GSM's overseas programmes focus on helping underprivileged people in developing countries who are stacked in poverty and financial hardship and cannot lift themselves out of a cycle of generational poverty, hopelessness and abandonment. We hope to achieve this objective:

1. By offering financial grants, interest free loans or items to individuals in need (depending on the availability of funds) to start a business or invest in any sustainable financial venture that will enable them to be self-sufficient and equip them to lift themselves out of poverty.
2. By providing educational scholarships in their communities to offer educational opportunities, training, skills and hope to some underprivileged young people in that part of the world.
3. By working with Scripture Union in Ghana (Volta Region) to support financially their Annual Summer Study Camp program which helps to get underprivileged young people off the streets, to be engaged in healthy educational and recreational activities. We hope to extend this annual camp ministry to Jamaica and other developing countries where Scripture Union exists and operates.
4. By offering support and financial assistance to other non-profit agencies such as, Crown Placement Agency in Romania which runs Orphanage to help underprivileged children.

**Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year****Tanzania**

GSM has increased its support for Pastor Michael and his family this year. We were involved in a critical mission to assist a mother and her newborn child, who required urgent medical care. Due to concerns regarding the child's prognosis, GSM provided financial assistance for transportation—including taxi, bus, and electric train—to facilitate access to appropriate medical services in the city. Additionally, we covered hospital expenses and other necessary amenities.

As a result of these efforts, the child has made a full recovery, as confirmed by local medical practitioners. The ministry's activities have also grown in Tanzania; Pastor Michael is now training a young pastor to enable continued ministry work within the community. Bible studies are held regularly via Zoom, and ongoing mentoring and coaching remain essential to helping Pastor Michael fulfil his pastoral responsibilities. Consistent spiritual support continues to be a priority.

**UGANDA**

Pastor Denis continues to receive both spiritual and emotional support. Our team offers pastoral care, Bible studies, counselling, and mentoring through Zoom.

**KENYA**

GSM continues to support the spiritual development of multiple pastors.

**INDIA Grace Church Ministry**

GSM remains dedicated to providing ongoing financial support for the accommodation, food, clothing, and educational materials necessary for the ten orphaned children in our care. To prevent eviction and ensure continuity of care for the children, we have assisted Pastor Vijay with his rent payments. Now that Pastor Vijay has secured employment, he is better positioned to support himself and his family. In addition to financial assistance, we continue to offer spiritual guidance, pastoral care, mentoring, and coaching to enable him to effectively fulfil his responsibilities as a pastor and missionary.

**PAKISTIAN**

Evangelist Kashif has received ongoing spiritual support, mentoring, and coaching. Additionally, we occasionally provide assistance with travel expenses. We maintain consistent communication with sewing schools and other initiatives being conducted in Pakistan.

**GHANA**

Pastor Arthur joined our community last year, and we have provided ongoing spiritual support, mentorship, and coaching to him and his family. Additionally, we maintained our annual financial contribution to Scripture Union in support of the youth summer camp.

All overseas interactions with our partners are managed through Zoom, WhatsApp, and email.

Looking ahead to 2026, we will continue focusing on workshops covering self-esteem, money management, and discussion forums aimed at developing essential life skills. Our initiatives will serve women, men, and children both in the UK and internationally.

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

**Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year****GHANA**

As part of our continued support, we sent £1,000.00 to Scripture Union to assist with the yearly summer camp in August 2023. The summer camp is committed to benefiting the community by providing education, pastoral care, medical assistance, and organizing an engaging summer camp experience for children in the local area and neighbouring communities.

**ROMANIA**

GSM has maintained a long-standing partnership with Crown Agency in Romania, providing ongoing support through pastoral care, bible studies, mentoring, encouragement, and prayer.

**TANZANIA**

Pastor Michael and his family continue to receive comprehensive support from GSM, including spiritual guidance through Bible studies, prayer, and pastoral care, as well as emotional and financial assistance for medical expenses. In January, we also provided counselling support after the devastating loss of their new-born child. To help them become more self-sufficient, we have also sent funds to establish a small snack business venture.

**INDIA GRACE CHURCH MINISTRY PASTOR VIJAY**

As part of our ongoing monthly commitment, we continue to provide financial support that covers basic needs, including accommodation, a caregiver, food, clothing, and educational materials, as well as medical care.

