### **Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 October 2024**

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 October 2024. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

##### **Objectives and aims**

The objectives of the CIO are to advance education and to promote the arts and culture for the public benefit in Bradford, West Yorkshire and the surrounding areas by promoting and providing opportunities (through events and activities) for the appreciation, understanding and enjoyment of the arts of literature, language and the spoken word.

##### **Public benefit**

The CIO is focused on the development of literacy education and access to the arts and culture, with particular focus on the most socio-economically disadvantaged members of society. The public benefit of literacy education and access to the arts and culture is well-evidenced, incorporating both direct and inter-generational activities, increasing educational achievement, increasing levels of aspiration and social mobility, mental well-being and increasing civic engagement.

The trustees have complied with their duty under the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to public benefit guidance published by the Charity Commission for England and Wales.

#### **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

##### **Financial position**

There was minimal activity by the charity in 2024. The CIO received £117k in donations that was spent on artistic and marketing costs for the Bradford Literature Festival.

The Trustees will review how best the charity can fulfil its objectives through developing future funding relationships who share our ambitions to transform people's lives through access to literature and associated arts and culture.

##### **Reserves policy**

The Reserves Policy, set by trustees, is that the unrestricted funds not committed or invested in tangible fixed assets held by the charity should be 3 months of annual expenditure. We will work over a 3-5 year period to establish such reserves to reach this target and will review the reserves policy and target figure on a regular basis.

##### **Risk Management**

A risk register has been established and is updated at least annually. Where appropriate, systems or procedures have been established to mitigate the risk that the charity faces, whether internally and externally.

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

##### **Organisational Structure**

As a foundation model CIO, the charity's only members are its trustees. All decisions are therefore made by the board of trustees, though certain classes of decision (such as changes to its constitution) have to be made by those individuals acting as members rather than as trustees.

There must be at least three Trustees. If the number falls below this minimum, the remaining Trustee or Trustees may act only to call a meeting of the Trustees or appoint a new Trustee. There is no maximum number of Trustees that may be appointed to the CIO. With the resignation of a trustee at the end of the year, the duty of the remaining two is to recruit at least other trustee before further business can be enacted.

This financial year has marked a major step forward for the CIO, after two years in which the pandemic put our development plans on hold.

Reflecting our shared principles and objectives, in 2022 the CIO was awarded significant funding by Free Word, a registered charity and international centre for literature, literacy and free expression, which had taken the decision to wind down and transfer its assets to a legacy body.

Our aim going forward is to develop relationships with a wider range of funders, including grant-making organisations, trusts and foundations and private benefactors who share our ambitions to transform people's lives through access to literature and associated arts and culture.

##### **Reserves policy**

2021-22 has been our first substantive year of activity, restricting the charity's ability to build reserves. This is something we will be gradually addressing. The Reserves Policy set by trustees is that the unrestricted funds not committed or invested in tangible fixed assets held by the charity should be 3 months of annual expenditure. We will work over a 3-5 year period to establish reserves to reach this target and will review the reserves policy and target figure on a regular basis.

#### **RISK MANAGEMENT**

A risk register has been established and is updated at least annually. Where appropriate, systems or procedures have been established to mitigate the risk that the charity faces, whether internally and externally.

#### **2021-22 ANNUAL ACTIVITY REPORT**

Through Free Word's generous gift, we were able to play a key role in supporting this year's Bradford Literature Festival, which took place 24 June - 3 July 2022, returning to a live and in-person format after 2 years of pandemic/lockdowns.

The main focus of our activity was to support the Festival's early years (0-5years) and schools education programmes (Key Stages 1-3) and the Literature Unlocked fun days for children, young people and their families in Bradford's city park - which including performances by the outstanding children's theatre company, Wrongsemble. In total 177 events involving 120 artists/speakers engaged 17,085 children and young people in fun, creative and curriculum-based learning

opportunities, featuring global majority and culturally diverse children's authors and offering a wide range of participatory activity from storytelling and poetry readings to craft workshops. The Education Programme was open to all schools, PRUs, home educators, children's centres and clubs and free to schools within the Bradford District and available to students from Early Years to Sixth Form. 23 institutions (12 primaries, 6 secondaries, and 4 Muslim/Sikh supplementary school) participated. Whether uncovering the mysteries of Ancient Egypt to helping to celebrate the unsung heroes in our community - the programme was specifically chosen to help broaden and inspire young minds.

The importance of literature to people's lives was demonstrated by the 56,338 Festival visitors who attended over 10 days. With 48% of audience from global majority/ethnic minority backgrounds, of whom 53% local, 24% regional, 22% national and 1% international, the Festival is the most diverse and inclusive of its kind in the UK and we are pleased to have been part of its important work in widening access to the arts.

#### **FUTURE PLANS**

Our aim is to deliver outstanding projects which widen access to and appreciation of world-class literature and which use literacy and cultural education as catalysts for social change, disseminating best-practice. Our plans are to work with Culture Squared CIC as a partner in the delivery of Bradford Literature Festival, helping to celebrate its 10 year anniversary in 2024, developing and delivering longer-term community engagement, education and other special projects which meet our charitable objectives. There are exciting years in prospect - with considerable opportunities for partnership working both in the run up to and delivery of Bradford 2025 (UK City Of Culture) and longer term, supporting the implementation of Bradford's, West Yorkshire's and Arts Council England's cultural strategies for the benefit of people and communities.

#### **STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT**

##### **Governing document**

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

##### **Organisational structure**

As a foundation model CIO, the charity's only members are its trustees. All decisions are therefore made by the board of trustees, though certain classes of decision (such as changes to its constitution) have to be made by those individuals acting as members rather than as trustees.

There must be at least three Trustees. If the number falls below this minimum, the remaining Trustee or Trustees may act only to call a meeting of the Trustees, or appoint a new Trustee. There is no maximum number of Trustees that may be appointed to the CIO.



### **REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2020**

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 October 2020. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

##### **Objectives and aims**

The objectives of the CIO are to advance education and to promote the arts and culture for the public benefit in Bradford, West Yorkshire and the surrounding areas by promoting and providing opportunities (through events and activities) for the appreciation, understanding and enjoyment of the arts of literature, language and the spoken word.

##### **Public benefit**

The CIO is focussed on the development of literacy education and access to the arts and culture, with particular focus on the most socioeconomically disadvantaged members of society. The public benefit of literacy education and access to the arts and culture is well-evidenced, incorporating both direct and inter-generational activities, increasing educational achievement, increasing levels of aspiration and social mobility, mental well-being and increasing civic engagement.

#### **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

##### **Going concern**

The CIO is continuing to develop relationships with potential funders, including grant-making organisations, trusts and foundations and private benefactors with the aim of growing a refreshed strategy and corresponding activity model (see 'Future Developments' below).

#### **FUTURE PLANS**

The future plans for the CIO are to expand the scope and remit of activity, to incorporate national dissemination of best-practice in programmes of intervention which use arts, culture and literacy as catalysts for social change. The organisation intends to pilot these interventions in Bradford and will continue to focus significant resources on the district.

#### **STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT**

##### **Governing document**

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

##### **Organisational structure**

As a foundation model CIO, the charity's only members are its trustees. All decisions are therefore made by the board of trustees, though certain classes of decision have to be made by those individuals acting as members rather than as trustees.



**1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of preparing the financial statements**

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

**Income**

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

**Expenditure**

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

**Taxation**

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

**Fund accounting**

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
