

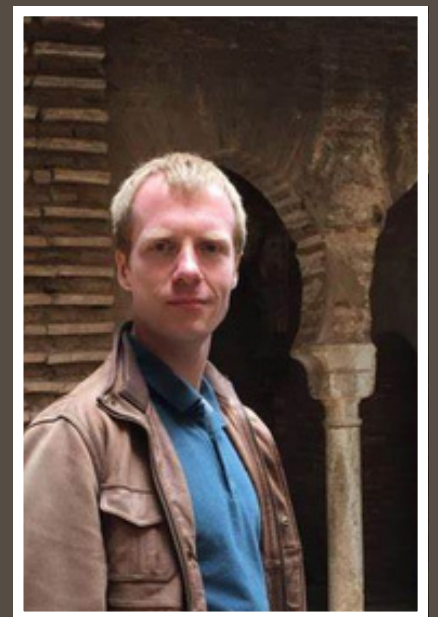


HERITAGE OPEN WEEKEND

On 14th September 2024, the Friends of Brixworth Church participated in the National Heritage Open Day event, offering mini guided tours of the church throughout the day. Many visitors extended their experience with a tour of nearby historic buildings along the Brixworth Heritage Trail. Our Heritage Centre welcomed visitors with a fascinating exhibition from the Brixworth History Society, and homemade cakes and refreshments were served. The beautiful weather ensured a great turnout, with the tours being so popular that additional times were added on the day.

ANNUAL LECTURE

The Annual Brixworth Lecture was held on Saturday 2nd November. The subject 'The Reign of Offa of Mercia in Context' was presented by Professor Rory Naismith, University of Cambridge and proved to be very popular with the church almost full. A number of students from Oxford, Cambridge and Leicester universities attended and were taken on a tour of the church by Professor Story before the lecture. Tea and cake were served in the Heritage Centre by members of the Friends prior to the start of the lecture. The Trustees thank Professor Jo Story for arranging the visiting lecturer and attending to support the Friends on the day.

It was with great sadness the Trustees made the decision to 'cancel' our Annual Friends' Day at the beginning of June. Unfortunately, the response for attendance was very low and the event would not have been viable. CHURCH PROJECTS

There were no 'major' projects during the year which the Parochial Church Council had requested financial assistance with. However, going forward there are a number of identified maintenance issues requiring attention in order to keep the fabric of the church in good order and the Trustees will be actively supporting the PCC with these. The next Quinquennial Inspection is due to take place in June 2026 and the Trustees will be supporting any urgent requests for financial support as a matter of priority.

GROUP GUIDED TOURS

We are very pleased to be able to welcome visitors to our church, both as individuals and as groups. The church is open every day during daylight hours and it is pleasing to see visitor numbers have increased during the summer months since the Pandemic, though having inspected the visitor's book, it appears there was someone visiting the church almost every day.

Our three knowledgeable Guides conducted eight arranged tours during the year, consisting of groups of varying sizes from a selection of different organisations; U3A History Groups, Christian Fellowship, National Farmers Union, Rotary Club and University Students etc. Some of the groups, particularly those who travelled from out of the county, also stayed for refreshments served in the Heritage Centre making the visit more of a social occasion.

The Friends of Brixworth Church have formally approved the Financial Statements for the year ended 2024, which will be filed with the Charity Commission in due course.

The charity achieved a positive cash surplus of £10,149 for the year. Fundraising events continued to be the primary source of income, supplemented by steady sales of our publications. While rising costs associated with hosting events have presented some challenges, the Trustees are actively monitoring event pricing to ensure the best possible outcomes for the charity. The Trustees were especially grateful for the generous sponsorship received from O’Riordan Bond during the year.

Income from the Heritage Centre declined slightly over the course of 2024; however, bookings for 2025 are already showing encouraging growth, with a number of new groups now making use of the facilities.

Requests for financial support from the Parochial Church Council were limited during the year. As a result, the Trustees made the decision to transfer surplus funds to the Charity’s Deposit Account, where they will earn a better return until needed for the maintenance and preservation of the church’s fabric.

Friends of All Saints' Brixworth is registered with the Charity Commissioners as a CIO (number 1168452) and is constituted by a Trust Deed dated 28th January 1986, amended 7th October 2008. The Charities Act 2006 requires specific identification of 'public benefit'. The Trustees confirm that the objectives and aims, as described below, fall within the following charitable purposes - The 'advancement of culture and heritage' and the 'advancement of religion'.

