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



Review of the charity's financial position at the end of the period	Para 1.21	Donations & rehoming fees saw a decrease in 2021/22 from the previous year and the Charity were fortunate to receive a £53.3k legacy which was most helpful in covering vet fees & other overheads. There was also an extremely generous donation of £10k from a valued supporter. The Charity continued to rehome ponies to relieve suffering enabling them to continue with much needed rescue activities. A lease on one of the charity yards was discontinued due to an unreasonable increase in the rent and further restriction on the amount of land available for use.

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

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

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
