Independent Examination

The charity's gross income during the period was below £25,000 and it is therefore not required to have an independent examination.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The charity is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO), established on 4 September 2016 and registered with the Charity Commission on 6 November 2016. It is governed by a Foundation Constitution.

The trustees are responsible for the overall management and control of the charity. Trustees are appointed in accordance with the provisions set out in the charity's constitution. New trustees are appointed by resolution of the existing trustees.

The charity has procedures in place to manage conflicts of interest. Trustees are required to declare any potential conflicts and withdraw from decision-making where appropriate.

All trustees give their time voluntarily and receive no remuneration or other financial benefits. No expenses were reimbursed during the period.

Trustees have access to appropriate training and guidance to fulfil their responsibilities effectively.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The charity's principal objective is the promotion of humane behaviour towards animals for the public benefit, in particular by relieving the suffering of cats and dogs that are neglected, abandoned, abused, stray or otherwise in need of care and attention.

This is achieved through the PAWS in Need program:

- Rescue and rehabilitation of animals in need
- Provision of veterinary treatment, including vaccination, sterilisation and microchipping
- Placement of animals into suitable foster homes
- Rehoming animals locally and internationally

The charity operates under the working name "Qatar Tails", reflecting the geographical focus of its rescue activities in Qatar and its emphasis on animal welfare.

The charity also works to promote responsible pet ownership and animal welfare awareness.

The trustees confirm that they have had due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit and are satisfied that the charity's activities provide public

benefit by improving animal's welfare and promoting responsible pet ownership.

From time to time, the Charity extends its scope of activities to alleviate the sufferings of people around the world.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

During the period from 1 July 2024 to 30 June 2025, the charity focused on maintaining and supporting its existing rescue commitments under its "PAWS in Need" programme.

This included providing ongoing care and veterinary treatment to rescued animals; successfully placing animals into foster and permanent homes in Qatar and the UK; and continuing to assess and match animals to suitable adopters.

The charity ensured appropriate oversight of its activities by working with trusted service and veterinary providers.

The "Pets on Jets" initiative faced limitations due to a reduced network of adopters and foster resources within the UK. This was partially offset by increased adoption activity among expatriates within Qatar. A total of 55 cats were adopted within the 12 month period.

The charity also participated in the Paws for Hope community event, which helped raise awareness of animal welfare, responsible pet ownership, and adoption. This engagement strengthened community connections and supported the charity's outreach objectives.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The charity's total income for the period ended 30 June 2025 was £3,405 (2024: £2082). All income was derived from voluntary donations.

All funds received during the year were applied directly to specific animal welfare cases and related charitable activities.

Total expenditure for the period was £3,309 (2024: £2849), with the costs relating directly to charitable activities, including veterinary care, transportation, and animal welfare support.

Net movement in funds for the period was £96.

At the end of the financial year, the charity held cash balances of £352. The trustees confirm that there were no outstanding liabilities at the year end.

RESERVES POLICY

The trustees have established a reserves policy to ensure that the charity can continue to meet its obligations in the event of unforeseen expenditure or a reduction in income.

Given the nature of the charity's activities, the absence of fixed overheads, and the practice of applying funds directly to charitable purposes as they are received, the trustees consider it appropriate to maintain minimal reserves at this time.

The trustees will continue to monitor this position and review the policy regularly as the charity's activities develop.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The trustees have considered the major risks to which the charity is exposed. These include:

- Financial risk due to reliance on voluntary donations
- Operational risks associated with animal rescue, veterinary treatment, and rehoming
- Risks associated with operating within Qatar

To mitigate these risks, the trustees:

- Maintain oversight of financial activity and expenditure
- Work with trusted service and qualified veterinary providers
- Implement checks for foster placements and adoption processes

The trustees review risks on a regular basis and will continue to formalise risk management procedures as the charity develops.

FUNDRAISING ACTIVITIES

The charity raises funds through voluntary donations and online platforms. The trustees ensure that all fundraising activities are conducted in a manner consistent with the charity's objectives and applicable regulations.

TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES STATEMENT

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

The law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the charity's financial position.

In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- Select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently
- Observe the methods and principles of the applicable Charities SORP
- Make judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent

The trustees are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records, safeguarding the assets of the charity, and taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

FUTURE PLANS

The trustees intend to continue pursuing the charity's goals as outlined in the Objectives and Activities section of this report. Future plans include expanding its foster and adoption networks in both England and Qatar, enabling the charity to support more animals in need of rescue and rehoming.

The charity also aims to increase public awareness of animal welfare issues and promote responsible pet ownership through community engagement.

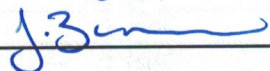

We place them in fully vetted foster homes, assess their personalities and identify any special needs so we can search for the most suitable home for them,

Our People In Need programme deals primarily with low-paid migrant workers and runaway maids. We organise community initiatives to mobilise food, clothing, and other basic health and sanitary items.

The trustees have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives and in planning its activities. The trustees are satisfied that the activities outlined above provide a benefit to the public.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

During the six months period to 30 June 2024, the main operational focus of the Charity was to maintain its obligations to the existing portfolio of rescued animals while establishing a new team of volunteers to continue its mission. This was successfully concluded on 18 July 2024.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The Charity's total income to 30 June 2024 was £2,082 (2023: £15,776), all of which related to donations income.

As with previous year, all donations income received during 2024 was restricted. Total operating expenses were £2849 (2022: £18,522 and related almost exclusively to the charitable activities as defined in the Charities SORP.

RESERVES POLICY

The Trustees have established a Reserves Policy to enable the Charity to function effectively and meet its obligations in the event of a decline in our income or a major cost.

Having considered the nature of the Charity's operation, and in particularly the absence of fixed overheads, the Trustees are satisfied that zero reserve level is appropriate for the period.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The Charity is a charitable incorporated organisation, founded on 4 September 2016 and registered as a charity on 6 November 2016. The Charity was established under a Foundation Constitution which established the objects and powers of the charitable organisation and is governed under its articles of association.

All trustees give their time voluntarily and receive no benefits or expense reimbursement from the charity.

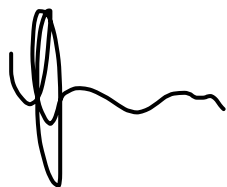

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Due to a lack of human resources, and volunteers in particular, the Charity's activities in 2023 were seriously curtailed. Regular fundraising activities were halted and rescue operations significantly reduced. Nevertheless, the Charity continued to make a difference, one life at a time, utilising all available resources at its disposal. Over 42 homeless cats and kittens were rescued and taken under its sponsorship programme.

Evenstar Pets on Jets initiative remained the Charity's core focus, successfully rehoming and relocating over 41 abandoned pets from Qatar to the US and the UK.

Due to a lack of both financial and human resources, the Charity halted its Trap, Neuter and Return Project in Qatar as well as People-In-Need events.

FINANICAL REVIEW

The Charity's total income for 2023 was £15,756 (2022: £16,422), all of which related to donations income.

As with previous year, all donations income received during 2023 was restricted. Total operating expenses were £18,522 (2022: £18,659 and related almost exclusively to the charitable activities as defined in the Charities SORP.

RESERVES POLICY

The Trustees have established a Reserves Policy to enable the Charity to function effectively and meet its obligations in the event of a decline in our income or a major cost.

Having considered the nature of the Charity's operation, and in particularly the absence of fixed overheads, the Trustees are satisfied that zero reserve level is appropriate for the period.

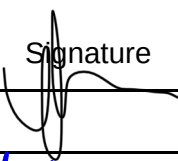

The trustees present their report and receipts and payments accounts for the year ending 31 December 2021.

Reference and administrative information set out on page 1 forms part of this report.

It is considered that all Trustees and any others who could be understood to be “managers” in the activities and affairs of the charity are deemed to be “fit and proper” under the terms of the Finance Act 2011.

