The church has began also receiving gift aid refund from the HMRC and it is expected that as many eligible members signed up the gift aid declaration forms more revenue will be collected from the HMRC which will boost the church income.

It is the goal of the board of Trustees to set up a building Fund to save year by year the surplus cash from the years operations after putting aside the minimum reserve balance into a building fund to enable the church build sufficient funds to acquire its own building or take on a long-term lease.

It is the policy of the Trustees not to invest at the current state of affairs to invest any of its surplus cash in any commercial entity by way of shares. Only investment in the natures of savings which will attract interest in the short and long term.

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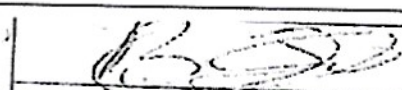

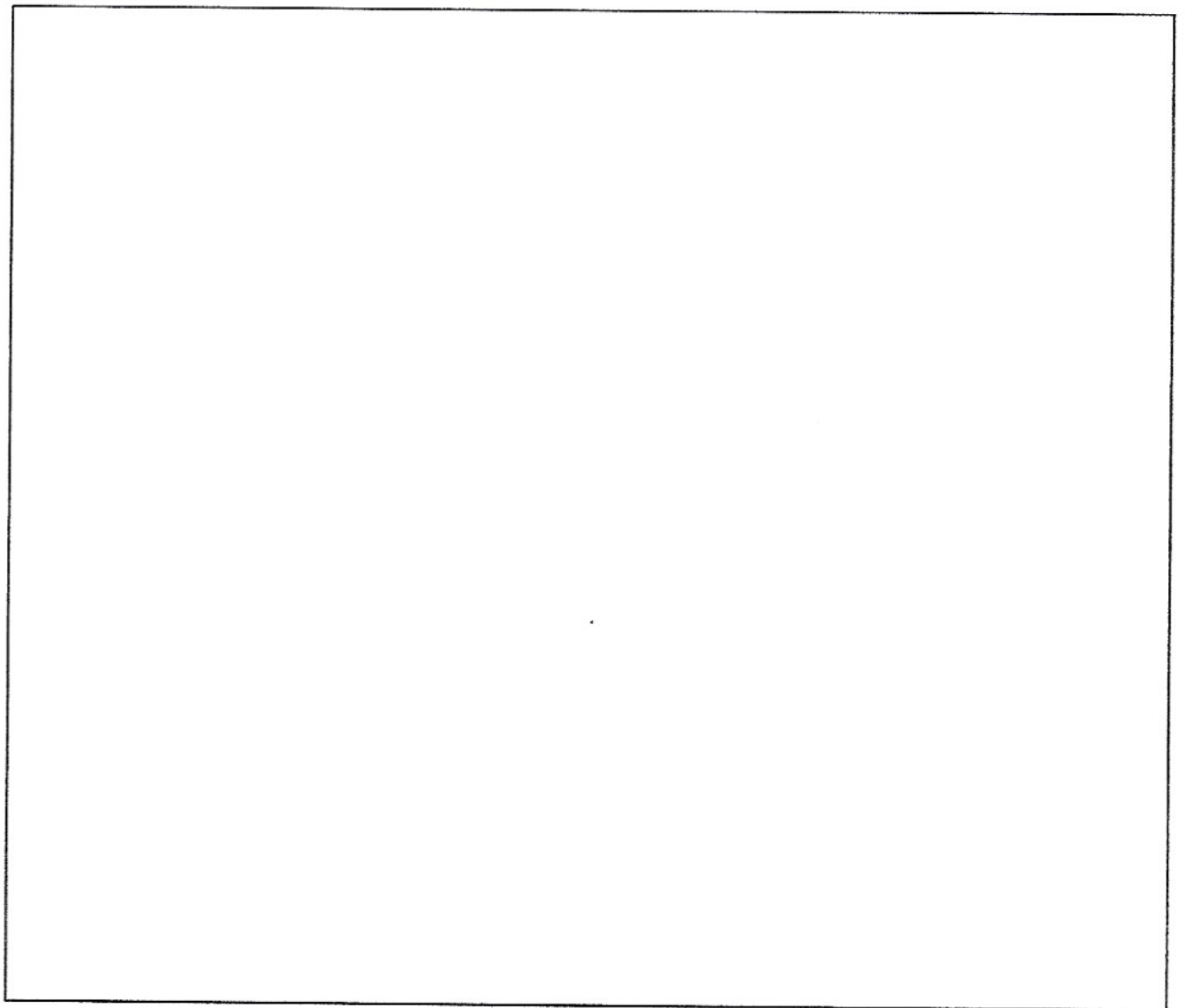

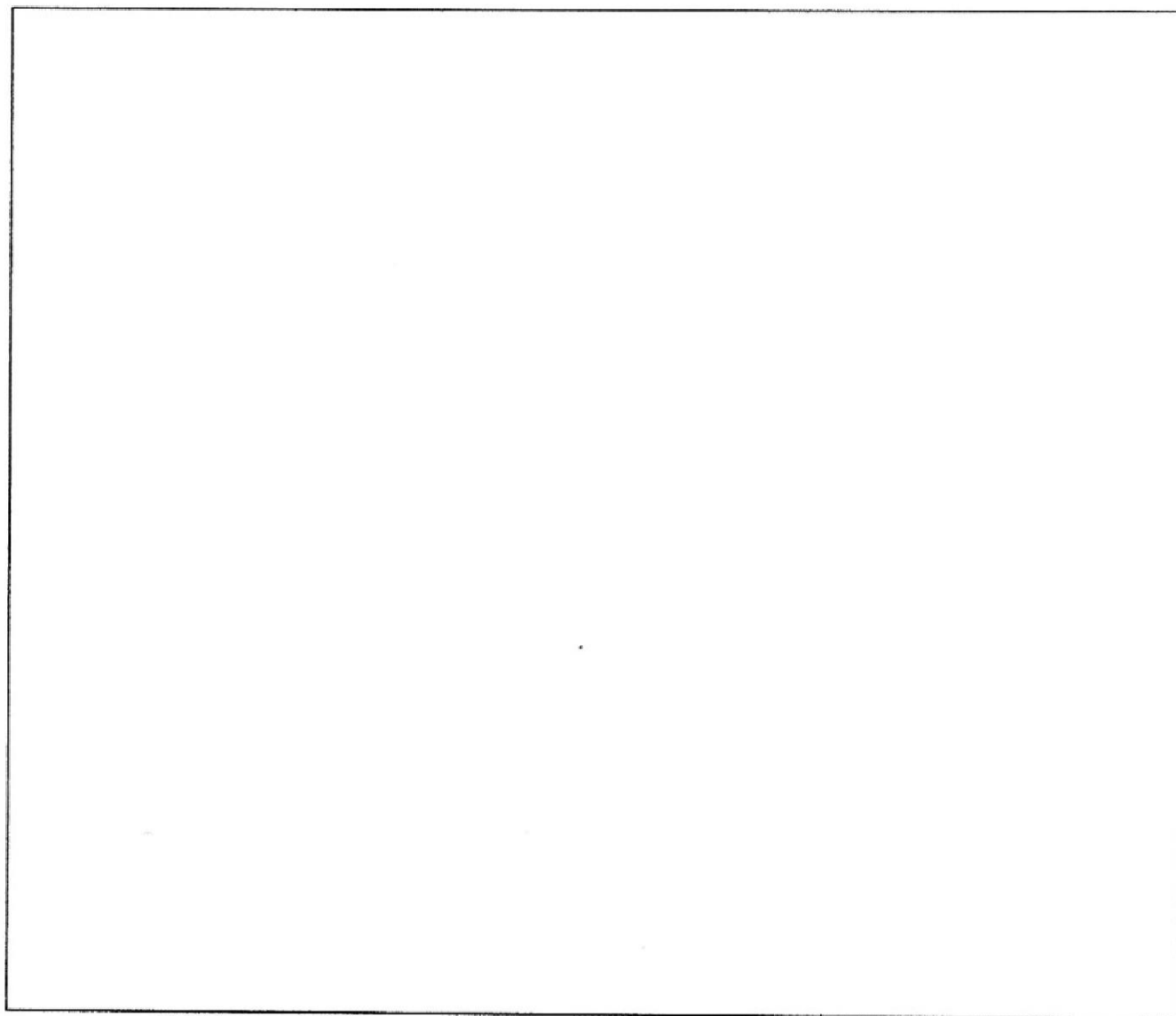
The effect of the covid has been devastating to the extent that church attendance has been very low affecting the income as can be seen in the accounts.

