Many have been reconciled to their families and others have been provided with a safe environment at the Umoja Boys Rescue Centre, whilst receiving education, healthcare, food, clothing, love and care. A major milestone was achieved in the charity's long-term objective of providing a permanent home for the children in our care. The charity purchased land in Kenya and continued the construction of a purpose-built children's home. This project will provide long-term security and stability for the children and reduce the charity's reliance on rented accommodation. The land was purchased in the previous financial year and the acquisition cost was correctly recorded in the Receipts and Payments Account for that year. The land was inadvertently omitted from the Statement of Assets and Liabilities and has now been included at cost together with expenditure incurred on construction to date.
