations received, including Gift Aid, were £4,973.71, up from £2,868.31 in the previous year.





