Bewnans Kernow had a successful year as it continues to develop Cornish Heritage in Penzance in the former Penzance public library building. The talks which are usually held fortnightly provided a high-quality educative experience for attendees whilst providing a platform to 21 people over the year to speak about their specialist local interest or to raise the profile of a heritage issue or festival. The regular audience expanded and became more engaged with the activities provided. Cornish language provision continued to expand with Cornish classes and a monthly Cornish language social evening.

Bewnans Kernow celebrated the 10th anniversary of the inclusion of the Cornish within the auspices of the Framework Convention for the Protection of National Minorities with a Cornish High Tea. We were joined online by Professor Dr Tove Malloy of the Council of Europe's Advisory Committee who answered questions and provided much information. Other events included a popular Cornish Carol Evening with the Red River Singers, an Archaeology Day with Laura Miucci and a St Piran's Day Quiz.

Cornish Heritage and Penzance had a donation of the George Green archive of photographs and films, A number of films and CDS from the estate of Howard Curnow were received while the reference library continued to expand.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year**Cornish Heritage in Penzance tbc**

Bewnans Kernow has leased part of the former Penzance public library building which will be developed into a venue for Cornish culture and heritage under the name of Cornish Heritage in Penzance. The first two open days to welcome the public were held in May 2023. Subsequently fortnightly talks on aspects of Penzance and Cornish history given by specialists and practitioners were held every fortnight and developed a strong audience. This provided a platform to 31 people over the year to speak about their specialist interest or to raise the profile of a heritage issue or festival which provided a high-quality educational experience for attendees.

Social media channels were opened and the Bewnans Kernow website developed to inform different audiences.

Cornish Heritage in Penzance, working with experienced tutors, began to offer fortnightly Cornish language lessons to Beginners and Improvers as well as a monthly Cornish language social evening.

Several events were run in conjunction with other cultural organisations including Cornish Christmas festival preparation workshops and a Cornish Christmas carol event.

New equipment was added and the reference library expanded.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year**Constitution**

A key development during this year was the change in the Bewnans Kernow constitution from an Association model Charitable Incorporated Organisation to a Foundation model Charitable Incorporated Organisation. Trustees called an Extraordinary General meeting of former associate organisations who fully supported the proposals. The reason for this was to enable Bewnans Kernow to continue to meet its charitable objects and to accommodate the evolution of Bewnans Kernow over time from being a support organisation for a partnership of Cornish cultural organisations to an independent charity ready to take on the lease of a building to develop into a heritage venue.

Cornish Heritage in Penzance

Bewnans Kernow's primary work during 2022-23 was on preparations to open 'Cornish Heritage in Penzance', a new venue to share, celebrate and research Cornish history and culture to be established in the former Penzance public library building.

Further unexpected restoration work needed at the building, which is now listed, resulted in a delay to moving into the venue. In autumn 2022 Bewnans Kernow was able to begin using the building and over Winter 2022/23 and the following Spring Trustees worked to decorate and equip the property in advance of the first Open Days in May 2023. A new logo was commissioned and social media accounts opened.

Grants

In January 2023 Bewnans Kernow was awarded a grant of £2,700 by the Penwith Landscape Partnership.

Bewnans Kernow continues to be involved with heritage work at a strategic level and is a member of the Cornwall Council Heritage Kernow Board. At a local level it is a member of the Madron History Group Committee.

Bewnans Kernow's primary work during 2021-22 was on preparations to open 'Cornish Heritage in Penzance', a new venue to share, celebrate and research Cornish history and culture which will be established in the former Penzance public library building.

At the start of the financial year Bewnans Kernow was engaged in rounding off the National Lottery Heritage Fund Recovery Fund project (for a grant of £46,800) and the follow-up activities. Our key aims in delivering this project were to:

- increase the resilience of Bewnans Kernow, especially in the face of the covid situation,
- increase our capacity to develop a venue in Penzance which will celebrate, share, research and develop Cornish history, culture and heritage
- lay the foundations and purchase core equipment for the centre
- accelerate the sustainability of the centre.

The result was that the majority of the groundwork for launching the new venture was put in place.

Further unexpected restoration work needed at the building, which is now listed, and a series of lock-downs due to the pandemic resulted in a delay to moving into the venue. The Business Plan for the new venue continued to be developed as did policies and other matters of governance.

Cornish Heritage in Penzance

Bewnans Kernow's primary work during 2020-21 was on preparations to open Cornish Heritage in Penzance, a new venue to share, celebrate and research Cornish history and culture which will be established in the former Penzance public library building. However, the year was a year of two contrasting parts, in large part due to Covid-19. During the first part of the reporting period, the pandemic and associated lockdowns meant all work had to be desk-based and as a result, Bewnans Kernow's focus during spring, summer and autumn of 2020 was therefore on bid-writing. During the second part of 2020-21, Bewnans Kernow was able to put in place a large part of the foundational work needed to launch Cornish Heritage in Penzance.

Our key aims in delivering the project were to:

- increase the resilience of Bewnans Kernow, especially in the face of the covid situation,
- increase our capacity to develop a venue in Penzance which will celebrate, share, research and develop Cornish history, culture and heritage
- lay the foundations and purchase core equipment for the centre
- accelerate the sustainability of the centre.

The work undertaken during the project included:

- Ongoing liaison work with Truro and Penwith College, the owners of the building.
- Purchase of a large amount of core equipment for the new centre.
- Purchase of small library of 200 Cornish history books.
- Production of a sound Business Plan to underpin the development of Cornish Heritage in Penzance as well as to identify the changes to the operating environment caused by the pandemic.
- Development of a Heritage Plan to guide us during our first year.
- Writing a suite of policies, both organisational and centre specific.
- Working with an IT / AV consultant to plan the interpretive possibilities we can offer through audio visual equipment..
- Production of Risk assessments for the project.
- Writing a Communications strategy.
- Research work for teaching and interpretive materials.
- Further bid writing and research to inform future bids.
- Branding work to develop a logo and other visual identifiers.

Impact of Covid-19

The pandemic had a marked impact on Bewnans Kernow during the first part of the year as the plans to lease part of Penzance library building

were delayed and Trustees had to conduct meetings online instead of in person. Delivery of the 'Launching Cornish Heritage in Penzance' project had to be more intensive than planned due to the emergency nature of the funding, but the delivery team adjusted accordingly. A whole suite of new plans was written to forecast how we will operate in the new environment, and to prepare us, especially in our dealings with the public.

New website

Bewnans Kernow launched a new organisational website details about the aims of the charity, its work, and its history.

Consultation

Bewnans Kernow continued to work in association with Cornish Quest on consulting the Cornish cultural sector. Bewnans Kernow also successfully applied to the #iwill fund administered by Cornwall Community Foundation to run 'Hands on Heritage', a project to involve young people with Cornish heritage and Cornish identity. This grant was received, and the project will be delivered, in 2021-22.
