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Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Our premises are far from ideal and much effort was spent seeking better accommodation. The relatively few regular members have many overseas relatives often living in poor circumstances; and CVPM provided a great deal of consultation and prayers for them thereby giving much relief to the members.

One of our members who had suffered mental problems for several years experienced a great improvement and she told her surprised doctors that this was due to CVPM counselling and prayers; she was taken off medication.

Improvements on the welfare of church members, one member was sick for a long time but after prayers she recovered and she is doing well and attending church.

Another member who had had challenges returning to University, was helped, supported and encouraged to return to University. She has also got a good job with the full support of the church.

We have other countries such as Canada. We have helped a family to settle down with their children after going through a lot of challenges including imprisonment.

We have financially supported Families from Jamaica and their extended families in Jamaica.

We have helped a gentleman who was in hospital for some time until his deportation was cancelled. We are still supporting him in his new accommodation.

During the COVID 19 time, we counselled and prayed for people who lost their relatives, and those who were going through hard times during the lockdown. We are still helping individuals to recover from the effects of mental health as a result of the lockdown.

We have spent the year visiting, counselling, and praying with families in different way including face to face, zoom meetings and on the telephone.

We have helped by providing food and money for transport to people in need.

We have also helped families to fund their immigration issues including making payments towards the application for the children visas.