The objectives of the charity are currently to maintain, improve, supplement and keep in good repair the fabric, fittings, furniture and furnishings of the Parish Church of All Saints' Brixworth and its churchyard and Heritage Centre. The Friends of All Saints' Brixworth also aim to foster interest in the Parish Church from near and far, not only as a place of worship but also for its significance to the area's local heritage.

Review of the year and future developments:

Trustees consider they were able to adequately fulfilling their objectives with respect to church projects and Heritage Centre maintenance. The Board of Trustees were able to meet face-to-face five times to discuss requests from the Parochial Church Council for financial assistance and to arrange fundraising events.

The focus during the year was to complete the church repairs as outlined in the Quinquennial Report which was undertaking in June 2021. Repairs to the church roof, three windows, the Saxon door at the base of the Tower and various parts of the exterior and interior stonework were all completed. In addition, the long-awaited repair to the Font in the church was at last completed. The church internal lighting was upgraded to LED providing brighter light and being far more efficient to run. All of the above items were supported financially by the Friends and a total of £11,968 was granted to the Parochial Church Council to assist with the projects.

Fundraising events included a Curry & Quiz evening and the Annual Brixworth Lecture.

The Board of Trustees continue to work with the Parochial Church Council to ensure the objectives of the Charity in relation to the maintenance of the fabric of the Church are upheld.

Finance Report:

The Cash, Bank, and Investment balance at 31st December 2022 is approximately £39k. Total assets including buildings amount to approximately £370K. The Charities' income during 2022 was slightly up compared with that of 2021. The major factors were the increase in visitor numbers and sale of publications and the hire of the Heritage Centre. The Charity has held a small capital reserve in COIF Charities Investment Fund for several years, and acknowledges that, owing to the current financial situation, the growth that has been achieved over this period has not been very strong.

Trustees:

Trustee resignations were received from Caroline Monk and Sue Howard. However, we were pleased to welcome Libby Bowers, Sandy Cummings and Hannah Brunton as new Trustees.

The Annual Friends' Day Meeting took place on the first weekend of June, this included a Service of Thanksgiving, a History Talk and a report on the activities of the Friends. The Trustee's report, together with the Treasurer's report and accounts are published on our website. Treasurer's accounts for 2022 were accepted and approved at a Board of Trustees meeting on 15th March 2023.

Friends of All Saints' Brixworth is registered with the Charity Commissioners (number 1168452) and is constituted by a Trust Deed dated 28th January 1986, amended 7th October 2008.

The Charities Act 2006 requires specific identification of 'public benefit'. The Trustees confirm that the objectives and aims, as described below, fall within the following charitable purposes - The 'advancement of culture and heritage' and the 'advancement of religion'.

The objectives of the charity are currently to maintain, improve, supplement and keep in repair the fabric, fittings, furniture and furnishings of the Parish Church of All Saints' Brixworth and its churchyard and Heritage Centre. The Friends of All Saints' Brixworth also aim to foster interest in the Parish Church from near and far, not only as a place of worship but also for its significance to the area's local heritage.

Review of the year and future developments:

Despite another year of disruption imposed by COVID restrictions the Trustees consider that the charity adequately fulfilled their 2021 objectives with respect to church projects and Heritage Centre maintenance. The Board of Trustees continued to meet (mostly on Zoom) throughout the year. As the pandemic restrictions eased, we held two very successful fundraising events; the Annual Brixworth Lecture in November and a Christmas Concert featuring a local choir in December.

Hire of the Heritage Centre opened again in July with a strict cleaning regime in place. Visitors to the church started to return and the number increased as the year progressed, resulting in higher sales of publications. Income from the hire of the Heritage Centre and sale of publications remain two of our most stable and profitable forms of income.

Our new website went live in March and is proving to be successful resulting in a slight increase in membership, both in number and participation, though the need to reinvigorate the membership is still an ongoing objective. However, support for the Friends' activities during the year was pleasingly high. We continued to communicate with members through circulation of an annual newsletter and provide notifications of events via email and our website.

