This past year has been a poignant reminder of the trials confronting our beloved Ummah. The ongoing suffering of our brothers and sisters in Gaza, enduring relentless oppression and hardship, has deeply impacted the hearts of the Muslims. For many years, One Ummah has steadfastly fulfilled our duty, responding to the cries of those in need with the generosity of the Muslim Ummah.

Alhamdulillah, by the will of Allah and your unwavering support through Sadaqah, Zakat, and Dua, we have continued to provide life-saving aid to the Ummah, delivering vital food, medical supplies, and essential relief to families grappling with unimaginable circumstances.

As Allah commands us to care for the needy and the oppressed, we have reached 20 countries around the world, reaching some of the most vulnerable and forgotten members of our Ummah. By the grace of Allah, your support has empowered us to deliver relief to over 1 million beneficiaries, alleviating their burdens and fulfilling the divine command to *“Spend (from) that which you love.”* - [Al Imran, 3:92]

Among the countless blessings bestowed upon us by Allah this past year:

Tens of thousands have gained access to clean water, fulfilling a fundamental need often taken for granted. Winter aid has shielded over 60,000 individuals from the harsh cold, bringing warmth and comfort to those living in dire conditions. Orphans, cherished by Allah's Messenger (peace and blessings be upon him), have been supported with food, education, and care, upholding the rights of over 4,000 children. Over half a million individuals have received sustenance through emergency food aid.

Thousands of families have been provided with Zakat and Sadaqah grants, offering them solace during their most challenging times. With your invaluable support, we have constructed Masajid and supported Imams, communities and new Muslims in strengthening their Emaan, worship and remembrance of Allah.

The year, Allah tested the Ummah with more major emergencies that profoundly impacted Muslims across the globe and One Ummah did its best to respond. The catastrophic Pakistan and Bangladesh floods, where we ventured into remote areas, providing food, shelter, and medical care to families displaced by this calamity. Our teams swiftly responded to the powerful Afghanistan earthquake and provided food and essential aid to those left in ruin. During the blessed months of Ramadan and Dhul Hijjah, we were honoured to serve approximately half a million believers, ensuring that families could break their fast with dignity and partake in the blessings of Eid ul-Fitr and also Eid ul-Adha Alhamdulillah, Allah granted us the opportunity to serve His creation, fulfilling their needs through your trust.

We also remain committed to our top priorities which include, expanding our sustainability programmes, providing long-term solutions, and increasing self-reliance. Ultimately, we aim to increase our impact bi'ithnillah ta'ala.

As I write this piece, over 45,000 people have been killed, homes obliterated, and basic human rights trampled upon in what can only be described as a humanitarian catastrophe.

Entire families have been wiped out, hospitals targeted, and critical infrastructure destroyed, leaving millions on the brink of despair. This genocide is not just a tragedy for Gaza but a stain on humanity as a whole.

These efforts have been a lifeline for many, but we are acutely aware that much more needs to be done. The scale of the devastation in Gaza requires a united and sustained response from the international community, and we at One Ummah are committed to being at the forefront of this effort.

Throughout the year, we have continued to provide life-saving emergency aid to our brothers and sisters over 19 countries. This has been in the shape of food parcels, water well projects and the building of homes.

We have also been responding to other disasters, such as the floods in Afghanistan and the continued work in both Türkiye and Syria following the devastating earthquakes in 2023.

None of this would be possible without the unwavering support of our donors, volunteers, and partners. You are the backbone of One Ummah, and your compassion inspires us to keep pushing forward, even in the darkest of times.

As we move into the next year, let us redouble our efforts to stand with Gaza and all oppressed communities worldwide. Together, we can transform despair into hope and injustice into triumph. May Allah grant us the strength and unity to continue this vital work. Ameen.

# Emergency Appeal

## AN UMMAH IN CRISIS

### AFGHANISTAN

On October 7, 2023, a devastating 6.3 magnitude earthquake struck the Herat Province in western Afghanistan – the first of four earthquakes over 3 weeks. More than 2,000 people were killed, leaving thousands wounded and displaced. The earthquakes became the second-largest disaster displacement event in Afghanistan since 2008 when records began.

The quakes triggered 380,000 internal displacements, destroying at least 10,000 homes. The impact of the disaster added further strain onto an already struggling Afghanistan with more than 29 million people needing humanitarian aid. 40% of the population struggle to meet their basic food needs, with 3 million children under five suffering from malnutrition.

**One Ummah had dedicated teams on the ground responding swiftly to the disaster, providing critical emergency aid to those in desperate need.** With your generous support, we were able to reach over 39,100 people in Afghanistan. This included the sponsorship of 300 orphans, ensuring they had the support and care they needed to thrive. We delivered 1,000 hot meals to those who were hungry, offering immediate relief to families and individuals facing food insecurity. Additionally, we distributed 2,000 food packs, providing essential ongoing sustenance to those in crisis.

Beyond their immediate needs, we also focused on long-term recovery by building 300 homes which offered safe and secure shelter to many who had lost everything. **Your kindness and contributions have been the cornerstone of our efforts, bringing hope and relief to tens of thousands in Afghanistan.**

### BANGLADESH

In August 2023, relentless monsoon rains wreaked havoc in Bangladesh, triggering floods and landslides. 1.3 million individuals were impacted, killing at least 51 people. 630,000 of those affected were women, and 480,000 were children. The ruthless waters forced more than half a million people from their homes, seeking shelter in overcrowded evacuation centres.

