MAAC's short-term goal is to close down the illegal markets worth USD \$ 20 billion per annum.</p> <p>Alongside the intelligence work, MAAC looked to focus on various fundraising events to raise money to continue the on going field work.</p> <p>However, with the events industry still recovering from the global Pandemic the focus was on other areas of sustainable income.</p>

		<p>The charity was targeting high network individuals and family offices to keep things ticking over via THE ARK network.</p> <p>Aside from that, we are also looking into the web 3 space - Metaverse and NFT's.</p>


