With the permission of Allah, we are delighted to present our Annual Report for 2022/23.

It is with the generosity and mercy of The Almighty that One Ummah was able to positively impact millions of our brothers and sisters suffering around the world. This year marks a decade of One Ummah's work, and it has been full of immense challenges and suffering for many communities worldwide. With the aid of Allah and then thanks to your support, we have remained steadfast in our commitment to easing hardship and fostering hope amongst the Ummah.

One Ummah has actively responded to many crises over the year, providing critical humanitarian aid to 19 countries. Our teams have worked daily to deliver food packs, hot meals, water and medical aid, hygiene kits, emergency winter aid, and much more.

We have always strived to reach the most vulnerable and deprived communities. This includes providing relief to our brothers and sisters in Yemen, Syria, Turkey, Lebanon, Pakistan, Afghanistan, Bangladesh, India, Uganda, Malawi, Tanzania, Kenya, Sierra Leone and more.

This year, we tackled five tragic emergencies that shook the Ummah at its core: the Turkey-Syria earthquake, the Pakistan and Bangladesh floods, Afghanistan crisis and the ongoing situation in Gaza. One Ummah was able to immediately mobilise teams to respond and provide direct emergency relief within days of the emergencies taking place.

In the wake of the Turkey-Syria earthquake, our teams navigated damaged roads and infrastructure, risking their lives to deliver essential aid to affected families, Alhamdulillah.

In Bangladesh, we distributed food packs, water, and hygiene kits to families affected by the devastating floods, Alhamdulillah.

Alhamdulillah, in Pakistan, we united to reach remote communities by boat, providing food, shelter, and medical assistance to those displaced by one of the worst floods in Pakistan's history.

In June, Afghanistan experienced a seismic event, causing significant impact. Our teams immediately intervened, delivering food packs and hygiene assistance to the numerous individuals affected.

One Ummah has provided unwavering support throughout the ongoing Palestinian situation. Our team has been on the ground delivering food, medical supplies, and essential aid to those in need for many years, Alhamdulillah.

Despite our challenges, we remain committed to providing life-saving aid and fostering sustainable development. This year's top priorities include expanding our sustainability projects, such as rehousing initiatives and microfinance programmes.

Once again, as the Prophet said in an authentic narration, *"He who does not thank the people is not thankful to Allah"* [Abi Dawud].

Therefore, I would like to say Jazakum Allahu Khairan for the relentless support of our donors, the dedication of our staff and volunteers, and the services of our partners, without whom our achievements would not be possible.

In keeping with this prophetic tradition, I would on behalf of the board of trustees like to show my gratitude to everybody who contributed to the life-saving work of One Ummah.

I would like to thank our generous donors, who during an unprecedented cost-of-living crisis, have continued to dig ever deeper and give in order to alleviate the suffering of our brothers and sisters. I would like to thank our staff and volunteers, who continually go over and beyond to deliver life-saving aid to some of the most vulnerable and hard-to-reach communities across crisis-hit countries. Without you all, the lives of millions of our brothers and sisters would still be at significant risk. May Allah grant each of you the highest level of Jannah, Ameen.

At One Ummah, we are guided by the words of the Prophet Muhammad when he said,

"The parable of the believers in their affection, mercy, and compassion for each other is that of a body. When any limb aches, the whole body reacts with sleeplessness and fever."

This pain was deeply felt this past year, as the Ummah suffered a series of devastating blows brought about by natural disasters.

In Pakistan, severe flooding led to 2.2 million houses damaged or destroyed, leading to 8 million people becoming internally displaced (IDPs), with 1,739 fatalities.

In Bangladesh, an estimated 7.2 million people were impacted by flooding, with hundreds of deaths. In Somalia, according to one UN report, around 43,000 people may have died due to drought.

In Afghanistan, a country already reeling from mass food poverty, two earthquakes struck at a magnitude of 7.4 Mw and 6.1 Mw, resulting in 1,350 deaths.

We then witnessed the devastating earthquakes that struck Turkey and northern and western Syria, which caused widespread damage in an area of about 350,000 km² and which resulted in 59,259 confirmed deaths.

By the grace and power of Allah, One Ummah teams responded swiftly to these disasters, and continue to provide support as we move from an emergency phase to a rebuilding one. I ask everybody to continue your du'aas and donations, as much work remains to be done.

Sadly, the continual challenges the Muslim world faces from natural disasters, climate change, war, conflict and persecution, means that One Ummah will have to be ever-ready in its preparedness to emergencies in order to provide a swift humanitarian aid response. We are in this for the long haul, and whilst we deal with emergencies, we hope to continue our long term programmes that tackle poverty across 19 crisis-hit countries.

I also want to stress that as a board, we take our commitment to a 100% donation policy very seriously. We will always value the trust of our supporters and guarantee that every penny generously donated by you will be allocated to the intended cause only.

