#### Annual Ministry Report 2024 to 2025

#### A Year of Growth, Influence and Community Transformation

#### Introduction

The year 2024 to 2025 has been a season of continued growth, spiritual maturity and expanded influence for Rehoboth International Ministries. Building on the foundation laid in the previous year under the theme of Royal Establishment, the ministry experienced strengthening in leadership, expansion in missions, deeper discipleship and increased community impact. Guided by the Holy Spirit, the church has remained committed to preaching the true Word of God, serving people with compassion and equipping believers to live purposeful, Christ centred lives.

This year marked significant progress in mission expansion, children and youth development, leadership training and digital outreach, enabling the church to reach new people locally, nationally and internationally.

#### Church Life and Ministry Activities

Throughout 2024 to 2025, Rehoboth International Ministries remained active in a wide range of ministries including Sunday services, Saturday night gatherings, Wednesday intercession prayers, fasting prayers, outreach programmes, mini crusades, church planting initiatives, the Prayer Tower ministry and ongoing support for the needy. These ministries have provided spiritual, emotional and practical help to individuals and families within the church and the wider community.

The church continued to support families facing financial hardship, offered mental health awareness sessions, assisted young people with employment guidance and provided pastoral care to those in crisis. These initiatives have strengthened community relationships and demonstrated the love of Christ in action.

#### New Mission Stations and Church Expansion

During the year 2024 to 2025, Rehoboth International Ministries celebrated the opening of new mission stations within the United Kingdom. We are now at Manchester, Poole, Bristol. These mission stations were established to serve as prayer hubs, teaching centres and outreach points, helping to connect new believers to the church and strengthen fellowship among members living outside the main church location.

Regular prayer meetings, cottage gatherings and leadership visits were conducted at these mission stations, resulting in new salvations, restored faith and increased participation in church life. These mission stations have become vital bridges for church growth and community engagement.

#### Vision, Leadership and Training for a Godly Lifestyle

In alignment with the church vision, strong emphasis was placed on leadership development and training believers to live a godly lifestyle. Ministries such as Sunday School, Youth Ministry, Ladies Ministry, Gents Ministry, Rehoboth Biblical Training Camp and the Hand of Homeless Ministry continued to grow and mature.

This year, structured leadership courses were introduced to equip emerging leaders with biblical knowledge, spiritual discipline and practical ministry skills. These courses covered topics such as servant leadership,

character development, preaching foundations, pastoral care and community impact. Participants have shown significant growth and are now actively serving in various areas of ministry.

#### Kids Church and Children Development

The Sunday School Ministry developed further into a vibrant Kids Church during 2024 to 2025. The focus remained on raising children grounded in the Word of God, with age-appropriate teaching, worship sessions and interactive biblical learning.

Children were taught Christian values, prayer, scripture memory and practical faith application. Teachers followed an accredited syllabus supported by creative activities, helping children grow spiritually and socially. The Kid's Church has played a key role in shaping confident, disciplined and faith driven children who are becoming positive influences in their schools and communities.

#### Youth and Young Adults Ministry

The Youth Ministry continued to be a strong pillar of the church, with special focus on training young adults and shaping future leaders. Youth and young adults were equipped through worship sessions, Bible teaching, leadership mentoring and open discussions on real life challenges.

Training programmes helped young people develop confidence, communication skills, spiritual discipline and a sense of purpose. Many young adults stepped into ministry roles, including worship, media, outreach and teaching. This intentional investment is helping to shape a generation that contributes positively to church growth and community development.

#### Adult Sunday School and Discipleship

The Adult Sunday School continued successfully, with structured teaching sessions led by the senior pastor. Conducted both in person and online, these sessions deepened biblical understanding and strengthened spiritual foundations among adult members.

The Discipleship Project also expanded, providing structured learning modules, assignments and mission field exposure. Bible scholars, counsellors and teachers were invited to support spiritual and mental growth, ensuring a holistic approach to discipleship.

#### Media Ministry, Podcasts and Digital Growth

The Media Ministry experienced notable growth during 2024 to 2025. Social media platforms including Instagram, Facebook and YouTube continued to expand, helping to bring new people into the church and reach individuals beyond physical boundaries.

This year also marked the launch and growth of church podcasts featuring sermons, teachings and discussions by pastors and leaders. These podcasts have enabled members and online listeners to access spiritual teaching at any time, strengthening faith and engagement.

