Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

During this reporting period, Den-Tech continued to deliver vital restorative dental services to individuals who are unable to access care through conventional routes. Working collaboratively with volunteer dental laboratories, clinical dental technicians and partner dental clinics, we provided high-quality restorative dental appliances to **survivors of domestic abuse** and **military veterans facing hardship**. Our focus remains firmly on delivering *quality of care over volume*, ensuring that every patient receives a comprehensive, dignified and fully restorative service tailored to their needs.

In addition to our UK-based work, Den-Tech undertook significant international charitable activity. In **June 2024**, a multidisciplinary team of UK-based volunteer dentists, dental nurses and dental technicians travelled to Uganda. Their mission was twofold:

1. **To train and mentor local Ugandan dentists, nurses and technicians**, helping to build sustainable skills and long-term capability; and
2. **To deliver direct patient care** in partnership with local healthcare providers.

As part of this mission, Den-Tech supported outreach activities at **Rakai Hospital in the Kyotera District of Uganda**, where the team provided treatment to **over 120 patients** and supplied **133 dentures free of charge** to members of the local community who otherwise could not have afforded such care.

To ensure the ongoing sustainability of restorative services in the region, Den-Tech also supplied enough dental laboratory equipment to enable the establishment of a **basic denture service** operated locally. This investment allows the community to continue receiving essential dental appliances long after the volunteer team returned to the UK.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

This year has seen Den-Tech continue to grow and develop it's UK based support for Domestic Abuse Survivors and Struggling Veterans.

This is through a mix of assisting those referred to us find appropriate local services already in place to help them, and for those that have no appropriate service locally, or have other barriers in place which prevent them from accessing these services, we then put our 'It's More Than A Smile' (IMTAS) system into place to find the service user a suitable dentist/CDT and lab to get them assessed, treated and restored.

We continue to work on developing the IMTAS system to make it as user friendly as possible.

We have completely overhauled our website to bring it up to date and make it more of a useful resource for our website visitors.

We have taken in donations of dental equipment from generous members of the dental community. Some of this equipment will be shipped abroad to continue to allow us to set up and donate dental laboratory services in Uganda. Any equipment not suitable or fit for this purpose will be sold to generate income which will support the work and running of the charity and it's projects.

This year we were once again able to offer any face to face services within our dental practice environments through our service providers and we still continue to support our UK charities through offering a send away lab service via our volunteer laboratories.

We have continued to raise awareness of our existence and the services that we are willing & able to offer through social media channels to the dental profession and homeless groups.

Our main achievements in this year were:

In October we headed out to Uganda with a small team and were able to set up an onsite dental laboratory and support the provision of general dental services within the Destiny Medical Centre in the Wakiso District of Uganda. This was achieved through the use of dental equipment donated by dental laboratories around the UK.

During our time in Uganda we also assisted in the running of dental outreach activities, treating 117 patients over 2 days, including providing 6 same day dentures.
