OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objectives of the British Boer Goat Society (hereafter referred to as BBGS) are as follows:-

The promotion of agriculture for the public benefit by the encouragement, promotion and improvement of the British Boer Goat, and encouraging the breeding of British Boer Goats.

To support breeders and prioritise breed promotion through education, outreach and the development of best practice in management, welfare and marketing.

To support members by providing resources and opportunities to improve breeding standards in order to protect the Breed Standard and safeguard the interests of Society members.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

BBGS took part in three major events in 2024, namely the The Royal Three Counties Show, Staffordshire Agricultural Show and Hanbury and District Countryside Show. All shows drew strong public interest and high exhibitor turnout, offering excellent visibility for the breed.

A leading international judge, from South Africa, judged the National Breed Competition at Royal Three Counties Show and provided insightful and educational talks to both members and the public.

Members were offered a reduction in entrance fees to the above shows too as part of the educational programme. This benefit will be extended into the 2025 show season.

The Society has continued to expand its digital engagement, with regular updates to the BBGS website, including show results and photo galleries. Public and members only Facebook pages are active. Competition results and photos are posted in real time.

A new set of promotional banners was created and distributed, including banners sent to the North and featured at three prestigious shows, attracting considerable attention.

Members were given access to a training PowerPoint presentation developed by Pacifica Stud Australia, a leading name in Boer goat breeding.

An updated, illustrated Breed Standard booklet was published and made available to all members.

Monthly newsletters continued to be issued, providing updates, resources and guidance to all BBGS members.

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2024.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objectives of the British Boer Goat Society (hereafter referred to as BBGS) are as follows:-

The promotion of agriculture for the public benefit by the encouragement, promotion and improvement of the British Boer Goat, and encouraging the breeding of British Boer Goats.

The main objective of the BBGS for this period was to continue promoting the breed through education in management, welfare, marketing and showing.

The BBGS has had to address the changes that Brexit has introduced into the livestock and agricultural world in general. The ongoing effect of Brexit is ever changing and the BBGS is monitoring these changes closely with the protection of the breed standard and the membership at its core.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

Show competitions were undertaken at four shows, namely the Royal Welsh Agricultural Spring Festival the Royal Three Counties Show, Staffordshire Agricultural Show and Hanbury and District Countryside Show. All shows were well attended both by exhibitors and the public. The football and interaction with the public regarding the goats was tremendous at all four shows.

One of the world's leading international judges judged the National Breed Competition at Royal Three Counties Show and provided insightful and educational talks to both members and the public.

Members were offered a reduction in entrance fees to the above shows too as part of the educational programme. This will be offered again for the 2024 showing season.

The BBGS website has been updated extensively and is routinely updated with information, competition results and photographs.

Throughout the year there has been an increased effort in developing the BBGS's online presence with both member only and public Facebook pages.

Competition results and photographs are now posted on the day of the competition.

Show videos are posted to Facebook, YouTube and on the website.

The BBGS organised and oversaw two sales of finished meat goats at the Melton Mowbray livestock market and Worcester cattle market. The sale was open to any goat keeper but only BBGS members were eligible for rosettes and cash prizes for the best and reserve carcass on the hoof, judged by the relevant auctioneer's representative.

A range of informative banners to promote the Boer Goat at events have been produced.

A series of informative training videos from the UK's leading goat vet Mr. David Harwood MRCVS have been made available for the membership. In addition the authoritative Goat Health Book by David Howard that complements the training videos have been sent to all members.

Monthly newsletters are sent to all members.

An excellent newly illustrated breed standard booklet has been printed and made available to existing and new members.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

The committee remit is to provide a society which enables all its members to benefit from knowledge sharing, whether they own two goats or two hundred. By providing opportunities to learn about the Boer goat breed we will enable breeders to have a better understanding of the standards required, providing them with knowledge to assess their own goats.

Most breeders will already be categorising stock into show or cull groups. Shows and training days will further empower breeders to decide which faults are acceptable to breed out through a selected breeding programme.

The BBGS is continuing to promote Boer goats at shows with new displays and literature. Shows are advertising everyone's goats through the competitions and we have had shows applying to hold Boer classes.

Our aim is to hold knowledge sharing days in different parts of the country utilising the knowledge of a range of experts thereby providing a balanced view of the breed. The society will also utilise the AGM to provide talks on a variety of aspects of Boer goat keeping.