Online live streaming recorded sermons and testimonies have reached thousands, with many sharing how digital content helped restore hope, faith and connection to the church. The consistent online presence has become a powerful evangelism and discipleship tool.

#### Missions and Outreach

Mission work remained central to church life. Within the United Kingdom, area prayer meetings and outreach gatherings continued across several cities, helping to bring new families into fellowship.

Internationally, the church remained involved in charitable missions including housing support for underprivileged families and assistance for communities in crisis. These missions reflected the heart of Christ by addressing both spiritual and practical needs.

#### Mentorship Programme

The mentorship programme continued to flourish, providing guidance and accountability for youth and young families. Each participant was supported by a mentor and overseen by pastoral leadership. The programme has produced strong testimonies of spiritual growth, restored relationships and renewed purpose.

#### Worship Team, Volunteers and Fellowship Groups

The worship team continued to lead Spirit filled worship and train new members in musical and worship ministry. Volunteers remained committed and faithful, ensuring smooth services and a welcoming church environment.

Ladies and Gents Fellowship meetings strengthened unity through prayer, charity projects, fundraising and support for the homeless and immigrant students. Practical help such as meals, job guidance and CV support continued throughout the year.

#### Prayer Life and Spiritual Growth

The church sustained its strong prayer culture with monthly fasting prayers, annual extended fasting periods, whole night prayers and meditation sessions. These spiritual disciplines brought renewal, direction and spiritual strength to the congregation.

#### Annual Events and Camps

Annual celebrations and seasonal camps brought the church family together for fellowship, worship, teaching and talent development. These events strengthened relationships and encouraged spiritual growth across all age groups.

#### Looking Ahead

As Rehoboth International Ministries moves forward, the vision remains focused on global church planting, leadership development, community transformation and youth empowerment. Future plans include expanding mission stations, developing mission focused educational initiatives, hosting skill development events and launching the Feed and Love project to support the homeless and vulnerable.

#### Conclusion

The year 2024 to 2025 stands as a testimony to the faithfulness of God and the dedication of His people. Rehoboth International Ministries continues to grow in faith, influence and impact, committed to raising a generation that walks in the authority, love and purpose of Christ. ## 1. Accounting Policies

### 1.1 Basis of preparation

### **Sunday School Ministry**






## Objectives & Activities

As a charity organisation we are keen to help our community in every possible way to achieve peace and happiness through the love of Jesus. We strictly follow the doctrines and principles of Apostolic Christianity.

We conduct outreach ministries, where we offer one to one prayer and support to anyone in need. Fundraising events to support the homeless and underprivileged in and around our town. Counselling and Empowerment meetings for the youths in the community, to guide and direct them. We also support many churches and orphanages in India by sending clothes and by providing food and school essentials for school children.

Overall, our charity organisation helps us to advance the aura of Christian Religion in accordance with the Statement of faith, to relieve sickness and financial hardship and to advance education throughout the world as the trustees may see fit from time to time.

## Achievements & Performance

Rehoboth International ministries was immensely blessed, and it flourished in the year 2020 - 2021. We were able to advance and grow to impact our community very effectively. It is a privilege to see our church grow and expand as it serves the community in the love of Christ. The church has been actively involved in Sunday services, Saturday night, Wednesday night Intercession prayer sessions, outreach ministries, prayer tower and helping the needy ministries enabling us to intercede and help many who were in need spiritually and financially. Church has been holding pandemic relief services for example mental health classes, supporting families in financial crisis and offering youths help on finding jobs.'

Church has been actively involved in training up all groups of people in a godly lifestyle. Our ministries include Sunday school, Youth ministry, Ladies ministry, Gents Ministry and Rehoboth Biblical training camp and Hand of Homeless ministry, mentorship for youths and young family, helping and training them for ministry of Holy Spirit.

### **Sunday School Ministry**

As a church we are very focused in bringing up another generation in the truth of God. Our dedicated Sunday School Ministry helps our children to learn the basic foundations of Christianity. Our Sunday School runs from 09.20 am to 10.20 am every Sunday. The students are divided into various classes according to their age and are taught by dedicated teachers who have volunteered to teach them from an accredited syllabus. Along with lessons they are actively involved in learning songs and activities to help their talents and use it for the kingdom of God.