The floodwaters also submerged rural roads and agricultural fields, isolating communities and cutting off access to essential services. Vital water sources and sanitation facilities were damaged, leaving vulnerable populations without clean water and proper sanitation. Many health centres and clinics were inoperable, denying critical care to those in desperate need. Families were uprooted from their homes and left to fend for themselves in the face of adversity. The devastation stripped them of their livelihoods and dignity, leaving thousands injured and traumatised.

**One Ummah travelled to the affected areas, navigating treacherous waters to deliver life-saving aid.** With your support, we were able to provide essential supplies, including food, water and shelter.

### BURMA

On May 14, 2023, Cyclone Mocha, a powerful storm, ravaged Myanmar, causing widespread devastation, particularly in the Rakhine and Chin States. The cyclone tore through Muslim communities in IDP camps and host areas, leaving countless homes in ruins and displacing thousands of people. Our hearts and efforts went out to those affected, focusing on providing emergency relief in their time of dire need.

By the grace of Allah, One Ummah responded swiftly and with great impact as we distributed 1,000 food packs. Additionally, we provided 20 Qurbani cows, offering fresh meat to 1,000 families. We also delivered 500 Eid gift packages, including clothing, to enable families to celebrate Eid with joy and dignity. Through these efforts, we demonstrated our unwavering commitment to serving and supporting our brothers and sisters in need, embodying the spirit of unity and compassion. **May Allah continue to bless our endeavors and provide relief to those who are suffering.**

### GAZA

Since October 7th, Palestine has endured unimaginable suffering. As of the time of this report, over 44,000 Palestinians have been martyred - at least 17,000 were innocent children. More than 105,000 have been injured and are in desperate need of emergency medical assistance. Sadly, over 10,000 more are missing, likely buried beneath the rubble.

Over 50% of homes have been destroyed, 80% of commercial facilities have been obliterated, and 87% of school buildings have been damaged. Healthcare facilities are struggling to function, with only 17 out of 36 hospitals left barely functional. Additionally, 68% of road networks have been rendered unusable, and 68% of cropland has been ruined.

Between October 7th, 2023 and March 31st, 2024, we made a great impact with our response efforts in Gaza. We brought warmth to families by distributing 8,440 blankets and ensured food security for 255,995 people with 66,730 food packs. Essential sanitation needs were met with 5,500 hygiene packs. Our medical aid included 14 pallets of medicines and 2 trucks of supplies, reaching clinics and hospitals. To combat the cold, we provided 4,000 children's winter jackets, 3,000 jumpers, and 3,200 adult winter clothing items.

Families with infants received 1,450 baby kits containing milk and nappies. We also filled 5,000 gas cylinders to help families cook meals and heat their homes, and prepared 30,000 hot meals for the community. Finally, we addressed urgent water, sanitation and hygiene needs by filling 150 water tanks with clean water. **May Allah continue to bless our efforts and ease the suffering of our brothers and sisters in Gaza.**



## MOROCCO

On September 8, 2023, a powerful 6.8 magnitude earthquake struck near the town of Oukaïmeden in the High Atlas Mountains of Morocco. The devastating tremors, followed by a 4.9 magnitude aftershock, unleashed a catastrophe that claimed countless lives, reducing thousands of homes to rubble. The damage caused by this disaster will be felt for years to come.

The earthquake displaced over 600,000 people, leaving 380,000 without a roof over their heads. Over 2,900 were killed with thousands more injured. The disaster also had a devastating impact on education, with over 500 schools damaged or destroyed, affecting 100,000 innocent children. Additionally, nearly 60,000 homes were damaged or destroyed. As the survivors struggle to rebuild their lives, they're faced with numerous challenges, including overcrowding, poor sanitation, and the threat of disease.

One Ummah made significant strides in our on the ground response efforts, supporting over 30,000 individuals affected by the earthquake. Our assistance included the distribution of 5,000 food packs, 5,800 hygiene packs, 12,000 pillows, 12,000 blankets, 12,400 mattresses, 5,700 floor mats, and 400 bedding kits. These life-saving provisions, guided by our faith and unity, have brought hope and relief to those most in need. May Allah continue to bless our efforts and strengthen our resolve in the face of adversity.

## SUDAN

The conflict in Sudan has escalated into one of the most severe humanitarian crises globally, with 25 million people desperately needing humanitarian assistance, including over 14 million children. In April 2023, intense fighting between the Sudanese Armed Forces (SAF) and the paramilitary Rapid Support Forces (RSF) broke out. The violence forced 8.6 million people to flee their homes and seek refuge in neighbouring countries.

The conflict has crippled healthcare services, with many hospitals out of service and ongoing attacks on health facilities. This has left millions without vital medical care. The country is also grappling with a severe food crisis, with 17.7 million people facing hunger and 4.9 million people on the brink of famine.