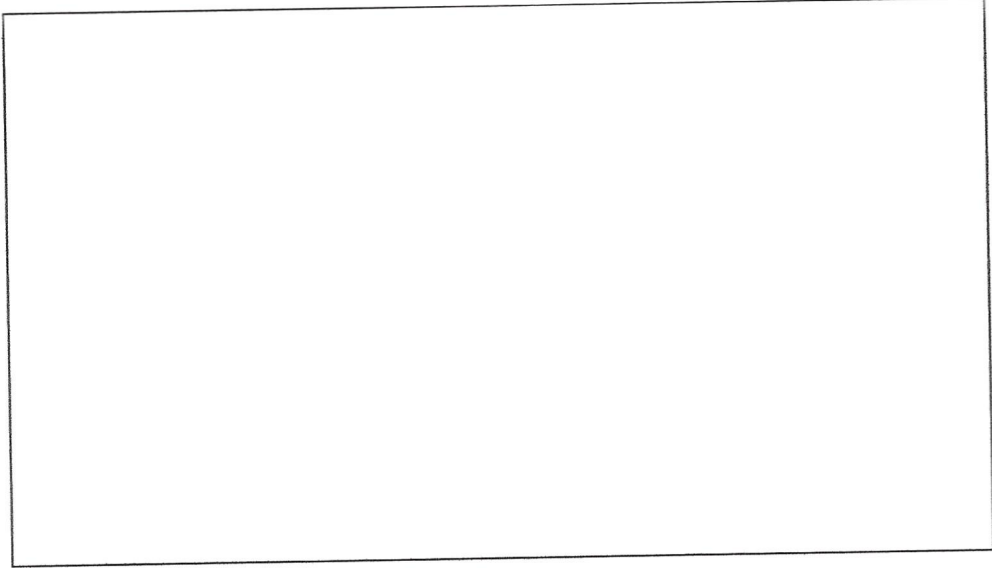

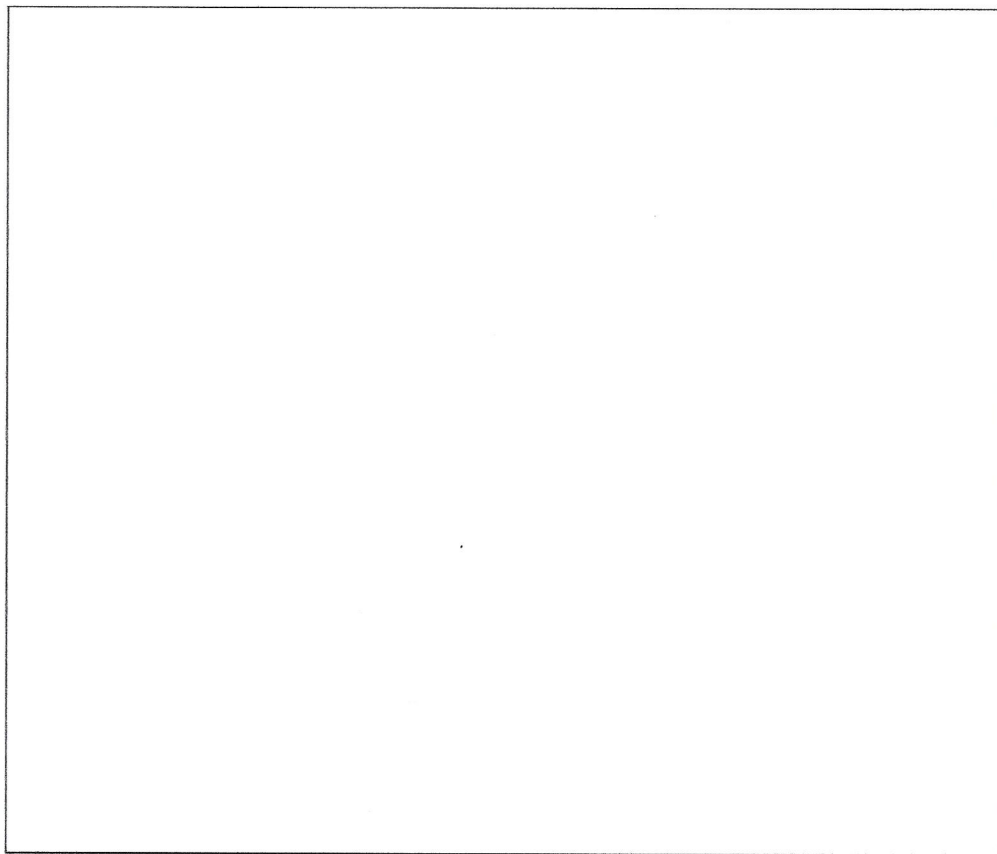
The effect of the covid has been devastating to the extent that church attendance has been very low affecting the income as can be seen in the accounts.
