- 1) For the benefit of the public to further the conservation and preservation of the hedgehog species in Gloucestershire.
- 2) For the benefit of the public to relieve the suffering and distress of hedgehogs in need of care and attention by providing a rescue, care and rehabilitation service for sick, injured, or orphaned hedgehogs with the aim of releasing such hedgehogs back into the wild wherever possible.
- 3) To advance the education of the public in the study of hedgehogs and in the care, methods of treatment, conservation and habitat of hedgehogs.

Brockworth Hedgehog Rescue research, rescue, rehabilitate and release native european hedgehogs in order to support and preserve the species for the public benefit.

We give talks on our work with hedgehogs to the public including schools, care homes, community groups and similar organisations.

Like 2020, 2021 was largely affected by covid and the restrictions that were in place.

We continued to concentrate on online fundraising to comply with the rules in place during the year, event fundraising was restricted but we were able to attend some events where possible.

Due to the restrictions and the events we attended being card only, we were able to help increase our sales with the Izettle machine.

Our numbers increased again on the 2020 admissions of 436, in 2021 we took in 502 hedgehogs.




Independent examiner's statement