Alhamdulillah, One Ummah delivered over 8,000 food packs, reaching approximately 25,000 beneficiaries during the crisis. This includes our special distribution during Ramadan, helping families observe the holy month with dignity. We also extended our support to displaced Sudanese in Uganda, particularly in the Kiryandongo Refugee Settlement & Host Community, providing essential assistance to thousands of families. Through these efforts, we have ensured that those affected by the conflict receive the necessary sustenance to endure these challenging times.

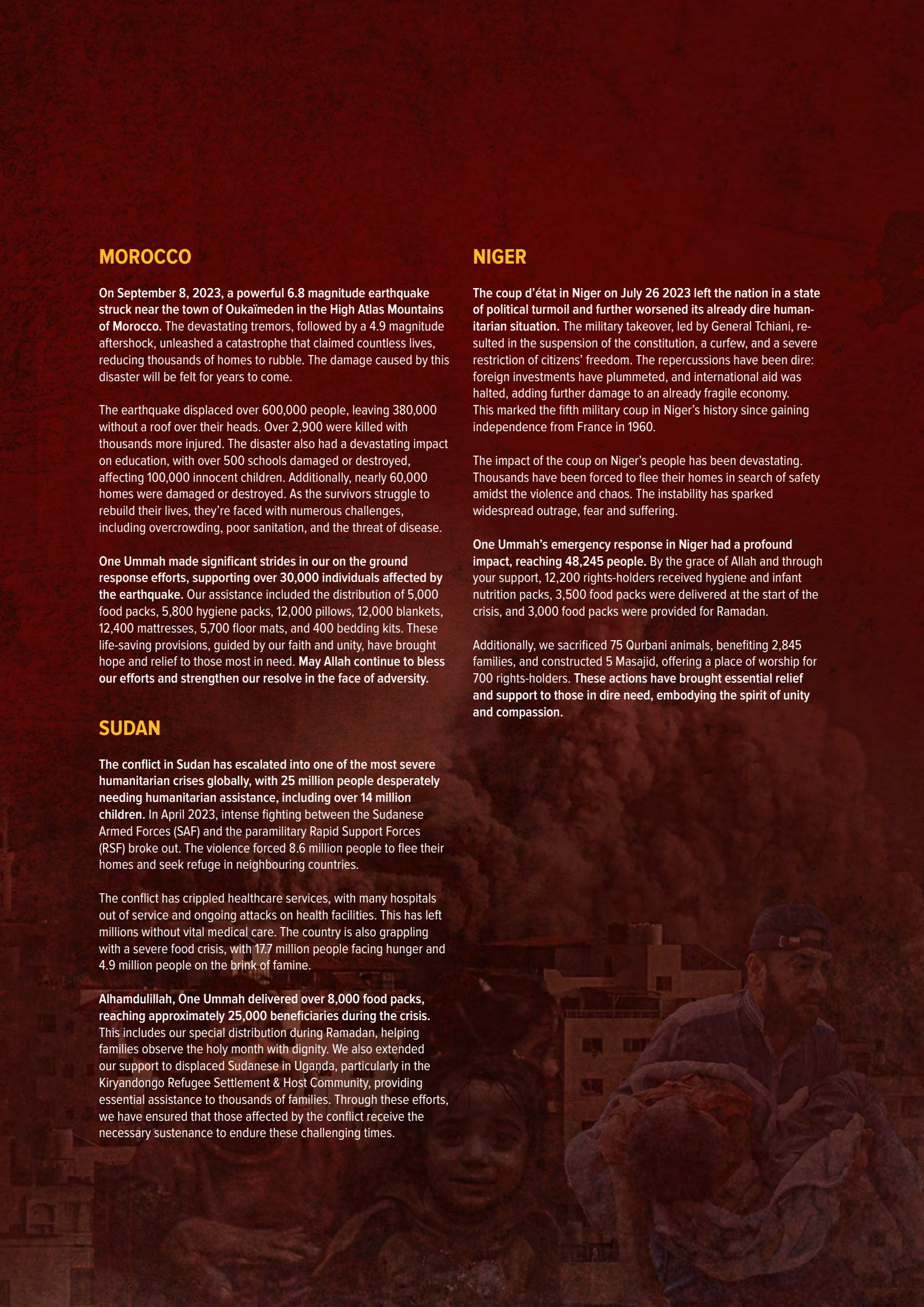
## NIGER

The coup d'état in Niger on July 26 2023 left the nation in a state of political turmoil and further worsened its already dire humanitarian situation. The military takeover, led by General Tchiani, resulted in the suspension of the constitution, a curfew, and a severe restriction of citizens' freedom. The repercussions have been dire: foreign investments have plummeted, and international aid was halted, adding further damage to an already fragile economy. This marked the fifth military coup in Niger's history since gaining independence from France in 1960.


The impact of the coup on Niger's people has been devastating. Thousands have been forced to flee their homes in search of safety amidst the violence and chaos. The instability has sparked widespread outrage, fear and suffering.

One Ummah's emergency response in Niger had a profound impact, reaching 48,245 people. By the grace of Allah and through your support, 12,200 rights-holders received hygiene and infant nutrition packs, 3,500 food packs were delivered at the start of the crisis, and 3,000 food packs were provided for Ramadan.

Additionally, we sacrificed 75 Qurbani animals, benefiting 2,845 families, and constructed 5 Masajid, offering a place of worship for 700 rights-holders. These actions have brought essential relief and support to those in dire need, embodying the spirit of unity and compassion.