As a result of an accessibility safety issue in church the Friends agreed to fund a pair of fixed handrails to be installed either side of the steps to the Apse. Work to obtain designs and quotes from local firms commenced and it is hoped these will be fitted early in 2022.

Over the next twelve to eighteen months the Trustees aim to focus on financial support to the PCC in order to achieve the successful completion of repairs to the Church as identified by the architect in the Quinquennial Report. Further consideration is being given to support where upgrades could be made to make efficiency savings in the Church.

Finance Report:

The Cash, Bank, and Investment balance at 31st December 2021 is approximately £42k. Total assets including buildings amount to approximately £370K. The Charities' income during 2021 was slightly down compared with that of 2020. The major factors were the reduction in visitor numbers and sale of publications. The Charity has held a small capital reserve in COIF Charities Investment Fund for several years, and acknowledges that, owing to the current financial situation, the growth that has been achieved over this period has not been very strong.

Trustees:

Rev. David Reith, the new incumbent for Brixworth, joined as a Trustee at the beginning of the year. There were no further Trustee appointments or resignations during the year.

Due to the COVID 19 restrictions the Annual Friends' Day Meeting scheduled to take place in June 2021 was cancelled therefore the Trustee's report, together with the Treasurer's report and accounts have been published on our website. Treasurer's report and accounts for 2021 were accepted and approved at a Board of Trustees meeting on 22nd March 2022.

Despite the COVID-19 pandemic restrictions imposed in March the Trustees consider the charity adequately fulfilled their 2020 objectives with respect to church projects which concentrated mainly upon support to church repairs and Heritage Centre maintenance.

The Board of Trustees continued to meet regularly throughout the year on Zoom, reviewing finances, making decisions on church projects, and planning for when the pandemic came to an end (whenever that would be).

We had one very successful fundraising event in February before the lockdown began. A 'Curry & Quiz' evening raised just under £1000 towards our funds. The Church and Heritage Centre closed to visitors and remained so for the rest of the year. Friends' Day, the Brixworth Lecture and a Christmas Concert were all cancelled.

Income from the hire of the Heritage Centre and the sale of publications, two of our most stable and profitable forms of income, came to almost an abrupt halt.

In September a team of steeplejacks removed the battered looking cockerel weathervane from the church spire. This was taken to a workshop for repair and regilding. In early October the steeplejacks returned and replaced the, now very shiny, cockerel back on top of the church spire. The team also carried out an inspection of the fabric of the steeple, tested the lightning conductor and repaired some roofing tiles which had been damaged in a storm a few weeks earlier. The Friends contributed £1,500 towards this project.

The Heritage Centre building, the first Charity School dating back to 1811, was showing signs of distress to the stonework on the roadside due to salt erosion. In October the Trustees employed a local stone mason to replace some of the stones in the lower half of the wall on the North side of the building. This maintenance will ensure the building remains watertight for some years to come.

The need to reinvigorate the membership, both in numbers and participation, is still an ongoing objective. This project has obviously been on hold during the year. However, in September we undertook to build a new website to inform visitors about the heritage of the Church and the work of the Friends. This time it will include a 'donate' button and an online 'publications' shop. It is planned to launch the website in early 2021.

Finance Report:

The Cash, Bank, and Investment balance on 31st December 2020 is approximately £39k. Total assets including buildings amount to approximately £370K. The Charities' income during 2020 was significantly reduced. The Charity has held a small capital reserve in COIF Charities Investment Fund for several years, and acknowledges that owing to the current financial situation, the growth that has been achieved over this period has not been very strong.

The Trustees have £20K in the Charities Deposit Account thereby gaining some interest on the funds. It is not envisaged that this money would be required immediately for church projects until the outcome of the church Quinquennial inspection in 2021 but is accessible should the occasion arise.

Trustees:

Our incumbent for the last seven years, the Revd. Chloe Willson-Thomas, left Brixworth Church in February for another post in Buckinghamshire. Following a period of interregnum, a new Rector, the Revd. David Reith, was appointed and arrived at Brixworth in October. We hope he will accept an invitation to become a Trustee of the Friends. A new Treasurer, Ian Smorfitt was appointed at the beginning of 2020 and has supported the Friends throughout the year. The Treasurer's report and accounts for 2020 were accepted and approved at a Board of Trustees meeting in March 2021. The Trustee's report for 2020, together with the Treasurer's report and accounts will be published on our website.