Finally, I would like to say Jazakum Allahu Khairan once again. Thank you for giving us the platform to transform millions of lives each year. May Allah accept all our efforts, Ameen.

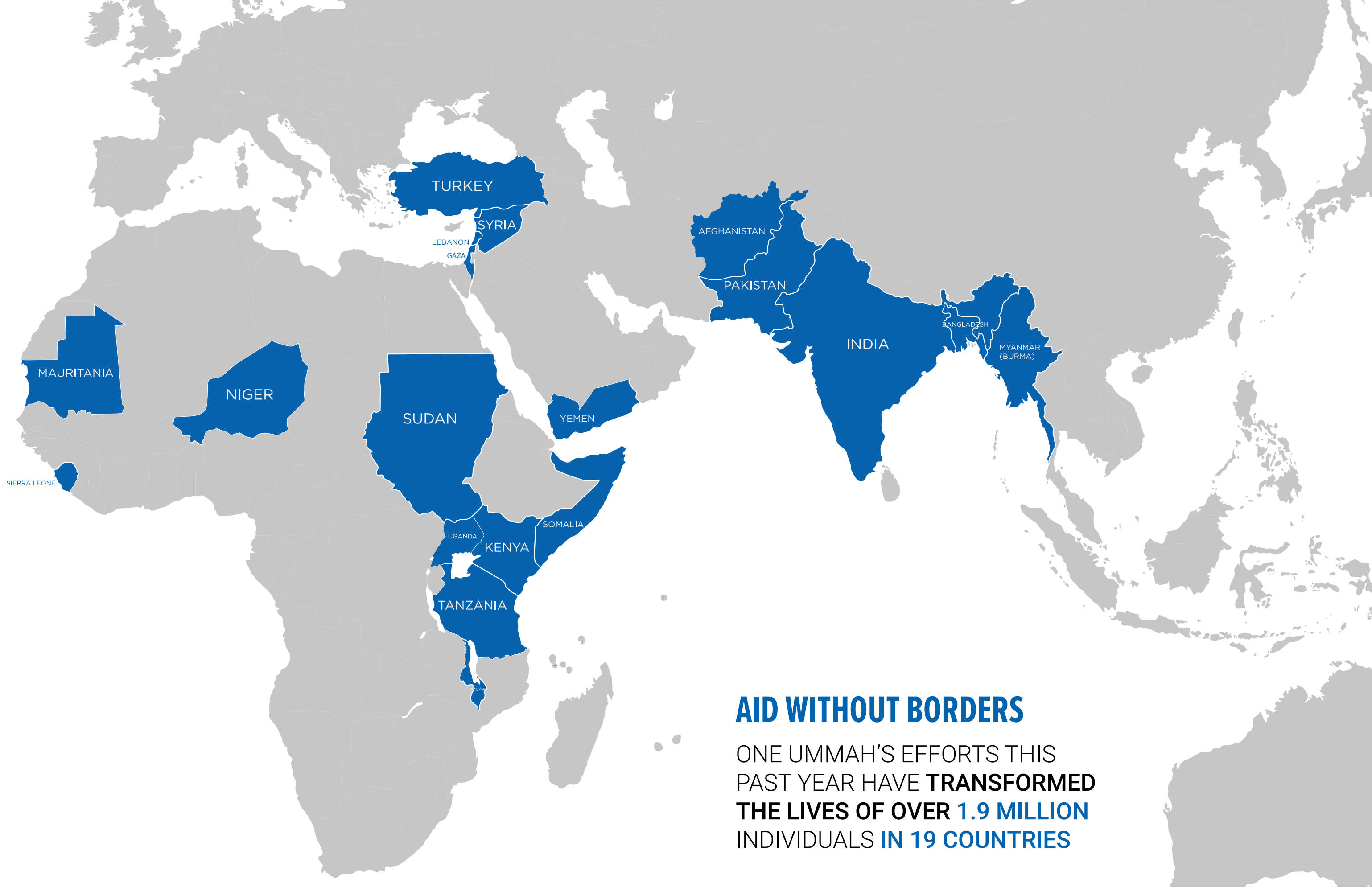

EMERGENCY APPEAL

URGENT CRISIS RESPONSE

AFGHANISTAN

Afghanistan stands on the brink of a humanitarian catastrophe, with over half the population - a **staggering 24 million people** - fighting daily for survival. The economic collapse has thrown **8.7 million Afghans** into a massive risk of starvation. Over 3 million were internally displaced and uprooted. Another 5.2 million have fled the country, seeking refuge beyond its borders due to the withdrawal of U.S. led forces and natural disasters. **May Allah alleviate their suffering, Ameen.**

The grip of hunger tightens around Afghanistan, with food prices soaring 60%, leaving families unable to put food on the table. **2.2 million children under five** are facing critical levels of malnutrition. **Without urgent relief, they will die.**

By Allah's grace and in the face of this crisis, One Ummah has responded, overcoming immense challenges to deliver life-saving aid to thousands of suffering families. **We provided essential aid packs, bottled water, dried food packs, hygiene kits, and medical aid packs, offering a lifeline to those in dark times.**



OCCUPIED PALESTINIAN TERRITORIES

An astounding 5 million Palestinians, over half the population, are crammed together, living under the weight of occupation. Their roots have been torn apart, and their futures remain bleak.

