We have paid fees for 4 students – 1 student that completed a work internship, 1 student completing a post secondary school vocational courses and 2 students in secondary school.

The student on the work internship was placed for 3 months between 1 October 2024 and end of December. Kickstart Kibera supported this student with official uniform, transport costs and membership fees for KNASW (Kenya National Association of Social Workers) and KISWCD (Kenya Institute of Social Work and Community Development) to further support the student maximise their opportunity to find longer term job opportunities.

1 student completed their diploma in beauty therapy at the start of 2024. T

The 2 students in secondary school completed form 1 and form 2 of secondary school during 2024. They will go into form 2 and form 3 for 2025.

**Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year**

We have paid fees for 5 students – 1 student in college, 2 students completing post secondary school vocational courses, 1 student in secondary school and 1 student in primary school.

The student in college completed their course in Social Work and Community Development at the end of 2023 with a distinction achieved. This top grade was achieved by just 6 other students out of the 101 students on the course. The student had internship opportunities during the course, providing her with crucial work experience and increasing her likelihood of obtaining a job after completion of the course. Kickstart Kibera paid for the student's lodging and college fees during this course.

1 of the 2 students completing post secondary school vocational courses completed a diploma in beauty therapy. The other student completed an IT course alongside training in key Microsoft packages and attended an art school.

The 1 student in secondary school is a new student sponsored by Kickstart Kibera in 2023.

The 1 primary school student finished primary school in 2023 and we have decided to continue sponsoring them into secondary school in 2024.

The pupil in college is due to finish at the end of 2023.

Of the 4 children in secondary school, all 4 have finished secondary school at the end of 2022.

The 1 primary school pupil is due to finish primary school in 2024.

Attendance has been strong for the kids that we sponsor and they have been supported with the resources needed to catch up on lost learning during the pandemic.

Arrangements have been made in 2023 to support some of the students through further education. 1 of the pupils has opted to resit their secondary school exams.

We have paid fees for 6 children – 5 in secondary school and 1 in primary school.

Of the 5 children in secondary school, 1 finished secondary school at the end of 2021 and the remaining 4 children in secondary school are due to complete their second year (form 2) of secondary school in 2022. COVID-19 has had a lesser impact on the children's schooling in 2021 versus 2020, though in 2020, government schools across the country have accelerated the school timetable in order to catch up on time lost during the lockdown period in 2020.

The 1 primary school pupil is due to finish primary school in 2023.

Attendance has been strong for the kids that we sponsor and they have been supported with the resources needed to catch up on lost learning during the pandemic.



**Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year**

We have paid fees for 6 children – 5 in secondary school and 1 in primary school.

Of the 5 children in secondary school, 1 is in their final year and due to receive their Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education (KCSE) results in 2021. She was initially due to finish at the end of 2020, however there was a delay due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The remaining 4 children in secondary school are due to complete their second year (form 2) of secondary school in 2021. This has also been delayed due to the COVID-19 pandemic as they were initially due to complete form 2 at the end of 2020.

The 1 primary school pupil was enrolled in the sponsorship programme in January 2019 and is due to finish the 5<sup>th</sup> year of primary school in 2021. This pupil experienced similar delays to those pupils in secondary school.

Attendance has been strong for the kids that we sponsor, with the exception of mandatory absence resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic. This has resulted in significant delays to learning for all children with absences between March 2020 up until the end of the year with classes only resuming in January 2021. We assisted the children with resources to aid learning but significant efforts will be required in 2021 for the children to catch up on missed learning and to re-adapt after a significant period at home with limited structures to their learning. No further school closures due to the pandemic are expected in 2021 and we have been impressed by the adaptability of the children to re-integrate at school and continue with lessons.




