During the year participation numbers increased record levels, with a number of new recreational classes introduced, these include mini gym classes which are structured classes for 2-4 year olds

This is in addition to the existing classes offerings and school camps that continue to take place with maximum participation rates.

Additionally, 75 Gymnasts are continuing to develop through the national development plan.

More coaches have been introduced and supported in their qualification process, including the successful plan to advance former gymnasts into active coaching roles which allows them to continue participation in within the organisation, by coaching new participants and members.

All participants trained and took part in various competitions and displays. A concerted effort was made to allow as many gymnasts to experience competition as possible to increase inclusivity

We continue to support coach development which has led to record numbers of coaches, coaching within the centre, gaining qualifications across varying, this has lead to the increasing class offer for more recreational classes catering for gymnasts of all levels.

We also held an international competition which had record participation allowing gymnasts to compete in international competition against gymnasts from across the world.
