During the year, three of the existing trustees resigned for personal reasons leaving a total of eight.

An Annual General Meeting was not held during the year because of the Covid pandemic restrictions. Existing trustees continue in post until such time a public meeting is possible.

The objects of the CIO are to establish and run a village hall and to promote for the benefit of the inhabitants of the Parish of Wicken, Upware and Padney without distinction of sex, sexual orientation, age, disability, nationality, race or political, religious or other opinions the provision of facilities for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals who have the need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disablement, financial hardship or social and economic circumstances or for the public at large in the interests of social welfare and with the object of improving the conditions of life of the said inhabitants.

This was a very difficult year for the Charity because of the Covid pandemic. The Hall was closed for the greater part of the period and we were therefore unable to run any fund-raising functions or let the hall for other activities.

There was a short period when some regular activities such as ballet classes and Pilates classes could be run under Covid secure arrangements but our income from hall letting was drastically reduced.

Fortunately, two government grants totalling £13370 helped to meet the daily running costs.

The hall has been maintained in excellent condition and is ready for use when this is possible once again. Throughout the period the trustees have had due regard to the commission's public benefit guidance when exercising any powers or duties to which the guidance is relevant.