In addition, our support extends to spiritual growth, with Bible studies for the pastor, his wife, church members, and the youth group. We are also actively involved in pastoral care, addressing the needs of the community.

In times of need, we have assisted with medical bills for the pastor's wife and some church members, and our commitment to pastoral care remains unchanged.

**PAKISTAN EVANGLISTS Kashif**

Consistent financial assistance is provided to aid him in traveling for the village ministry, including support for the sewing school, village school, and community projects. We maintain regular communication to track the progress of all initiatives and offer guidance.

**UGANDA PASTOR DENNIS**



GSM's overseas programmes focus on helping underprivileged people in developing countries who are stacked in poverty and financial hardship and cannot lift themselves out of a cycle of generational poverty, hopelessness and abandonment. We hope to achieve this objective:

1. By offering financial grants, interest free loans or items to individuals in need (depending on the availability of funds) to start a business or invest in any sustainable financial venture that will enable them to be self-sufficient and equip them to lift themselves out of poverty.
2. By providing educational scholarships in their communities to offer educational opportunities, training, skills and hope to some underprivileged young people in that part of the world.
3. By working with Scripture Union in Ghana (Volta Region) to support financially their Annual Summer Study Camp program which helps to get underprivileged young people off the streets, to be engaged in healthy educational and recreational activities. We hope to extend this annual camp ministry to Jamaica and other developing countries where Scripture Union exists and operates.
4. By offering support and financial assistance to other non-profit agencies such as, Crown Placement Agency in Romania which runs Orphanage to help underprivileged children.

Ongoing mentoring and coaching and also support with church growth.

**Pakistan** – Evangelist Kashif

Regular financial support and assistant with personal matters and also ministry; travelling to various villages to provide support and food for the poor. Financial support also given to a family member who needed urgent medical care and medication.

**Kenya** – The Late Bishop Duncan

Financial support for his ministry and Pastors, sadly he passed away and financial support was given to his family for funeral cost and to help during the difficult period. We are currently planning to mentor and coach his son to carry on the legacy.

**Uganda** - Pastor Denis Magezi

Due to unforeseen circumstances, this family was displaced in different parts of the country. After speaking with Pastor Denis, financial support was provided so that the family can all be together under one roof. **Jamaica**

**New Road School St Elizabeth** - GSM provided uniforms, schools bags, shoes and other items for 14 children. Laptops, Desktop computers, printers and other aids to support the school. We also started a breakfast club; monthly funds were sent to support this project.

In February 2023 the CEO Doreen McDonald went to Jamaica to carry on charity work. Supplies of Clothes, Food, books, stationery and other items for donated to New Road School and New Road Early Learning Intuition school. Two (2) other schools in the Cambridge Area benefitted from the supplies. Finances were given for water tanks, and toilet systems. This project is still ongoing.

GSM's overseas programmes focus on helping underprivileged people in developing countries who are stacked in poverty and financial hardship and cannot lift themselves out of a cycle of generational poverty, hopelessness and abandonment. We hope to achieve this objective:

1. By offering financial grants, interest free loans or items to individuals in need (depending on the availability of funds) to start a business or invest in any sustainable financial venture that will enable them to be self-sufficient and equip them to lift themselves out of poverty.
2. By providing educational scholarships in their communities to offer educational opportunities, training, skills and hope to some underprivileged young people in that part of the world.
3. By working with Scripture Union in Ghana (Volta Region) to support financially their Annual Summer Study Camp program which helps to get underprivileged young people off the streets, to be engaged in healthy educational and recreational activities. We hope to extend this annual camp ministry to Jamaica and other developing countries where Scripture Union exists and operates.
4. By offering support and financial assistance to other non-profit agencies such as, Crown Placement Agency in Romania which runs Orphanage to help underprivileged children.

5. We also work in partnership with other Charities or Christian Organisations that help socially and economically disadvantaged communities in UK and developing countries such as: Kids Alive and Compassion UK.