# Syria

## THIRTEEN YEARS OF TURMOIL

YOUR GENEROSITY EMPOWERED 433,610  
VULNERABLE INDIVIDUALS IN WAR-TORN SYRIA

Scarred by thirteen years of conflict, Syria is facing its most dire humanitarian crisis yet. The endless cycle of violence, and suffering has pushed Syria to the brink as 7.2 million were forced to flee their homes.

13 million people— over half the country's population— are grappling with severe food insecurity. The harsh reality of 13 years of conflict has taken its toll, particularly on the most vulnerable: the children, who continue to pay the heaviest price. Nearly 8 million innocent children in Syria urgently require humanitarian assistance in 2024. The country is also still reeling from the aftermath of the catastrophic earthquakes in February of 2023.

A shocking 90% of Syrian families are trapped in the grip of poverty. The situation has escalated due to an influx of more than 200,000 displaced people crossing from Lebanon to Syria, 60% of which were children. The already fragile healthcare system has been pushed to collapse. The lack of access to safe water, proper sanitation and food insecurity has resulted in more disease and malnutrition, particularly among children.

One Ummah was founded during the early years of the Syrian war, with initial donations dedicated to assisting the Syrian people in their time of need. Despite the significant strides and recent liberation of the Syrian people, much remains to be done to rebuild Syria's infrastructure and ensure a stable and prosperous future. The journey ahead requires continued support and dedication to help the nation recover and thrive.

Through your support, One Ummah built 337 homes and distributed 30,825 food packs and 223,000 hot meals, ensuring families received essential nutrition and shelter. With 2,400 water tank refills, we provided clean water, and 4,500 winter packs, along with 3,000 children's winter packs, offered warmth during harsh winters. Additionally, your support facilitated 1,250 Qurbani, allowing families to celebrate Eid al-Adha with joy. We've also constructed 24 Masajid, providing safe places for worship and boosting the Emaan of communities.

# Palestine

## AN OPEN-AIR PRISON

ONE UMMAH STOOD WITH 525,769 PALESTINIANS,  
PROVIDING CRITICAL HUMANITARIAN AID

Every hour in Gaza, 15 people are killed, 6 of them children, 35 people are injured, and 12 buildings are destroyed. More than 125 journalists have been killed so far. The Gaza Strip has a population of around 2.1 million people living in one of the most densely populated areas in the world. More than 85% of Palestinians in Gaza, around 1.9 million people, have been displaced since October 7th. They have been put through torment, torture and constant attacks. More than 44,000 Palestinians have been killed, and thousands more critically ill, injured or buried beneath the rubble.

Over 17,000 of those deaths were innocent children. Over 100,000 more have been injured, and more than 10,000 are still presumed missing. More than half of Gaza's homes have been damaged or destroyed. 80% of commercial facilities have been damaged, as well as 87% of schools and 68% of road networks and cropland.

Residents are being ushered into 'safe zones', and then those safe zones have been targeted for aerial assaults, one after another. Gazans have no reliable way to access evacuation information due to no electricity or internet access since the blockade of the strip resulted in a collapse of telecommunications infrastructure.

One Ummah has been on the ground, answering the urgent plea of our Palestinian Ummah. Thanks to your generous donations, we have tirelessly delivered critical aid to those who needed it most. We have provided life-saving assistance to 181,580 people in Gaza.

We nourished the bodies of countless individuals and families with 72,343 hot meals, as well as 66,730 food packs. We replenished 150 water tanks, providing life-saving clean water in the most dire of conditions. 1,450 baby packs were handed out containing essentials such as milk, clothing and nappies to keep infants healthy and cared for. 6,500 hygiene kits offered much-needed supplies to maintain cleanliness and safety from illnesses.

As the nights grew colder, we gave 1,450 blankets to provide warmth and comfort to those without even basic shelter. Moreover, two trucks and fourteen pallets of various medicine were delivered to the Ministry of Health, ensuring hospitals could treat the sick and injured to the best of their ability. **To our valued donors:** You have been a lifeline in times of greatest need and a source of hope when all seemed lost. Thank you for your generosity and support.

# Yemen

## OVER A DECADE OF DESTRUCTION

YOUR DONATIONS PROVIDED A  
LIFELINE FOR 158,803 YEMENIS

After more than a decade of turmoil, Yemen is on the brink of total collapse, leaving countless families vulnerable to the aftermath. Over 21 million souls – more than half the country's population – fight for survival. More than 4.5 million have been forced from their homes since 2015. In 2024, an estimated 2.7 million pregnant and breastfeeding women, and five million children under five desperately need treatment for acute malnutrition. Every two hours, a woman dies during pregnancy, childbirth and the aftermath.

A nation once blessed, is now one of the world's most devastating humanitarian crises. Millions of children lack access to safe water, sanitation and hygiene services, and Yemen suffers heavily from cholera, measles, diphtheria and other deadly diseases. Around ten million Yemeni children urgently require humanitarian assistance. Thousands of children have been killed or injured since the beginning of the conflict, and thousands more have been recruited into the fighting.