In-servicer training is available for all Trustees as and when required.

The Trustees are aware of their obligations in respect to establishing a Risk Assessment Policy and increased consideration will be given to this as the Charity expands in its activities and responsibilities.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Our principal objective remains the promotion of humane behaviour to relieve the suffering of animals, in particular cats and dogs, by providing care, protection, treatment and security for neglected, abandoned, abused, stray and street dogs of Doha, Qatar, which are in need of care and attention by reason of sickness, maltreatment or poor circumstances by providing foster and adoption homes for the care of such animals.

From time to time, the Charity extends its scope of activities to alleviate the sufferings of people around the world.

Our vision is a world in which all nature’s creations live without fear of pain, starvation or abuse.

Our mission is to make a difference, one life at a time, people and animals alike. We focus on the vulnerable ones, those who live only to survive and those without a voice. We go where there is no mass media attention, where the international charities deem too marginal to have any direct impact, where governments stay on the fence but where human beings and animals with real sufferings are not heard.

Our Paws In Need programme deals specifically with abandoned and abused animals.

- **TNR:** We trap, neuter and return stray cats that are capable of living in an outdoor community. Once returned into the community, we continue to monitor their health and support them through daily feeding.
- **From Trash to Treasure:** We rescue animals in need and provide them with necessary medical care. All our sponsored animals are microchipped, fully vaccinated, sterilised and tested as a matter of course. We place them in fully vetted foster homes, assess their personalities and identify any special needs so we can search for the most suitable home for them,

Our People In Need programme deals primarily with low-paid migrant workers and runaway maids. We organise community initiatives to mobilise food, clothing, and other basic health and sanitary items.

The trustees have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives and in planning its activities. The trustees are satisfied that the activities outlined above provide a benefit to the public.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

2021 continued to be an extreme challenging year for the Charity in face of the global pandemic crisis. The Charity's regular fundraising activities were halted and rescue operations significantly hindered by Covid-19 lockdown and social distancing measures. Nevertheless, the Charity continued to make a difference, one life at a time, utilising all available resources at its disposal. Over 90 homeless cats, dogs, kittens and puppies were rescued and taken under its sponsorship programme.

Evenstar Pets on Jets initiative remained the Charity's core focus, successfully rehoming and relocating over 40 abandoned pets from Qatar to the US and the UK. With the drastic reduction in the number of animal friendly expats working in Qatar, the number of credible good local adopters was at critically low. The population of healthy abandoned pets looking for homes, on the other hand, continued to rise well above the availability of suitable loving homes. The Pets on Jets initiative gave them the only chance of a finding a home.

Due to a lack of both financial and human resources, the Charity halted its Trap, Neuter and Return Project in Qatar as well as People-In-Need events.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The Charity maintained the level of donation contributions in 2021. Total income was £30,700 (2020: £27,200), the majority of income received related to donations income at £23,600 (2020: £23,500).

As with previous year, all donations income received during 2021 was restricted. Total operating expenses were £27,000 (2020: £23,700) and related almost exclusively to the charitable activities as defined in the Charities SORP.

RESERVES POLICY

The Trustees have established a Reserves Policy to enable the Charity to function effectively and meet its obligations in the event of a decline in our income or a major cost.

Having considered the nature of the Charity's operation, and in particularly the absence of fixed overheads, the Trustees are satisfied that zero reserve level is appropriate for the period.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The Charity is a charitable incorporated organisation, founded on 4 September 2016 and registered as a charity on 6 November 2016. The Charity was established under a Foundation Constitution which established the objects and powers of the charitable organisation and is governed under its articles of association.

All trustees give their time voluntarily and receive no benefits or expense reimbursement from the charity.

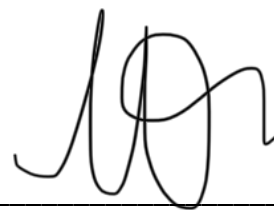