During this year a total of four teachers served in the Sunday School Ministry. The Sunday school ministry has helped our children to become role models in their schools and in the community.

### **Youth Ministry**

Our youth ministry is an important part of our church. They get greatly involved and connect with the church and God. They are given opportunities to conduct praise and worship, discussions on contemporary issues faced by youths and biblical solutions to issues, counselling to avoid temptations of drugs and alcohol etc. With each session with youths, they are taught to become strong in the Lord and to be independent and truthful in their lives and how to integrate the Christian values into their life and impact others.

During the youth meeting youngsters are given opportunities to recite Bible verses, say short stories and deliver biblical short messages according to their age groups. There are opportunities to perform their talents and abilities given by God to showcase their skills especially with musical instruments and singing. There is regular bible quiz to broaden their knowledge.

Mentorship programme has been started in the church for youth and young families. The main aim of the mentorship is to facilitate their personal needs and strengthen their relationship with Holy Spirit and the word of God. Every youth is assigned a mentor and they are reviewed by Senior Pastor.

### **Sunday service 10AM- 01:30PM**

The primary aim of our church is to worship, grow in the word of God and testify the power of Christ in our everyday life. We authentically give importance to the Word of God and Holy Spirit in our service, and we use our worship session to reach an uttermost intimacy with God.

The service begins with personal submission prayer along, it gradually takes us into the worship, and it's continued by prophetic and interpretation sessions and from there on into inspirational testimonies, spiritual messages, seeking and receiving prophetic words from God, Infilling of Holy Spirit and ends with holy communion table in the remembrance of our Lord.

Occasionally, Servants of God from all around the world are invited to our church to spiritually refresh and impact us and our community.

### **Area Prayer Connect and Cottage meetings.**

Guildford, South end on sea and Dartford. We are hoping to extend to many more cities across England in the years to come.

Area prayer meetings are conducted on alternative Saturday between 3pm to 5pm at each town by the appointed leaders. The aim of area prayer connect group is to invite new people into the fellowship of church and Christ. It has proven to be a blessing to many people to grow and understand the love of Christ.

### **Ladies and Gents Fellowship Connect groups**

Ladies and Gents meetings are conducted on the 4th Sunday of every month between 10 AM to 11 AM. These meetings are conducted so the members of the church grow in intimacy and unity. We organise many programmes such as fund-raising events, charity events, mission work projects, debates on relevant social and spiritual issues and personal prayer intercessions to help one another. The connect groups take great initiative to cook and serve food for the homeless, also help young adults (immigrant students) to find jobs and help with CV and their studies.

### **Discipleship Project**

Church and leadership are very keen to build up a generation of young leaders for the kingdom of God. We have a discipleship class which includes learning modules, Assignments, and mission field work to get a hands-on experience to become a next generation leader. We invest money to bring bible scholars, teachers, and counsellors to teach and give guidance to our entrants to help them develop spiritually and mentally.

We are reaping great blessings with this project, and we are hopeful that will surely impact a generation to walk closer to God.

### **Fasting Prayer, Whole Night Prayers, and Meditations**

The church always declares 21 days fasting prayer on the month of December and the last 3 days of every month for personal edification and intercession for the world. These meetings are profoundly spiritually uplifting, edifying and great blessings to the church and the members. We conduct whole night meetings and meditation prayers every 3 months.

### **Church Sunday school, Youth Annual Day Celebrations, Summer/ winter camps**

The Church Annual Day celebrations and summer/ winter camps take place every year. The leaders choose a town and find accommodation for the whole church and spend 3 nights and 4 days in a camp centre.

For annual day celebration, the church annual celebrations are planned very early on in the year, it is a great celebration within the church, there are many programmes and talent show exhibitions during the event.

## **Future Developments**

The church intends to continue to host its regular conferences in the UK and will continue to hold their regular Sunday services, their Sunday school for children aged from 3 to 16 years old, their youth and ladies' events and their outreach programmes. The charity is looking for a permanent place for the events. The charity will be focusing on church planting, starting mission oriented academic institution, charity events and upskilling events for youths and vulnerable residents in the community.

Another upcoming project is Feed and Love, focusing on the community. The intention is to give out homemade hot meals to the homeless and providing necessary assistance to the needy.


