Basingstoke Shed is governed by its constitution dated 21st November 2016; trustees are elected by members of Basingstoke Shed in accordance with the constitution. This year there were no changes to the Trustees.

Our objects as specified are:

“The promotion of social inclusion for the public benefit of people living in Basingstoke and the surrounding area to combat loneliness and social isolation arising as result of their age, infirmity, disability, financial hardship or social circumstance.

To do this we will provide workshop facilities where they can meet to socialise and engage in activities together, such facilities being aimed at increasing their engagement, skills and condition of life.”

The trustees believe we have complied with our objects as stated in our constitution and will continue to do so for the benefit of our members and the public.

At the end of June 2025 the total value of cash and bank deposits was £24,421, of which £7,308 was unrestricted funds and £17,113 restricted funds.

Membership

At the end of the reporting year, we had 21 members.

Activities and Achievements

In the year reported, our activities and achievements included:

- Supporting the local community. This year we supported the National Trust ‘Alice Through the Looking Glass’ project at the Wyne for their winter season display by constructing a giant pocket watch and a giant drink me flask for display on their outside trail.
- Old Basing Carnival. The Shed had a stand at the carnival where we sold various wood turned items and photographic frames, manufactured by members.

- Supporting our landlords. We have a mutually beneficial relationship with our landlords supporting Everest Community Academy with maintenance and support activities by repairing and refurbishing equipment we also created materials for students to use in their practical classes. The Shed also supports the school through teaching basic woodworking skills to a small group of students.
- Operating a Music Shed. We have two groups holding sessions on alternate Wednesdays.
- Members are continually working on their own projects and projects that help the community.
- Ensuring that Basingstoke Shed provides a safe environment for our members and for those organisations and individuals we help by updating and developing our procedures and protocols, this year the focus has been on implementing risk assessments for all motorised items of equipment and ensuring that members use equipment safely.
- Providing a location for men and women to make things and enjoy friendly chat.

Each of these activities relate to our objectives and they contribute to the benefit of the wider community in which we live.

The Shed continues to look for additional premises, the premises at Everest School are very good but the limited space that we have in the Portakabin and our restrictions on opening times mean that we are unable to expand our membership.

Westside Community Centre

The Trustees are sad to report that The Basingstoke Shed is unable to reopen its base at the Westside Community Centre in South Ham. The Centre was closed at short notice due to significant structural issues in September 2023.

The Cabinet of Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council decided on March 18th 2025 to acquire the part of the building owned by Hampshire County Council with the plan of passing the whole structure to the Sovereign Network Group. The aim is for the land to be redeveloped as part of wider plans for South Ham

The future

We will continue to look for additional premises so that we can expand our support of people in the local community.

The trustees would like to pass on our condolences to the family of Mike Brading who recently passed away (December 2024). Mike Brading was the founder of the Basingstoke Shed and was the driving force behind the Shed-in-a-bus Project as well as his other extended work with the UKMSA and supporting other Sheds, contributing significantly to improve the mental health of people in the community. He was a lovely, kind hearted man who spent a lot of his time working to improve the lives of others.

In this reporting period (August 2023) Robert Taylor sadly passed away, Robert had been receiving treatment for lymphoma. He joined the Shed in April 2018 and was a Trustee for over two years. He contributed greatly to the charity, being a key member of the team moving from QMC to Westside and was involved in many community projects.

Basingstoke Shed is governed by its constitution dated 21st November 2016; trustees are elected by members of Basingstoke Shed in accordance with the constitution. This year there were changes to the Trustees, Robert Taylor died and Phil Neale was appointed as a new Trustee in December 2023.

Membership

- Supporting the local community. This year we supplied to the Basingstoke Library Discover Centre in Basingstoke providing a six large planters and two large A frame planters. In addition we supplied to the Oakley Village Hall a stage stair platform to aid amateur dramatic productions.
- Supporting our landlords. We have a mutually beneficial relationship with our landlords supporting Everest Community Academy and Westside Community Centre with maintenance and support activities by repairing and refurbishing equipment. The Shed also supports the school through teaching basic woodworking skills to a small group of students.
- Operating a Music Shed at the Shed, we have two groups holding sessions on alternate Wednesdays.
- Members are continually working on their own projects and projects that help the community.
- Ensuring that Basingstoke Shed provides a safe environment for our members and for those organisations and individuals we help by updating and developing our procedures and protocols, this year the focus has been on developing risk assessments and ensuring that members use equipment safely.
- Providing a location for men and women to make things and enjoy friendly banter.

Each of these activities relate to our objects and they contribute to the benefit of the wider community in which we live.

A significant issue for the Shed this year was the closure of our premises at the West Side Community Centre. The Centre was closed due to the structural RAAC issue. We were given very short notice of the closure but were able to move equipment to a storage facility. The Trustees have tried to find an alternative location but this has not been possible. As Basingstoke Shed now has limited space and access we have had to freeze our membership numbers.

