Volunteers helped in cooking warm meals for refugees placed in local hotels with no cooking facilities using the surplus food we have from food redistribution days.

		<p>We now operate twice a week with the increase in volunteer numbers.</p> <p>Some of our volunteers have been supported to obtain level 2 food and hygiene certificate and cook meals from the food surplus for community members especially those without cooking facilities and those on a low income. .</p>

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