Over 80% of the Palestinian population is in poverty, and over 40% face the unbearable reality of food insecurity. Furthermore, since 2022, over 17,000 have been injured due to the occupation and from July 2022 alone, over 230 have been killed - including 66 children and 39 women.

Behind the shocking numbers are real human lives. Countless stories of suffering - mothers mourning their lost children, families shattered by violence, loved ones ripped from their arms. **Their cries for justice echo through the years, unanswered and unheard, decade after decade, as they await justice and freedom.** We pray to Allah to put an end to the occupation in Palestine.

By Allah's permission, One Ummah has been operating in Palestine for a number of years amidst the chaos, providing hope. Over the years, we have provided critical humanitarian relief through emergency food packs, medical aid packs, tents and shelters, water aid, clean clothing, and warm blankets, to name a few.



PAKISTAN

The catastrophe in Pakistan has left absolute devastation in its wake. **33 million people** had their lives shattered as a **torrential monsoon rained down**, resulting in one of Pakistan's worst floods in history. **Floodwater destroyed nearly 1 million homes entirely.** Roads and infrastructure were wiped out across the country, while livestock perished by the millions.

Total **financial damage** and loss stands at over **£20 billion**, but the emotional toll on the people is impossible to measure. Entire communities are ravaged, families torn apart, and livelihoods destroyed. 22,000 schools are ruined, affecting access to education on a large scale. **May Allah alleviate the suffering of our brothers and sisters.**

Alhamdulillah, One Ummah was able to react quickly and **provide emergency humanitarian relief to ease the devastation of the floods.** We were able to distribute in the most remote locations using boats and other forms of transport. **Our critical aid included emergency aid packs, food packs, bottled water, hygiene kits and medical aid packs.**



TURKEY/SYRIA

The violent 7.8 magnitude earthquake struck the Turkey-Syria border on 6th February 2023, unleashing a tragedy. **Over 60,000** of our brothers and sisters **lost their lives**, and more than **230,000 were injured.** The earthquake marked Turkey's deadliest natural disaster since 1999.

Entire neighbourhoods were reduced to rubble in seconds as buildings collapsed on top of one another. The devastation left residents traumatised, stumbling through the wreckage, searching for their families in the hope that they were alive.



BANGLADESH

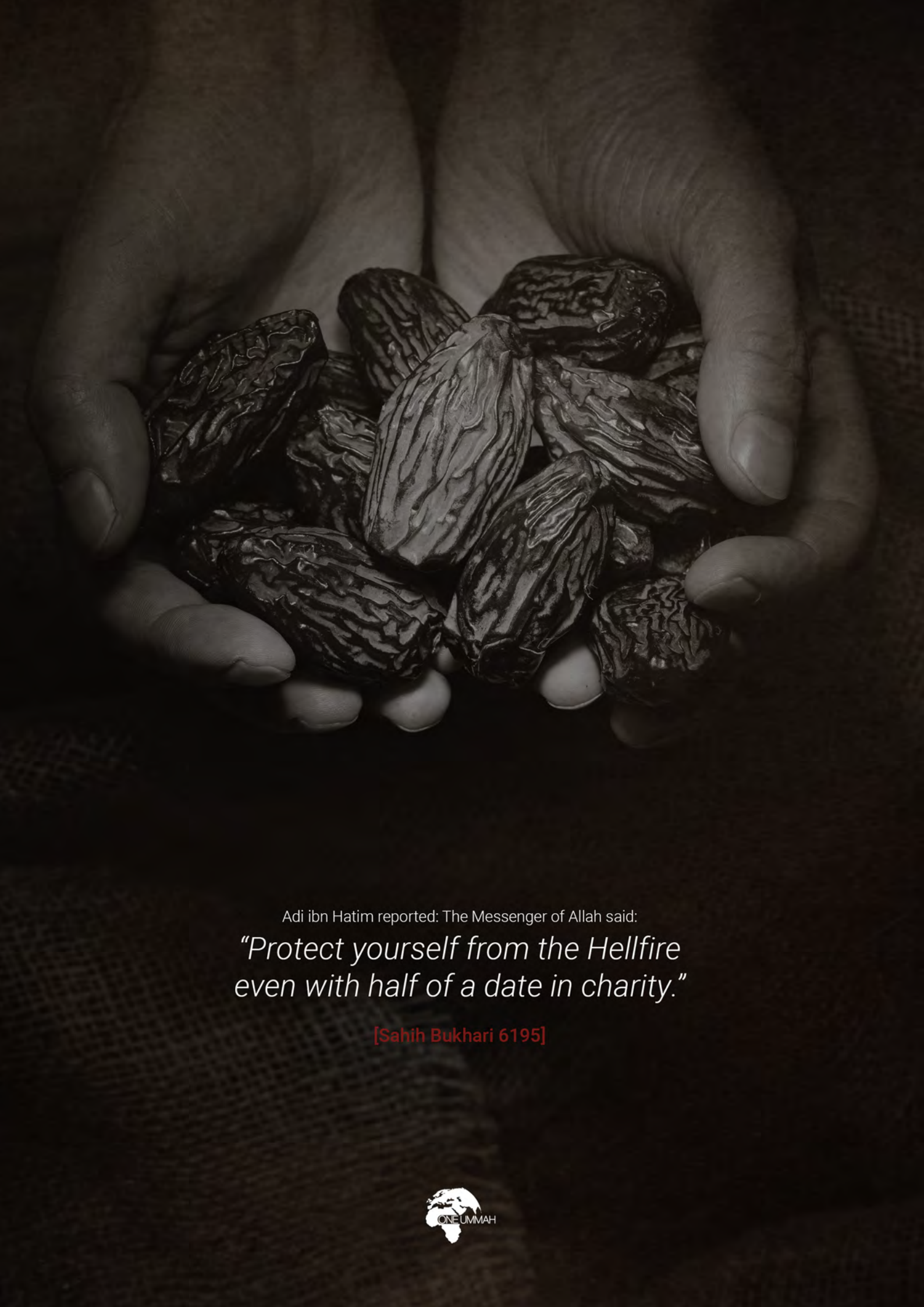
Bangladesh was ravaged with a critical flood emergency which devastated over 3 million people. The heavy rains caused widespread flooding across more than one-third of the country's districts, leaving a trail of destruction in its wake. **Hundreds of thousands of families have been displaced and their houses destroyed.**