The future

We hope to take on new members again in the coming year.

Basingstoke Shed is governed by its constitution dated 21st November 2016; trustees are elected by members of Basingstoke Shed in accordance with the constitution. There were no Trustee changes during this reporting period.

Our objectives are:

“The promotion of social inclusion for the public benefit of men and women living in Basingstoke and the surrounding area to combat loneliness and social isolation arising as result of their age, infirmity, disability, financial hardship or social circumstance.

To do this we will provide workshop facilities where they can meet to socialise and engage in activities together, such facilities being aimed at increasing their engagement, skills and condition of life.”

The trustees believe we have complied with our objects as stated in our constitution and will continue to do so for the benefit of our members and the public.

At the end of June 2023 the total value of cash and bank deposits was £23,171, of which £5970 was unrestricted funds and £17,201 restricted funds.

Activities and Achievements

In the year reported, our activities and achievements included:

- Completion of the Shed-in-a-Bus project. The double decker bus was converted to a mobile workshop and cafeteria. The Bus was moved from the Stagecoach Bus Depot in Basingstoke and was MOT'd. Internally, we reviewed the operation and running aspects of the project and concluded that we did not have sufficient resources to operate the Bus. Despite extensive canvassing of other UK Sheds, Members and similar organisations both locally and regionally we were unable to find anyone to take on the operation and running of the Bus. We had some initial interest from several groups but in the end storage, insurance costs and operational difficulties meant we had to find an alternative use for the Bus. After consultation with our sponsors and funders we obtained their agreement to sell the Bus for use as a stationary workshop and cafeteria. They also agreed we could retain any unspent funds for use in line with our objectives as a Shed. The balance of the specific funds originally allocated from our own Shed funds were also released back into Shed general funds.
- Operating a Music Shed at the Shed, we have two groups holding sessions on alternate Wednesdays.
- Supporting our landlords. We have a mutually beneficial relationship with our landlords supporting Everest Community Academy and Westside Community Centre with maintenance and support activities. An example of this work was the replacement of 320 table tops for the Everest Academy which we understand was extremely helpful for them and enabled them to reuse their existing desks rather than replace the complete desks. Similarly there were various activities at Westside including refurbishing tables used in the Social Club.
- Supporting the local community. For example we made 42 Christmas Trees, each made of plywood and 1.2m high for Basingstoke and Deane Council which were then distributed to local schools and other groups for decorating and then displaying at the local shopping centre in December. We also supported the local library by delivering 6 large planters that are now installed in an outside patio area.
- Members are continually working on their own projects and projects that help the community.
- Ensuring that Basingstoke Shed provides a safe environment for our members and for those organisations and individuals we help by updating and developing our procedures and protocols.

Each of these activities relate to our objectives and they contribute to the benefit of the wider community in which we live.

The Shed continues to have a generally positive atmosphere and our members assist each other and share ideas. New members are always welcome and there is usually someone to give a helping hand and make them feel part of the Shed community.



Basingstoke Shed is governed by its constitution dated 21st November 2016; trustees are elected by members of Basingstoke Shed in accordance with the constitution. We have had some changes of Trustees this year, with Mike Brading stepping down as a trustee and chair due to health issues and Pete Dixon sadly died. Many thanks to Mike for all his hard work in starting up and running Basingstoke Shed. Pete Dixon will be missed by us all.

Our objectives are:

"The promotion of social inclusion for the public benefit of men and women living in Basingstoke and the surrounding area to combat loneliness and social isolation arising as result of their age, infirmity, disability, financial hardship or social circumstance.

To do this we will provide workshop facilities where they can meet to socialise and engage in activities together, such facilities being aimed at increasing their engagement, skills and condition of life."

The trustees believe we have complied with our objects as stated in our constitution and will continue to do so for the benefit of our members and the public.

At the end of June 2022 the total value of cash and bank deposits was £22,457, of which £4,389 was unrestricted funds and £18,068 restricted funds. Of the unrestricted funds, £2,324 are allocated by the trustees to the Shed-in-a-Bus project, leaving a net unrestricted amount of £2,065. At all times we aim to have unrestricted reserves of a minimum of £1,000 which equates to more than three months average operational costs based on this year's expenditure.

Membership

At the end of the reporting year, we had 27 members.



Covid-19 Impact

Covid restrictions had a significant impact on the operations of Basingstoke Shed during the period. The Shed was initially closed and our main efforts were to ensure safe re-opening to ensure the safety of our elderly membership. All meetings were carried out remotely. Limited re-opening of the Shed was started in September '21 at Everest (Community Academy school) and QMC (Queen Mary's College). Activities were also restarted on the Shed-in-a-Bus project.

