

## ANNUAL REPORT IPA-UK 2020

### 1. Fundraising Activities

Fundraising activities during this year were severely curtailed due to the Corona virus pandemic. The only event possible was the annual Golf Day in September as it was held outdoors.

### 2. Projects

Donations and funds from the Golf Day allowed the following projects to be implemented:

Four First Aid Stations in rural Albania were equipped with basic supplies and medication which will allow thousands of people to be treated and will save lives. These rural First Aid Stations also provide security for locals who otherwise would have no possibility of getting any treatment and many people would die of an illness or accident without any help available.

The professional school in Rubik, Albania was equipped with materials, machines, equipment and tools to enable complete training courses for plumbing, heating and mechanics. The students are very motivated, disciplined and have a much better future ahead.

Over 1000 children in the Chibanja school in Mzuzu, Malawi had no books or learning materials. IPA-UK was able to buy hundreds of school books and other learning materials like dictionaries, atlases, white boards, rulers, compasses etc. Even sports equipment was purchased. The performance of the children improved very quickly and the teachers are much more motivated. This project is making a big difference to the education of the children in a poor quarter of the town.

### 3. Conclusion

In the period under review three projects were implemented. In Albania and Malawi thousands of children will benefit from better education and over 3000 people in Albania will benefit from medical treatment and first aid in rural areas.

#### Outlook for 2021

IPA-UK will continue to support First Aid Stations in rural Albania and will support water supplies and hospital facilities in Malawi.

The fundraising activities will still be curtailed due to the pandemic, but the fundraising Golf Day will definitely go ahead.



**Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of International Project Aid**

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 October 2020 which are set out on pages 1 to 2.

**Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner**