Clean water and food has been scarce. With crops destroyed and supply chains disrupted, the threat of famine looms large for many families. Waterborne diseases are an increased risk due to the limitation of healthcare services and medicine.

Essential infrastructure like power lines and communication networks have been severely damaged which makes it difficult to reach isolated communities with vital aid. Roads have been rendered useless, and **whole communities find themselves underwater.**

Alhamdulillah, **One Ummah's UK team flew out immediately and provided assistance in isolated areas** in the form of food packs, hot meals, shelter, water and hygiene supplies.





SYRIA

TWELVE YEARS OF TURMOIL

DESPITE ONGOING CONFLICT, **YOUR DONATIONS** EMPOWERED **314,180 VULNERABLE INDIVIDUALS** IN **WAR-TORN SYRIA**

The current Syrian nightmare is the result of a 12-year civil war that has killed hundreds of thousands and torn apart millions more. The nation's infrastructure lies in ruins, its economy collapses, and its people are caught in the crossfire. The relentless battle for food, water, shelter, and medicine worsens daily.

Despite the hardships, Syrians have no choice but to persevere. With more than 13 million displaced from their homes and unemployment soaring to an alarming 50%, an estimated £8.2 billion is required to provide the humanitarian aid needed to help our brothers and sisters survive and rebuild.

Guided by the principles of compassion taught by our beloved Prophet, One Ummah stood as a beacon of hope for the people of Syria in this disastrous situation. We have provided vital humanitarian aid for over ten years, both within Syria and its borders. Our staff have been a lifeline for those who have faced the backlash of the conflict.

We will not forget their pain and we will continue our mission to ease the suffering in Syria. With the support of our noble donors, we pray that Allah shines hope and empowers these communities to rebuild and reclaim their lives.

OCCUPIED PALESTINE

LIFE UNDER OCCUPATION

OVER THE PAST 12 MONTHS, ONE UMMAH DELIVERED ESSENTIAL AID TO 173,555 PEOPLE IN PALESTINE

Gaza stands as one of the world's most densely populated cities in the world, home to more than 2 million people. Devastatingly, a significant majority of its population endure extreme poverty and rely on humanitarian aid for their survival. **One Ummah's dedicated team have been working tirelessly to sustain the lives of these Palestinians.**

The Israeli occupation has inflicted devastation upon the Palestinian people, leaving them broken, resulting in a frail economy and rising unemployment which has forced the population into widespread poverty. Half of Gaza is unemployed. **Access to essential services such as healthcare and education remains impossible for many, rendering them helpless and deprived of fundamental human rights.**

The **blockade of the Gaza Strip** has **restricted travel and trade**, as well as access to agricultural land and fishing waters. This has created significant challenges for Palestinians in supporting their families, crippling the economy and **leaving Gazans in a cycle of poverty and unemployment.**

One Ummah is striving to alleviate the pain and suffering of the Palestinians. **We have been on the ground in Palestine for over a decade.** We provided shelter to those displaced, handed out emergency food packs, and made medical supplies available to the injured. One Ummah has built a number of desalination units providing clean water to thousands, and with your help, our efforts will continue to provide urgent relief to those in need. **May Allah make us a vehicle to help alleviate the suffering of our brothers and sisters. Ameen.**

YEMEN

THE FORGOTTEN WAR

DURING A DEVASTATING HUMANITARIAN CRISIS, OUR AID WAS A LIFELINE FOR 307,890 PEOPLE IN YEMEN

The war has triggered one of the most devastating humanitarian crises in history, leaving over 80% of the population in desperate need of critical humanitarian assistance.

