Summary of the main achievements of the charity, identifying the difference the charity's work has made to the circumstances of its beneficiaries and any wider benefits to society as a whole.	Para 1.20	<p>During 2021 / 2022 our facility operation returned to pre-Covid levels. The number of families using both the Breakfast Club and After School club increased over the course of the year. We have been operating at full capacity on some days but are able to continue to offer Ad-hoc childcare for Breakfast Club and most After School days when bookings are not full.</p> <p>Childcare provision at Primary schools is now an imperative, as the population on our surrounding area is increasingly comprised of two working parents who commute, and who wouldn't be able to maintain a stable household without easily-accessible childcare.</p> <p>Our plan for 2023 /24 is to continue the current room use and staff levels, but if demand grows we will explore the possibility of expanding to another room in the school building and employing more staff so that we can accept more children. We hope to continue to offer additional clubs in the holiday periods.</p>

We hold these funds to ensure that we can continue to provide childcare at affordable rates.</p> <p>The reserve is set to cover the possibility of having to move the club to alternative premises.</p> <p>A section of the reserve is held for potential staff turnover that could incur recruitment costs and resulting potential increase in salary payments for key roles.</p>