Over two million innocent children are trapped in the clutches of life-threatening malnutrition. Without urgent intervention, they are likely to lose their lives. The destruction and closure of schools and hospitals have denied more than five million children education and vital health services.

**One Ummah provided essential relief** by distributing 9,800 food packs, ensuring sustenance for families. Your support also provided 8,000 units of baby milk and 16,000 servings of baby cereal, crucial for infants and toddlers. Hygiene was prioritised with 2,600 hygiene packs to prevent disease.

We delivered 911 zakat grants and cash aid, offering immediate financial relief. With 5 bakeries, we provided comfort and nourishment. Additionally, 164 Qurbani were facilitated, allowing families to celebrate Eid with the luxury of meat.

Supporting orphans in Yemen remained a priority, as we provided 300 children with care and access to education. In addition, clean water was made more accessible thanks to the installation of five solar panel wells.

# Pakistan

## A MOUNTAIN TO CLIMB

WE DELIVERED LIFE-SAVING AID  
TO 88,569 NEEDY BENEFICIARIES

In 2022, floods put one-third of Pakistan under water, affecting 33 million people – half were children. Over 7 million were displaced and forced to rely on dirty, contaminated water sources. Having barely recovered from the recent devastation, the country was once again victim to relentless flooding. The widespread destruction resulted in over 200 people dead, thousands of homes damaged and destroyed, and millions displaced. The floods significantly impacted agriculture and the economy, leading to food shortages and a significant loss of crops. Roads, bridges, and other essential infrastructure were severely damaged, halting relief efforts and disrupting supply chains.

The situation remains critical, with many areas still at high risk. The floods highlight Pakistan's ongoing humanitarian struggles, and the dire need for humanitarian aid. With poverty, inflation and unemployment soaring, Pakistan faces one of the worst economic crises in its history, jeopardising millions of people's rights to health, food, and an adequate standard of living.

One Ummah was a beacon of hope for Pakistan during their desperate times of need. Your donations allowed us to install 150 hand pumps, providing clean water for more than 900 people struggling in the aftermath. We delivered 4,000 food packs and 7,170 beneficiaries received roti, providing vital nourishment for months.

With the arrival of deadly winter conditions, 500 winter packs brought warmth and comfort to those left without adequate shelter. Your generosity also made it possible for us to provide 280 zakat grants and cash aid, helping many regain stability and meet their urgent needs. We built 300 homes, offering safe and secure shelter to families who had lost everything, as well as 20 Masajid and one Madrassa. Additionally, we facilitated 185 Qurbani, allowing 1,350 families to partake in Eid al-Adha with dignity and joy. Your contributions have profoundly impacted the lives of countless individuals in Pakistan, and not only met immediate needs but also provided long-term solutions for rebuilding lives.

# Bangladesh

## SUBMERGED IN CRISIS

OUR HUMANITARIAN EFFORTS BROUGHT  
HOPE TO 16,663 BENEFICIARIES

Bangladesh has endured a series of catastrophic floods triggered by heavy monsoon rains, destroying livelihoods, crops and infrastructure, including homes, roads and agricultural lands. Millions were displaced and urgently needed food, clean water and safe shelter. The flooding in Bangladesh has continued on multiple occasions, and the risk of waterborne disease outbreaks increased as water and sanitation facilities across 11 districts have been submerged or affected. In the hardest-hit districts, nearly all shelters were submerged, with 48% destroyed. All sanitation facilities were entirely damaged, significantly increasing the risk of waterborne diseases.

Floods have washed away agricultural and industrial chemicals, as well as people's waste, which has contaminated the water, putting millions at risk of death. The floods are some of the worst in recent history, affecting millions. With sanitation facilities, infrastructures, homes, and agricultural lands extensively damaged, communities needed immediate and sustained support. Over 70 lives were claimed, and severe civil unrest has worsened the humanitarian crisis.

One Ummah responded at the forefront, providing essential relief thanks to your generous support. We handed out 3,750 food packs, offering sustenance during their darkest days. As temperatures plummeted, the warmth provided by 575 winter packs and blankets was a comfort beyond measure.

We also distributed 1,495 zakat grants and cash aid, helping individuals regain a sense of stability and dignity. Access to clean water was a major priority, with 350 hand pumps and five irrigation pumps built. By providing 850 sewing machines and organising 240 skills training workshops, you empowered communities, giving them the tools to rebuild their lives. 300 orphans were given a glimmer of hope and security to support them in reclaiming their livelihoods.

During Ramadan, 1,300 meals and 2,000 food packs brought joy and sustenance to many, and for Eid al-Adha, 50 Qurbani allowed 1,153 families to celebrate with dignity and happiness. Your kindness was a beacon of hope for countless individuals. May Allah reward you abundantly for your compassion and dedication.

# Africa

## The Forgotten Continent

**OVER 429 MILLION AFRICANS LIVE IN EXTREME POVERTY...  
APPROXIMATELY 5% OF EARTH'S POPULATION**

### UGANDA

In Uganda, our brothers and sisters face immense hardship every day. Over 41% of the population lives in poverty, struggling to meet their basic needs. As a result, countless families go to bed starving, with no certainty of their next meal. This heartbreaking reality calls for urgent action.