The ongoing conflict that has cast a shadow over Yemen since 2015 shows no sign of stopping, throwing 24 million people into a dire state of famine, disease and displacement, made worse by the acute food and water insecurity.

The healthcare system has collapsed under the weight of the conflict, and with 50% of hospitals closed, over 11 million desperate have been left without humanitarian assistance. Over 2 million innocent children have been denied their right to education, and over 500,000 are grappling with the effects of severe malnutrition.

The situation in Yemen has orphaned around 3 million children. These vulnerable children are at extremely high risk, faced with the constant threat of food deprivation and disease.

One Ummah stands committed to our mission to save lives in dozens of war-torn areas throughout Yemen. With the unwavering support of our donors, dedicated staff, and most importantly, the blessings of Allah, we can create a lasting impact for the people of Yemen. Millions more will die if we don't act now.

PAKISTAN A MOUNTAIN TO CLIMB

WE DELIVERED CRUCIAL HUMANITARIAN AID TO 159,410 BENEFICIARIES IN PAKISTAN

Pakistan, a country with a rich history and vibrant culture, faces immense challenges. Poverty is a massive cause of hunger, malnutrition and disease in Pakistan. **Almost a quarter of Pakistan lives below the poverty line, stripped of access to food, shelter, clothing and healthcare.**

As a result of its food insecurity, Pakistan is more vulnerable to the long-term effects of climate change, threatening to disrupt agricultural activities and unleash **extreme weather events like the recent deadly floods**, which devastated Pakistan's infrastructure, **causing billions in damage.**

Pakistan was devastated by the worst floods in its history, leaving 33 million people homeless and over £20 billion of damage in its wake.

Thanks to your generosity, Alhamdulillah, One Ummah **provided critical aid, including hot meals, food packs and shelter** to the most vulnerable communities in the most remote locations in Pakistan.

BANGLADESH FLOODS OF TEARS

ONE UMMAH'S HUMANITARIAN EFFORTS BROUGHT HOPE AND TRANSFORMATION TO 114,015 BENEFICIARIES IN BANGLADESH OVER THE LAST YEAR

Bangladesh has been ravaged by catastrophic floods triggered by heavy monsoon rains. These disastrous floods, which started in early May 2022, have destroyed homes, crops and infrastructure. **Thousands have been displaced and urgently need food, clean water and safe shelter.**

The deteriorating sanitation conditions have heightened the risk of disease outbreaks, while the **floods have disrupted access to schools and hospitals, jeopardising the community's education and healthcare access.**

The devastation has **swept across all 64 districts of Bangladesh**, leaving a trail of destruction. The worst areas are Sylhet and Synamganj, where over **3 million people's lives** have been directly impacted. More than 100,000 homes have been left damaged or destroyed. **Tragically, many have died, and the death toll is expected to rise rapidly.**

The floods have left communities struggling to meet their basic needs. Access to food, water, and healthcare has been severely disrupted. **The deteriorating sanitation conditions have added another layer of hardship to Bangladesh.** Total damages thus far are estimated to exceed £1 billion, highlighting the immense scale of this disaster.

In the face of this overwhelming crisis, **One Ummah swiftly dispatched a UK team to join the humanitarian efforts.** Our teams worked tirelessly to provide needy families with food packs, emergency aid packs, and medical supplies to alleviate the suffering caused by the floods. **One Ummah's team used every transport resource available to reach the most remote locations and deliver your Amanah to areas where no aid had reached, Alhamdulillah.**

The affected communities are in desperate need of humanitarian and medical assistance, and without it, they face an uncertain future.

EAST AFRICA

EVERY 48 SECONDS, AN EAST AFRICAN DIES.

A SILENT TRAGEDY HAS UNFOLDED ON A WIDE SCALE.

We cannot ignore the immense scale of the East African crisis. Countless lives are struggling in the clutches of poverty and despair. Children are being orphaned, and communities are being shattered.

In response to the ongoing tragedy, we have expanded our humanitarian operations in East Africa to bring urgent relief to those in serious need.



The noise of global headlines drowns out the desperate cries for help from the heart of Africa. In this forgotten corner of the world, an unspeakable calamity unfolds.

