The Trustees present their report and accounts for the period ended 31 March 2022.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in Note 1 to the accounts and comply with the charity's constitution, memorandum and articles incorporated 28 March 2017, applicable law and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, FRS102 "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in July 2014.

Structure, governance and management

Viewpoint Centre CIO is a registered charity number 1172302 and is a company limited by guarantee and exists to pursue the charity's objects that are specifically restricted to the following: To promote social inclusion for the public benefit by preventing people from becoming socially excluded, relieving the needs of those people who are socially excluded and assisting them to integrate into society.

For the purpose of this clause 'Socially Excluded' means being excluded from society, or parts of society, as a result of one or more of the following factors: Unemployment, financial hardship, youth or old age, ill health (physical or mental), substance abuse or dependency including alcohol and drugs, discrimination on the grounds of sex, race, disability, ethnic origin, religion, belief, creed, sexual orientation or gender re-assignment, poor educational or skills attainment, relationship and family breakdown, poor housing (that is housing that does not meet basic habitable standards), crime (either as a victim of crime or as an offender rehabilitating into society).

Objectives and activities

The charity's registered premises are located at Viewpoint Stables Moons Lane, Dormansland Lingfield, RH7 6PD.

The primary purpose of the charity is to promote social inclusion for the public benefit by preventing people from becoming socially excluded.

Achievements and performance

The charity has established itself as a focal point for the community and has an active Board of Management and systems in place to develop the Viewpoint Centre CIO productively and causatively.

Staff

The charity has no employees.

Activities

To promote social inclusion for people aged 8 - 24 using powerful unmounted horse-based interventions with specially trained horses

Funding

The charity seeks all available funding in pursuit of its objectives to make the Viewpoint Centre CIO an active facility Centre.

Financial review

The net incoming resources for the year amounted to £24,533 with total reserves standing at £13,733 as at the end of March 2022.

The Board of Trustees aim to establish a policy whereby sufficient reserves, not restricted, committed, or designated be carried to support resources expended at a level enabling the continuation of the current activities of the charity in the event of adversity.

Induction, recruitment and training of trustees

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE BOARD MEMBERS OF VIEWPOINT CENTRE CIO

I report on the accounts of the Charitable company for the period ended 31 March 2022 which are set out on pages 9 - 16.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and reporting accountants

The Board Members, who are also the trustees of Viewpoint Centre CIO, for the purposes of company law, are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The Board Members consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 and that an Independent Examination is needed.