Millions of Ugandan children are denied the fundamental right to education, with only 40% of children aged 3-5 able to attend school. This deprivation robs them of their potential and perpetuates a cycle of poverty. The nation's healthcare system is overburdened, which has led to a tragically low life expectancy of just 63 years. Countless lives continue to be cut short by preventable diseases.

High fertility rates further strain resources, pushing families deeper into poverty. Nearly half of all households face the daily struggle of food insecurity, as soaring prices put essential sustenance out of reach.

With your support, we were able to impact 140,413 lives in Uganda. We reached out to rural districts and provided aid to 10,450 beneficiaries. 54,600 community meals were distributed, and we fed 43,150 people during Ramadan. In addition, we supported 400 orphans, and 51 teachers, empowering them to build brighter futures for their communities. We have also constructed 10 Masajid and borewells, providing essential spiritual and physical infrastructure. Furthermore, we conducted 206 skills training workshops, giving individuals the tools to care for themselves and their families.

### KENYA

Over 8.9 million Kenyans live in extreme poverty. About 15% of the entire population lacks sufficient food for consumption. To make matters worse, a quarter of Kenyan children under five suffer from chronic malnutrition, with 4% of children affected by acute malnutrition.

Approximately 36% of Kenyans live below the poverty line. Millions of people struggle to afford even one meal a day, which leads to malnutrition and adverse health conditions. A lack of access to clean water and proper sanitation facilities further intensifies the spread of diseases, resulting in a higher mortality rate. The cost of education has almost quadrupled, leaving many families unable to afford to send their children to school.

Your compassion and kindness meant we impacted 32,938 lives. 6,000 people benefitted from your Qurbani, and 4,400 additional food packs were distributed. We also gave hope to 500 orphans, distributed 1,600 Zakat grants to needy beneficiaries, and built 5 Masajid and 50 borewells, improving the infrastructures of the communities.

### SOMALIA

Time is running out for Somalia. A deadly combination of conflict, floods, disease outbreaks and drought has pushed millions to the brink of starvation and despair. A staggering 6.9 million Somalis, including 3.5 million women and girls, are in dire need of humanitarian assistance. The crisis has left 4.3 million people suffering from food insecurity, while 6.6 million people lack access to safe water.

The worst drought in 4 decades, followed by disastrous floods, has claimed the lives of over 43,000, half being children under five. The crisis has severely impacted the younger generation, with 1.7 million children suffering from acute malnutrition. A quarter of these children are critically malnourished and face lifelong consequences.

Thanks to your donations, 65,110 Somalis received life-saving aid. We were able to provide 5,000 essential food packs, ensuring the sustenance of 25,000 people. During the holy month of Ramadan, we shared 3,000 food packs, bringing joy and sustenance to those in need. Your support also enabled us to distribute 120 animals for Qurbani, sharing the blessings of Eid with the community. Additionally, we constructed 20 borewells, providing clean water for over 16,000 people and improving their health and well-being.





## TANZANIA

More than 3 million children under the age of 5 endure the devastating effects of chronic malnutrition, which accounts for one-third of the population. These vulnerable children live in slums that lack the design for long-term habitation. Adding to this, food insecurity, water scarcity and lack of education, the people of Tanzania face immense challenges.

One Ummah's efforts on the ground in Tanzania have been focused on addressing the community's immediate needs. By providing 3,000 Ramadan Food Packs, we ensured people had access to nourishing food during the holy month of Ramadan. May Allah accept their fasts and also add it to the scales of those who donated, Ameen. In addition, our distribution of over 53,488 community meals helped provide essential sustenance to those in need.

We also recognise the importance of education, both spiritual and secular; as a result, we have supported our brothers and sisters by constructing 6 Masajid in strategic locations and provided sponsorship to 50 teachers, empowering them to continue their invaluable work. With the permission of Allah and your donations, it has also given us the ability to provide safe and clean drinking water to thousands, with the construction of 10 bore wells for the most needy communities in Tanzania.

## MALAWI

Malawi, a country burdened by poverty, faces a bleak future. They have one of the highest percentages of people living in extreme poverty worldwide – more than two-thirds of the country. In addition to this, they have one of the youngest populations, with 43% under the age of 15. Over 1.5 million children are denied the opportunity for schooling, ruining their chances at a brighter future.

Malawi was further devastated by the impact of El Niño (a climate phenomenon characterised by the periodic warming of surface waters in the central and eastern Pacific Ocean, significantly affecting global weather patterns). The severe drought and subsequent floods led to the displacement of thousands, triggering disease outbreaks, and led to widespread food and water shortages. With agriculture as the backbone of its economy– 72% of the workforce– the destruction of crops left millions facing hunger. As a result, approximately 6 million people now rely on humanitarian assistance to survive.

Your compassionate support has made a profound difference in the lives of 68,992 individuals in Malawi. We have provided vital nourishment to more than 50,000 people, combatting hunger. Additionally, we handed out 1,000 Zakat grants and supported 539 orphans and teachers, encouraging them to build brighter futures for their communities.

We constructed 10 Masajid, providing a safe space to worship Allah. To address the pressing need for sustainable agriculture, we installed two solar irrigation pumps, ensuring a reliable water supply for farmers. We also established a mobile medical clinic for 12 months, bringing healthcare to remote and underserved communities.