UGANDA

In Uganda, an **astounding 40% of the population struggles to live on less than £1 per day**, which barely covers necessities. Nearly half the population is under 15, which has placed an immense burden on families to provide for the youth. **Many parents in Uganda are forced to go hungry to ensure their children can eat, highlighting the profound poverty that clouds the nation.**

With the permission of Allah, One Ummah has transformed the **lives of over 80,000 beneficiaries** in Uganda throughout the past year. Our initiatives encompass (but are not limited to) the construction of **20 bore wells** and **13 Masaajid**, the **distribution of 1,000 food packs** and **31,880 hot meals** given to the most destitute communities. In addition, **2,000 Qur'ans** and **600 Zakat grants** were distributed, providing both nourishment for the body and the soul.

These impactful projects have addressed critical needs and instilled hope back into the people of Uganda.

SUDAN

In 2023, a military coup in Sudan led to a conflict that killed hundreds and displaced thousands. The UN has warned millions more could be forced to flee their homes. **Millions in Sudan require food, water, and shelter, while the country's infrastructure has been damaged.**

One Ummah's efforts in Sudan have been a lifeline for many struggling to survive. We distributed over **2,000 food packs** to those who were desperate for food. In addition, we fulfilled your Amanah by providing **Qurbani** to **6,000 vulnerable people**. Alhamdulillah, these food packs and Qurbani donations have provided much-needed nourishment and relief to thousands. **May Allah accept it from you all.**

SOMALIA

Currently, there are **500,000 individuals on the brink of starvation** in Somalia and Ethiopia. The critical levels of food insecurity and malnutrition have placed millions in urgent need of humanitarian aid. **Shockingly, half of those are vulnerable children.**

In response to the threat of starvation, One Ummah has taken immediate action by **distributing emergency food packs to 2,500 beneficiaries** in Somalia during Ramadan, giving each family the ability to open and close their fast throughout this blessed month. Through this initiative, we aim to not only provide them with sustenance but also instil a sense of hope in those who are suffering. **We pray that Allah accepts it from all those involved.**

TANZANIA

More than **3 million children under the age of 5** endure the **devastating effects of chronic malnutrition**, which accounts for one-third of the population. **These vulnerable children live in slums that lack the design for long-term habitation.** Adding to this, food insecurity, water scarcity and lack of education, the people of Tanzania face immense challenges.

One Ummah's efforts on the ground in Tanzania have been focused on addressing the community's immediate needs. By **providing 10,000 Iftar meals**, we ensured people had access to nourishing food during the holy month of Ramadan. May Allah accept their fasts and also add it to the scales of those who donated, Ameen. In addition, our distribution of **over 2,000 food packs** helped provide essential sustenance to those in need.

We also recognise the importance of education, both spiritual and secular; as a result, we have supported our brothers and sisters by constructing **12 Masaajid in strategic locations** and have given **over 450 students school materials**. With the permission of Allah and your donations, it has also given us the ability to provide safe and clean drinking water to thousands, with the construction of **15 bore wells** for the most needy communities in Tanzania.

KENYA

The drought in Kenya was the **deadliest in over 40 years**, resulting in a crisis that demanded our immediate attention. **More than 4 million are in desperate need of humanitarian aid, with one million children suffering from acute malnutrition and requiring urgent treatment.**

Given the desperate situation, One Ummah took decisive action by implementing an emergency water project, successfully constructing **90 bore wells** and granting over **60,000 thirsty beneficiaries access to clean water**, Alhamdulillah. **May Allah accept it from all those involved.**

We were also motivated to help children suffering from malnutrition, and as part of our efforts, your donations supported the **sponsorship of 200 orphans**. Whilst this may be small given the scale of the disaster, it is a priceless hope of a brighter future for these orphans. **May Allah give us the ability to sponsor every child suffering from malnutrition in Kenya and around the world, Ameen.**

OBJECTS, STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

OUR LEGAL OBJECTS

One Ummah is an international humanitarian aid and development organisation.

In its previous incarnation, One Ummah Charity was established in 2013 and registered on 20th December 2013. A constitution governed it as an unincorporated association.

The charity was incorporated into a new Charitable Incorporated Organisation ('the new CIO'). The assets and liabilities belonging to the charity were transferred to the new CIO (effective from 2nd August 2016), and the charity formerly known as "One Ummah Charity" was renamed "One Ummah". The charity ceased to operate on 31st December 2016 and was removed from the Register of Charities ('the Register'). Since its registration, the new CIO has been known as "One Ummah" (1168565).

The Constitution defines One Ummah's objects as being:

- a) To assist in the prevention or relief of poverty worldwide by providing grants, items and services to individuals in need, charities or other organisations working to prevent poverty.
- b) The advancement of the Islamic religion for the benefit of the public in areas of poverty and hardship.
- c) To advance education by providing financial or other assistance for the benefit of the public in areas of poverty and hardship.
- d) To advance health by providing financial or other assistance, including medicines, hospitals, and othe means, in each case, for the public benefit anywhere in the world.

