

Throughout the period of this report the church was re-establishing its regular programme of activities after the disruption caused by the Coronavirus pandemic.

Sunday - Church services

Mirfield Evangelical Church provided weekly morning and evening services for the local community. These church services were also streamed live on the internet for the benefit of anyone unable to meet in person and for "visitors" to watch also. A regular group for 3-11 year olds was provided during the morning service.

One baptismal service and one funeral service were held during the period of this report.

The Church provided community support for members and local people including the following regular meetings:

Weekly

From May 2021 to July 2021, prayer meetings were held via zoom each Wednesday evening.

In September 2021 we re-launched fortnightly small group studies, alternating with whole-church prayer meetings, in person.

Allsorts, a weekly stay and play group for toddlers and their carers was re-launched during this period.

Monthly

Bring and Share Sunday lunch, which had been cancelled during Covid, was re-launched in April 2022.

'The Big Read', a programme to help church members and others engage with the message of the whole Bible book-by-book, was launched in January 2022

Termly

Members of the church partnered with members of other local FIEC-affiliated churches to run a Youth Day for 11-14s, hosted in our church building.

Annually/Occasionally

Two Christmas carol services were run and advertised in the local community through leaflet distribution as well as social media in December 2021

A 'Hope Explored' course for those investigating the Christian faith was held in January 2022

A joint Good Friday service with another local church (Dewsbury Evangelical Church) was run in April 2022

A quiz night with a Christian message was also organised in April 2022

A marriage preparation course was provided for one couple in the church ahead of their wedding in July 2021

The Church provided support for Christian ministries in the UK and overseas by way of prayer and financial gifts.

The trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit.