A shocking 2.4 billion people globally face moderate or severe food insecurity. Over 870 million people suffer from the agony of severe hunger as their stomachs ache with emptiness. Hunger is becoming a silent killer, especially in places like Africa where 60% of the entire population faces hunger. The levels of undernourishment are comparable to those in 2008/2009 – setting progress back by 15 years.

Half of all child deaths are linked to malnutrition. Every year, hunger-related causes kill over 9 million people, many are children under 5. No human should be denied their fundamental human right of safe access to food. Unfortunately, this right is denied to hundreds of millions in poverty-stricken nations. They are left without food and water, not knowing where their next meal will come from, or if they'll even get one.

However, One Ummah is steadfast in our commitment to ending world hunger. We are dedicated to alleviating the suffering of those in need and providing nourishment and hope to those who have lost their way. Together, we fed over a million people worldwide, including 282,931 meals, as well as 502,103 receiving emergency food packs. We also fed over 300,000 people during Ramadan. Other general food items were distributed accordingly to meet the specific needs of beneficiaries on the ground.

By the will of Allah and your kindness, One Ummah was able to support over 4,000 orphans in 10 calamity-stricken countries, providing hope, sustenance, and an opportunity to rebuild their lives.

Your support provides food, clean water, clothes, educational resources, mattresses and medical aid to ensure they have the best chance at a brighter future.

Our hearts break for the hundreds of millions of orphans who suffer due to conflict, disaster, poverty and disease. The Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) said, *"The believer's shade on the Day of Resurrection will be his charity."* – [Tirmidhi].

Your donations have provided much-needed shade, bringing life-saving warmth to those in desperate need.

In regions where the cold bites hardest, the need is greatest. Over 150 million people face homelessness during the winter period as the cold kills five million per year. Millions of displaced families lack access to basic necessities such as warm clothing, blankets, and heating.

Winter doesn't just bring the cold; it brings fear, anxiety and calamity. Families huddle in makeshift tents, able to see their breath with each shiver. Mothers hold their babies close, desperately shaking with what little warmth they have left. Children who should be playing are curled up on the frozen ground, dreaming of warmth. Their enemy is the cold, but the Ummah is their warmth.

Because of your support, we were able to support over 60,000 people last winter. 7,000 children's clothing items were distributed, as well as thousands more for adults. In addition to this, we handed out more than 8,000 blankets, and distributed more than 10,000 winter packs with essentials for surviving the biting cold. We have worked tirelessly to ensure your donations reach those who need them most. Thank you for keeping the Ummah warm during the cold winter months.

# OBJECTS, STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

## OUR LEGAL OBJECTS

One Ummah is an international humanitarian aid and development organisation.

In its previous incarnation, One Ummah Charity was established in 2013 and registered on 20th December 2013. A constitution governed it as an unincorporated association.

The charity was incorporated into a new Charitable Incorporated Organisation ('the new CIO'). The assets and liabilities belonging to the charity were transferred to the new CIO (effective from 2nd August 2016), and the charity formerly known as "One Ummah Charity" was renamed "One Ummah". The charity ceased to operate on 31st December 2016 and was removed from the Register of Charities ('the Register'). Since its registration, the new CIO has been known as "One Ummah" (1168565).

The Constitution defines One Ummah's objects as being:

- a) To assist in the prevention or relief of poverty worldwide by providing grants, items and services to individuals in need, charities or other organisations working to prevent poverty.
- b) The advancement of the Islamic religion for the benefit of the public in areas of poverty and hardship.
- c) To advance education by providing financial or other assistance for the benefit of the public in areas of poverty and hardship.
- d) To advance health by providing financial or other assistance, including medicines, hospitals, and other means, in each case, for the public benefit anywhere in the world.

## TRUSTEES AND ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE

The Board of Trustees (herein also called "Trustees" or "The Trustees") directs and oversees One Ummah per its statutory obligations and policies. Focusing on strategic planning and governance, the Board also sets priorities and objectives to alleviate poverty and its underlying causes.

The Board of Trustees appraises the performance of the Senior Management Team (SMT) against both strategic and operational objectives through reports, meetings and other interventions as required. The Trustees also approve new policies and procedures.

When new trustees are appointed, they are given a formal induction to the work of One Ummah and provided with the information they need to fulfil their roles, which includes information about the part of trustees and Charity Law. New trustees are nominated by members of the Board of Trustees, interviewed by a panel of three trustees and appointed where they have the necessary skills to contribute to One Ummah management and development.

## CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

The Chief Executive Officer (CEO) is responsible for One Ummah's strategic direction, ensuring compliance and acting on behalf of the Trustees. The Senior Management Team (SMT) headed by the CEO is responsible for implementing the strategic and operational plan and the day-to-day management of One Ummah.

## RISK MANAGEMENT

As part of the initial activity evaluation and implementation, all major undertakings undergo a risk assessment phase, where potential risks are identified, ranked, evaluated and mitigated.

Significant risks, for this purpose, are those that may have a considerable effect on:

- Operational performance, including risks to our personnel and volunteers
- Financial sustainability, including stability and security of income
- Achievement of our aims and objectives
- Meeting the expectations of our beneficiaries or supporters

The Trustees assess these risks regularly to ensure sufficient risk management procedures and systems are in place. Insurance coverage is obtained when deemed necessary.