TRUSTEES AND ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE

The Board of Trustees (herein also called "Trustees" or "The Trustees") directs and oversees One Ummah per its statutory obligations and policies. Focusing on strategic planning and governance, the Board also sets priorities and objectives to alleviate poverty and its underlying causes.

The Board of Trustees appraises the performance of the Senior Management Team (SMT) against both strategic and operational objectives through reports, meetings and other interventions as required. The Trustees also approve new policies and procedures.

When new trustees are appointed, they are given a formal induction to the work of One Ummah and provided with the information they need to fulfil their roles, which includes information about the part of trustees and Charity Law. New trustees are nominated by members of the Board of Trustees, interviewed by a panel of three trustees and appointed where they have the necessary skills to contribute to One Ummah management and development.

CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

The Chief Executive Officer (CEO) is responsible for One Ummah's strategic direction, ensuring compliance and acting on behalf of the Trustees. The Senior Management Team (SMT) headed by the CEO is responsible for implementing the strategic and operational plan and the day-to-day management of One Ummah.

RISK MANAGEMENT

As part of the initial activity evaluation and implementation, all major undertakings undergo a risk assessment phase, where potential risks are identified, ranked, evaluated and mitigated.

Significant risks, for this purpose, are those that may have a considerable effect on:

- Operational performance, including risks to our personnel and volunteers
- Financial sustainability, including stability and security of income
- Achievement of our aims and objectives
- Meeting the expectations of our beneficiaries or supporters

The Trustees assess these risks regularly to ensure sufficient risk management procedures and systems are in place. Insurance coverage is obtained when deemed necessary.

The following framework is central to ensuring a valid risk assessment procedure:

- Regular monitoring of significant risks and development of action plans
- Embedding risk identification and assessment within operating procedures
- A clear structure of delegated authority and control
- Review of crucial systems and procedures through internal audit arrangements
- Income and profit targets for trading and fundraising activities
- Maintaining reserves in line with set policies
- Regular summary reports on risk management submitted to the Board of Trustees for review

100% DONATION POLICY

One Ummah operates a 100% donation policy. We highly value the trust of our supporters and assure you that every penny you generously donate is dedicated solely to the cause or project you have chosen to support. We will never allocate project funds towards administrative expenses, marketing efforts, or generating additional funds.

It is important to note that any unavoidable online transaction charges by third-party gateways are deducted before the donation reaches us.

An example of our 100% donation policy is if you give £100 towards school supplies, the entire £100 donation will go towards the school supplies and ensure they are received by the beneficiaries. Our donors can trust that One Ummah exercises complete diligence in how we allocate funds under the donors' specific preferences and intentions.

One Ummah sources funding for administrative expenses from the following channels:

Admin Fund: A specific fund where donations can be made directly towards the administration costs.

Gift Aid: Any gift aid claimed on donations may be used for administration costs.

Textile Recycling: One Ummah maintains clothing banks where textiles are collected and recycled to raise funds.

Sponsors: We acquire sponsorship deals to increase the charity's exposure and generate funds.

REPORTING PUBLIC BENEFIT

The Trustees confirm that they have read the Commission's Guidance on Public Benefit (including PB1, PB2, PB3). One Ummah complies with the public benefit requirement under the Charities Act 2011. Our work only involves activities that advance our charitable goals and benefit the public. This can be seen in the many humanitarian activities highlighted in this report, e.g. emergency aid or education support, which helps people by saving lives, reducing poverty and providing means for educational advancement.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

During the year, the charity raised income of £21.7m (2022: £16.4m) and incurred expenditure £16.7m (2022: £13.9m). The carry forward reserves stand at £10.83m (2022: £5.83m), of which £10.48m (2022: £4.83m) relates to Restricted funds and £355k (2022: £1.0m) relates to Unrestricted general reserves. The reason for the high restricted funds at year-end was due to the high level of donations received (£4.7m) for the Turkiye/Syria earthquake disaster during February/March, which is two months before the charity's year end. Funds were spent in the following financial year. The current level of general reserves stands at £355k (2022: £1.0m). The reason for the significant decrease from last year is due to the fact that the charity has invested substantially in increasing its resource due to considerable growth in donations year on year.

RESERVE POLICY

One Ummah has a policy that sets the level of general reserves to meet our operating expenses in the event of a sudden drop in income or the incurring of unexpected expenditures. We constantly review this policy, assessing risks and reflecting on changes in factors such as income and our financial obligations and commitments. This assessment was carried out in 2021, and the current target level of reserves of six months of the core operational budget was deemed sufficient. These funds are held in contemporary and medium-term cash forms.

TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The Trustees are responsible for preparing an Annual Report and financial statements following applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards, including Financial Reporting Standard 102: The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

The law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give an accurate and fair view of the state of affairs of One Ummah and the incoming resources and their application for that period.