**GSM's grant making criteria or policy:**

1. The person must be in UK or any developing country where GSM or Scripture Union operates.
2. In the United Kingdom (UK) the person or applicant must be a client (underprivileged person) who has been helped by GSM and supported to reform his/her life.
3. In a developing country, the person must be recommended by the Scripture Union coordinator in that country.
4. The person must be known by GSM or Scripture Union and has proved to have good character or be trustworthy.
5. The person must have the proper skill and training for chosen business venture for which he/she wants to pursue.
6. The person must submit an official application for such educational scholarship, loan or grant to the administrator or secretary. In the developing country, the person must apply to the Scripture Union Camp Coordinator.
7. The prospective applicant would be invited for an interview by the Chairperson in UK or SU camp coordinator in that (developing) country.
8. In the case of grant or loan for business venture, the person must submit a well-researched business plan that will provide an adequate cash flow to operate the business and pay off the loan.
9. The loan or grant must be agreed by the Trustees/Management Committee.
10. The amount of loan would be based on the organisation's strong financial resources or availability.

**Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year**

Global Support Ministry supported and continues to support several organisations (Kids Alive, Compassion, Scripture Union, Amen) and individuals in personal and spiritual development. This practice has expanded out into other communities in London and also overseas in Tanzania, Kenya, India, Pakistan.

**Romania**

GSM continued its support to the work in Romania. Financial support was offered to take in refugees in the ministry home. The financial support enabled the refugees to sort out their passports and visas in case they had to leave Romania in an emergency.

**Tanzania**

In April 2021 Michael Litanda contacted GSM seeking financial help to support himself, wife and son. After listening to his story, it was decided that he needed urgent help. Money was immediately provided for food as they had insufficient funds to buy food for themselves. Their living conditions were very poor and needed adequate housing, financial support was given to find suitable accommodation. The finances were also used to purchase furniture for their home and also IT equipment. In order to sustain themselves long term, help was given to start a farm. This has been very beneficial in helping them find financial stability. GSM also provided English classes for his wife and also weekly bible studies, mentoring/coaching and pastoral care to them and this has continued to date via Zoom. GSM also initiated a community project via Michael, this project helps single mothers to buy uniforms for their children and also provided financial support for an elderly couple to put windows in their house. In 2022, Michael and his wife began a business from home making and selling snacks, this has enabled them to begin working themselves out of circle of poverty and are doing very well. In addition, they have also started Christian fellowship in their community teaching and preaching and bible study.

**INDIA**

Pastor Vijay, from India was introduced to GSM in November 2021. He was having difficulty paying his rent. We supported him and his family with one month's rent. GSM provides pastoral care support to him and his wife on a weekly basis through bible studies, mentoring/coaching and teaching life skills. We have also provided financial help for medical expenses. A small loan was given to one of the members of the congregation. A young lady and her three children were abandoned by her husband. The loan was used to start a small

business. Through hard work she is now able to provide for herself and family. She is slowly repaying the loan on a monthly basis. The repaid loan will be used to help someone else in need. GSM is also providing spiritual support to Pastor Vijay's church congregation through bible studies, prayer, counselling etc. Bibles and Biblical teaching materials were purchased for members of the congregation who had none, which has helped with their spiritual growth. Weekly/monthly pastor care, emotional and spiritual support via zoom is in place. Our greatest achievement is helping Pastor Vijay acquire a house to take in ten (10) children from the slumps and providing them with a home, clothes, food and education. We continue to provide monthly financial support for their upkeep and general wellbeing.

#### **PAKISTAN**

Evangelists Kashif needed counselling, we took him through a six (6) weeks course and also taught bible studies which is continuing. GSM has also financially supported his ministry. Through the financial donations from GSM, two village schools were opened, and also sewing school so that the villagers can learn a trade to support themselves and their families. These programmes have helped in breaking the circle of poverty within their communities. GSM has continued supporting individuals in providing financial support to purchase sewing machines to sew and make a living. Evangelists Kashif is still receiving pastoral care and continues to grow spiritually, emotionally and practically.

#### **Kenya**

GSM supported Bishop Duncan, his family and his congregation in pastoral care and bible study via zoom. During a very stressful period of sickness GSM supported them financially for medical care.

We are upholding our Vision and mission statement, in participating in these countries. We have seen the growth and expansion in each one of them.


