Workshops were provided aimed at improving mental, social and emotional wellbeing, focusing on loss, change, anger, resilience, low mood, anxiety, confidence and self-worth.</p> <p>Events were held celebrating women and providing taster sessions of complementary therapies and creative activities.</p> <p>Creative communities is a group who facilitate creative projects that require residents active involvement and commitment. The aim of the group is to grow an inclusive neighbourhood and bring residents together.</p> <p>Scoff café provided low cost nutritious, balanced meals to encourage people to the centre, combat loneliness and increase support networks.</p> <p>Volunteers have been integral to the success of Scoff Café and Sunday Social together with the other group activities.</p> <p>The charity is always actively encouraging residents to consider volunteering with the centre.</p> <p>Community fun days to be a voice for the Community.</p>