IN PREPARING THESE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS, THE TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES ARE:

- Select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently.
- Observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP.
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and diligent.
- State whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements.
- Prepare the financial statements on an ongoing concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping sufficient accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of One Ummah and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the Charity (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 and the provisions of the trust deed. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of One Ummah and hence, for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

The Trustees are responsible for maintaining the integrity of the corporate and financial information on the One Ummah website. Legislation in the United Kingdom governing the preparation and dissemination of financial statements may differ from legislation in other jurisdictions.

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of One Ummah for the year ended 31 March 2023 which comprise the Statement of Financial Activities, the Balance Sheet, Cash Flow Statement and notes to the financial statements, including significant accounting policies. In preparing the financial statements, the trustees are responsible for assessing the company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the trustees either intend to liquidate the company or to cease operations, or have no realistic alternative but to do so.

Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements



1 Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Turnover

Turnover represents all income to the charity, the majority of which is donations.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Gift aid

Gift aid is recognised in the accounts when it is receivable by the charity.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life:

Motor vehicles	25% p.a on reducing balance
Fixtures and fittings	25% p.a on reducing balance
Plant and equipment	25% p.a on reducing balance

Intangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life:

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

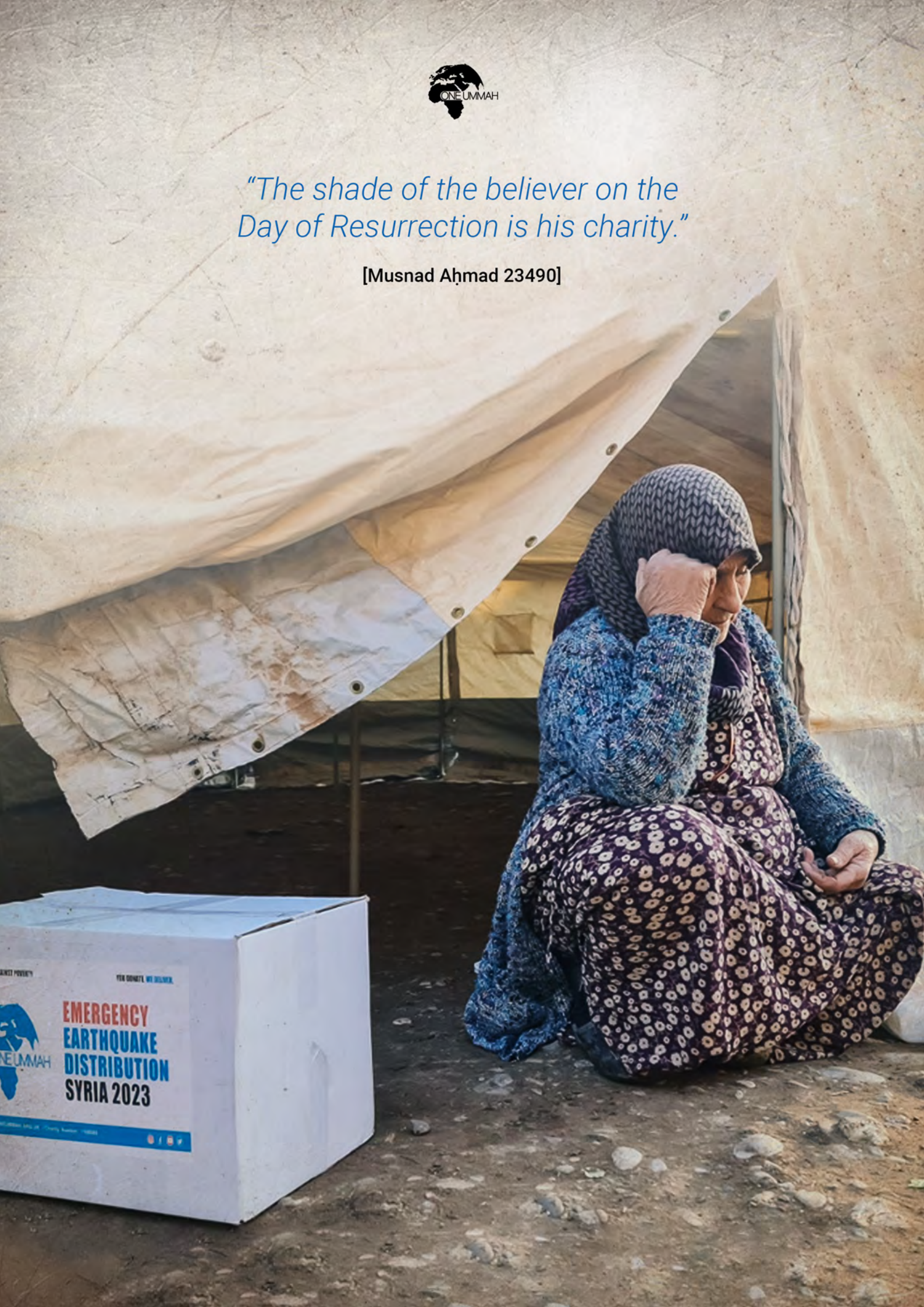
