This all age service provides an opportunity for all to worship together in a more relaxed atmosphere. These services are very well received and have proved to be very popular.</p> <p>The Whatsapp group continues support and inform, and the Zoom monthly Evening services,, with speakers continues</p> <p>Saturday evening Food for Thought events, with a guest speaker and a free meal are very popular in the wider community.</p> <p>The uniformed groups of Guides, Brownies and Rainbows bring a new group of youngsters into our building, developing our links with the wider community. This year we gave out 100 Bags of Hope at Christmas, containing Chocolate, A Greetings card and a bookmark to all the homes in the neighbourhood.</p>

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT

I report on the financial statements of Roman Road Independent Methodist Church Failsworth for the year ended 31 October 2025.

Respective responsibilities

The church is responsible for the preparation of the financial statements, and considers that the audit requirement of Section 43(2) of the Charities Act 1993 (the Act) does not apply. It is my responsibility to state, on the basis of procedures specified in the General Directions given by the Charity Commissioners under Section 43(7)(b) of the Act, whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of Independent Examiner's report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions of the Charity Commissioners. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the church and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the financial statements, and seeking explanations concerning any such matters.
