A separate Access agreement is currently being negotiated with United Utilities the reservoir owners. <b>Spade Mill Building</b> there have been funding for a new hand winch to launch and recover heavy boats and purchase of a new outboard motor for the safety boat. In addition United Utilities have granted permission to make improvements to the gate entrance. The Association is now looking at sources of funding for these works.