Activities and Achievements

In the year reported, our activities and achievements included:

- Work on the conversion of a double decker bus into a mobile shed (Shed-in-a-Bus). The work comprised making the bus roadworthy and continuing with the conversion of the inside into a workshop and a café and social area.
- Change of premises. Basingstoke Shed initially had two locations in Basingstoke, one at Everest and another at QMC. Regretfully our Shed at QMC had to be closed in December 2021 as the College could no longer accommodate us. Fortunately we were able to find a new location at Westside Community Centre and we were able to re-open a second Shed in Basingstoke in April 2022.
- A Music Shed at Everest which is held on a Wednesday.
- Supporting our landlords. We have a mutually beneficial relationship with our landlords supporting Everest Community Academy with maintenance activities and for the Westside Community Centre we help to repair and maintain equipment to support their activities.
- Support of a Jubilee event run by Sovereign Housing at Westside by helping children in the community assemble and decorate various wooden kits such as bird feeders and bug houses. We also made some bird boxes for them which were given out at the event to their residents so they could put them in their gardens.
- Members continue to work on a mix of their own projects and projects that help the community.
- Ensuring that Basingstoke Shed provides a safe environment for our members and for those organisations and individuals we help by updating and developing our procedures and protocols.

Each of these activities relates to our objectives and contributes to the wider community in which we live.

Although our activities were impacted by Covid, the Shed continues to have a generally positive atmosphere and our members are always ready to assist each other and regularly share ideas. New members are always welcome and there is usually someone to give a helping hand and make them feel part of the Shed.

The future

Our membership is depleted from pre-pandemic numbers due to Covid 19. We hope to be able to recover and expand our membership in the coming year.

Basingstoke Shed is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO), registered charity number 1170481. Basingstoke Shed has two sites: Everest Community Academy, Oxford Way, Basingstoke RG24 9UP and Queen Mary's College, Cliddesden Road, Basingstoke RG21 3HF. The Shed is also converting a double decker bus into a mobile men's shed, known as Shed-in-a-Bus.

The trustees of Basingstoke Shed present their annual report and accounts for the year ending June 2021.

Basingstoke Shed is governed by its constitution dated 21st November 2016; trustees are elected by members of Basingstoke Shed in accordance with the constitution.

Our objects as specified are:

"The promotion of social inclusion for the public benefit of men and women living in Basingstoke and the surrounding area to combat loneliness and social isolation arising as result of their age, infirmity, disability, financial hardship or social circumstance.

To do this we will provide workshop facilities where they can meet to socialise and engage in activities together, such facilities being aimed at increasing their engagement, skills and condition of life."

The trustees believe we have complied with our objects as stated in our constitution and will continue to do so for the benefit of our members and the public.

At the end of June 2021 the total value of cash and bank deposits was £28,493, of which £3,906 was unrestricted funds and £24,587 restricted funds. Of the unrestricted funds, £2,324 are allocated by the trustees to the Shed-in-a-Bus project, leaving a net unrestricted amount of £1582. At all times we aim to have unrestricted reserves of a minimum of £1,000 which equates to more than three months average operational costs based on this year's expenditure.

Membership

At the end of the reporting year, we had 34 members.

Covid-19 Impact

Like so many Men's Sheds, our activities again were greatly reduced and progress has been greatly slowed. Where we have been able to hold Shed sessions, numbers have been very limited and various PPE and cleaning protocols have been implemented to ensure we have Covid-Safe environments. To date, the trustees know of no cases of Covid-19 among our members and resolve to do everything possible to ensure there is no transmission of the virus related to Shed activity.

Activities and Achievements

In the year reported, our activities and achievements included:

- **Everest:** The shed continues to support the school with their school maintenance activities. Supporting classroom activities to help with teaching materials preparation. Members are also continuing with their own projects.
- **QMC:** Several members have been unwell which has curtailed activities somewhat. A bottle green house was erected in conjunction with students for the QMC special needs unit. The QMC shed has been supporting the Shed in a Bus development, false floor, kitchen area units and tables.
- **Shed in a bus:** After a lot of hassle with an Essex-based commercial garage, we got an MOT and had the bus towed to Basingstoke. We thank Stagecoach Ltd., for allowing us to keep the bus in their Basingstoke Bus depot and for the help and advice given to us in getting the bus running. Major progress was then made in the conversion of the Bus. We added many of the tools to the top floor, which is now a usable workshop. Downstairs about half of the conversion of the rear half into a café/relaxation area have now been completed. The aim at the end of the reporting year was to get to 4 summer events in 2021.
- **Music Shed:** This shed met online during shutdown as Covid regulations and associated caution prevented meeting in person.

Each of these activities relates to our objectives and contributes to the wider community in which we live.

The atmosphere at the Shed is generally good and helpful. New members are welcomed and there is usually someone to give a helping hand about anything – ranging from advice and guidance to solving technical problems.

We helped and advised Tadley Men's Shed as they formed their new Shed. In turn they helped with our bus project.

The future

Our growth was hit by Covid-19 and is virtually static. We hope to be able to expand our membership to others in the coming year, assuming that the vaccination programme enables more social interaction again. We also expect to get the Bus to an operational state in the next year.