The following framework is central to ensuring a valid risk assessment procedure:

- Regular monitoring of significant risks and development of action plans
- Embedding risk identification and assessment within operating procedures
- A clear structure of delegated authority and control
- Review of crucial systems and procedures through internal audit arrangements
- Income and profit targets for trading and fundraising activities
- Maintaining reserves in line with set policies
- Regular summary reports on risk management submitted to the Board of Trustees for review

## 100% DONATION POLICY

One Ummah operates a 100% donation policy. We highly value the trust of our supporters and assure you that every penny you generously donate is dedicated solely to the cause or project you have chosen to support. We will never allocate project funds towards administrative expenses, marketing efforts, or generating additional funds.

It is important to note that any unavoidable online transaction charges by third-party gateways are deducted before the donation reaches us.

An example of our 100% donation policy is if you give £100 towards school supplies, the entire £100 donation will go towards the school supplies and ensure they are received by the beneficiaries. Our donors can trust that One Ummah exercises complete diligence in how we allocate funds under the donors' specific preferences and intentions.

One Ummah sources funding for administrative expenses from the following channels:

**Admin Fund:** A specific fund where donations can be made directly towards the administration costs.

**Gift Aid:** Any gift aid claimed on donations may be used for administration costs.

**Textile Recycling:** One Ummah maintains clothing banks where textiles are collected and recycled to raise funds.

**Sponsors:** We acquire sponsorship deals to increase the charity's exposure and generate funds.



## REPORTING PUBLIC BENEFIT

The Trustees confirm that they have read the Commission's Guidance on Public Benefit (including PB1, PB2, PB3). One Ummah complies with the public benefit requirement under the Charities Act 2011. Our work only involves activities that advance our charitable goals and benefit the public. This can be seen in the many humanitarian activities highlighted in this report, e.g. emergency aid or education support, which helps people by saving lives, reducing poverty and providing means for educational advancement.

## FINANCIAL REVIEW

During the year, the charity raised income of £30.2m (2023: £21.7m) and incurred expenditure £27.2m (2023: £16.7m). The carry forward reserves stand at £13.8m (2023: £10.8m), of which £13.2 (2023: £10.48m) relates to Restricted funds and £668k (2023: £355k) relates to Unrestricted general reserves. The reason for the high restricted funds at year-end was due to the high level of donations received (£8.8m) for the Gaza emergency which began in October 2023, and for which we received a large number of donations for a continuous period of time. We spent funds (£3.5m) during the year leaving a reserve in the fund (£5.5m). The remainder of the funds were spent in the following financial year.

## RESERVE POLICY

One Ummah has a policy that sets the level of general reserves to meet our operating expenses in the event of a sudden drop in income or the incurring of unexpected expenditures. We constantly review this policy, assessing risks and reflecting on changes in factors such as income and our financial obligations and commitments. This assessment was carried out in 2023, and the current target level of reserves of six months of the core operational budget was deemed sufficient. These funds are held in contemporary and medium-term cash forms.

## TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The Trustees are responsible for preparing an Annual Report and financial statements following applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards, including Financial Reporting Standard 102: The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

The law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give an accurate and fair view of the state of affairs of One Ummah and the incoming resources and their application for that period.

## IN PREPARING THESE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS, THE TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES ARE:

- Select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently.
- Observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP.
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and diligent.
- State whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements.
- Prepare the financial statements on an ongoing concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping sufficient accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of One Ummah and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the Charity (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 and the provisions of the trust deed. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of One Ummah and hence, for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

The Trustees are responsible for maintaining the integrity of the corporate and financial information on the One Ummah website. Legislation in the United Kingdom governing the preparation and dissemination of financial statements may differ from legislation in other jurisdictions.

The Trustees declare that they have read, understand and approved the report.



**1 Accounting policies**

**Basis of accounting**

The financial statements of the charitable organisation, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at cost or transaction values unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy note

The financial statements are prepared in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity.

Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £1.

**Going Concern**

The trustees have a reasonable expectation that the charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future at the time of approving the financial statements. Thus the trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

**Turnover**

Turnover represents all income to the charity, the majority of which is donations.

**Income**

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

**Gift aid**

Gift aid is recognised in the accounts when it is received in the year with a debtor provision for any amounts received within one month of the year end.

**Expenditure**

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

**Tangible fixed assets**

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life:

Fixtures and fittings	25% p.a on reducing balance
Plant and equipment	25% p.a on reducing balance

**1 Accounting policies - continued**

**Creditors**

Creditors are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors are normally recognised at their settlement amount after allowing for any trade discounts.

**Taxation**

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Value added tax is not recoverable by the charity and as such is included in the relevant costs in the statement of financial activities.

**Critical accounting estimates and judgement**

Estimates and judgements are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances. The charity makes estimates and assumptions concerning the future.

The resulting accounting estimates and assumptions will, by definition, seldom equal the related actual results.

**Fund accounting**

Unrestricted general funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can be only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included on page 10

**Prior Year Adjustment**

The 2023 accounts were restated to re-classify the administration fund income and related costs as restricted. The Trustees consider this a more appropriate classification.

There were no changes to the overall fund balances.


