		<p>Also, the organisation has been involved in a number of Missionary and outreach work, with a number of monetary donations to specific hardship relief funds.</p> <p>The Trustees continued the effort to allow as many people as possible to worship at our church and to become part of our community at Yedam Church. To help with the inclusion the New Believers Support Team has increased in members to allow a more efficient welcoming and support to establish in the Church family.</p> <p>The Translations Team has continued to work tirelessly to provide accurate translation of the service and preaching to people from other backgrounds. This service has helped the inclusion of people from different parts of the world by breaking down language barriers.</p>

Para 1.20	<p>Worship services:</p> <p>The worship service was held every Sunday during the reporting period with the lead of the senior Pastor. The church also had two Sunday schools for children and youths every Sunday. All services were held via zoom due to the pandemic till October 2021 and switched to hybrid gatherings both in Liverpool and Manchester. The church has managed to maintain around 80 in number of regular attendees. The church continues to update and post its service through website and social network.</p> <p>Midweek Services:</p> <p>Morning prayer gatherings started using social network platform during the week days (7 – 7:20 Mon to Fri). Ladies' bible study gathering was held every Tuesday morning. There were six other house groups, gathering bi-weekly, for fellowship and prayers during the reporting period. Young adults group met for bible study every Wednesday night. Everything was held online.</p> <p>Outreach Activities:</p> <p>The newly planted church in Liverpool for the Korean students and immigrants attracted new families and students when the church met in person. Some church members volunteered at local food bank for packing and delivering food parcels every Monday. Young adult group served homeless people at Manchester city centre. The church supported five children around the world by providing regular financial donation and building relationships with them via Compassion. The church also supported three missionary families in Romania, Gambia, and Uganda financially each 1,200 pounds per year. Also the church supports the students at Nazarene</p>





