Our annual programme of activities include:-</p> <p>Managing and operating our dedicated water sports centres at Fishmoor (Blackburn) & Spade Mill (Longridge) reservoirs. These venues were open between March and Oct for our members to allow small groups of Young People (YP) to enjoy water activities e.g. paddling and sailing.</p> <p>New Fishmoor Boathouse fundraising during 2021/22 did not progress further and remains at £8,260 to be used towards planning and building costs.</p> <p>Spade Mill Building improvement planning during 2021/22 like Fishmoor took a step closer with the completion of a new slipway with the assistance of a £2,000 grant from Progress Housing.</p> <p>Waterday w/e watersports event on Lake Coniston for 91 Young People.</p>
