WINGS Activities in the last financial year for the Charity Commission Report

WINGS purpose is to help grow others in their faith and facilitate activities that expand the Kingdom of God.

Early in the year WINGS held a Christchurch event that attracted nearly 120 people and a leaders' meeting in Hunmanby which was attended by 45 people.

God is strategically placing people in the Whitby area. Rob and Jo have an area of 50 square miles that they cover and there are several new Christian leaders who want charismatic worship and are keen to get involved.

Steve is now connecting into the Guisborough Deanery and WINGS has connections in Alnwick (Bob and Mary) bridging Middlesborough to Alnwick. Berwick on Tweed is also now opening up.

In May, Steve started two WINGS projects. Every 2nd Sunday he runs a group called Disciples which helps people embrace what it means to be a disciple. Every 4th Sunday he takes a team out which involves activities such as prayer walking, healing on the streets, café bible study.

WINGS held an Awakening the Coastlands at Pentecost and a further one on the 16th June at St Stephens.

WINGS has a vision to help people pray and fast and focus on God on a regular basis. Joining the Dots meetings are run to encourage people to participate in this and each day of the month is covered in prayer and fasting. Rob held a Joining the Dots meeting at Beverley for the East Riding of Yorkshire on the 21st of June, and there was a follow up Joining the Dots meeting at Hunmanby for the Scarborough/Filey/Bridlington area on the 13th July.

Rob has bi-monthly meetings on zoom on Monday evening with German prayer leaders and they gathered in person in Coventry in September this year.

There have been 'Prayer For' events held in Hornsea and Withernsea in May. There was a Celtic prayer meeting at St Hilda's in Whitby in June and there are now monthly Celtic prayer meetings in St Stephens church, Robinhood Bay.

The Year Ahead.

WINGS is planning further 'Prayer For' events including one in Bridlington, possibly in the Priory. Rob also plans to start a regular WINGS zoom prayer meeting.

WINGS aims to have a Women's Day as well as some more Celtic events, including a Celtic Awakening event.

We are also hoping to arrange a Joining the Dots meeting in Whitby/ Robinhood's Bay area and hopefully in the Cleveland area.

Rob feels God is looking to a more reflective and monastic form of worship. It is important that we respond to change that God is bringing about.

Key to all our plans is Rob's health. He is currently struggling to sing and is due to see an ENT surgeon in the next few weeks. He is bringing out a new album next year.

WINGS Achievements for 2023:

WINGS held a Leaders and Supporters Meeting at Wydale Hall on March 30th after 10yrs activity to reflect where WINGS is heading.

WINGS held a Filey Prayer Meeting in March with over 200 people attending, the majority of whom were from rural churches including Filey, Seamer, Hunmanby and Middleton on the Wolds.

Regular prayer meetings have started between pastors in Scarborough and now Filey.

Rob and Jo have moved to Robin Hood's Bay, Andy Hall has moved to Bridlington and Steve Weatherill has moved to the East Coast, hoping to live in the Saltburn area.

WINGS held the Awakening the Coastlands at Christchurch on 28th May 2023.

Jo Parker and Andy Hall joined WINGS as consultants this year

A 'Join the Dots' event was held in Scarborough on the 24th of June 2023, which was attended by 100 people – we now have a community of people who are praying and fasting 1 day a month, covering the whole month in prayer. There are plans to recruit another 4 people per day, so that every day is always covered. WINGS held a 'Re-engage' meeting at Christchurch on 11th Nov to encourage those doing the prayer and fasting.

A further 'Awakening the Coastlands' gathering was held on 26th November, also at Christchurch.

Rob is involved in a bi-monthly meeting on zoom on Monday evening with German prayer leaders and they plan a gathering in person in September in Coventry.

WINGS continues to work with rural churches within the area.

Plans for 2024:

Rob is working to enable a similar prayer event to Filey's in both Hornsea and Whitby.

WINGS hopes to start more 'Awakening' meetings. These will have worship, teaching and ministry to attract people that go to more traditional services. The hope is to have a meeting with space to draw close to the Holy Spirit, drawing together a community from different churches which will then lead the meetings themselves. Eventually they can be drawn into a Join the Dots event or a conference with the aim of gathering and connecting people.

Rob has already met with the missional community of the Whitby area who are interested in an Awakening Service which could be held in St Hilda's.

Rob also mentioned the Potash mining communities which are starting to grow in Robin Hood's Bay. These are open to the gospel.

Rob is also working with John Beynon (pastor in Beverley) for a similar 'Join the Dots' meeting in Beverley/Hull.

Rob will continue to meet bi-monthly on zoom on Monday evening with German prayer leaders and they plan a gathering in person in September in Coventry.

WINGS will continue to work with rural churches within the area with plans to take teams into churches to do Holy Spirit days.

WINGS Trustees Report 1st January-31st December 2022

WINGS began following a gathering in 2010 at Bawtry Hall aimed at increasing time spent seeking God. This led to conferences at Bridlington Spa and the Lion's Roar Meeting, with people gathered from different parts of the UK to seek the Lord. As this grew it needed a covering structure to develop the ministry and WINGS (worship and intercession for the nations to bring good in the Spirit of Jesus) was born.

During the calendar year of 2022 Chris Lyle stepped down as a trustee in September and Gina Middleton joined the board in November.

In November 2021 WINGS became a CIO and applied for a new bank account with Barclays, which is still outstanding by the end of this year. Financially our situation has changed little.

This year WINGS has focused on the coastlands, with various prophetic meetings, including the Hear and Encounter/ Awakening the Coastlands meetings, because we believe that the Lord has His Hand on the coastlands. Rob has met with the leaders around Scarborough area and is planning a coastal event based in Scarborough with Jonathan Oloyede leading.

WINGS has focused on the East Coast and has set up prayer meetings initially in Eastfields and Bridlington and then expanding to Filey and Hunmanby. The aim is to extend them along the East Coast.

WINGS has also initiated Spirit of the Coastlands, which aims to facilitate places to access the Spirit of God (Holy Spirit Renewal days). It is focused on people where the services locally are very traditional and there is little opportunity to encounter the presence of God.

WINGS has run 3 conferences with opportunity for leadership growth and development as well as open sessions with worship and workshops.

For the next year, we plan to continue focusing on the East Coast aiming to develop monthly coastland meetings and gathering leaders together as well as Holy Spirit Renewal days in rural churches. WINGS also plans a prayer event in March 2023 to celebrate what God had done in the 200 years since John Knox was in Filey.

Wings Prayer House is a registered charity and company limited by guarantee governed by its memorandum and articles of association adopted on the 4th February 2014.

Every member of the charity undertakes to contribute the maximum of £10 in the event of the charity winding up.

Recruitment and appointment Trustees

The Trustees are appointed by the Board of Trustees and election by an informal membership at the AGM. No less than 14 days up to maximum of 35 days before the date of the AGM, the charity gives notice of the intention to propose the appointment of a person as a Trustee. Voting rights are given to organisations and individuals.

The articles of association states that the number of trustees must not be less than three but not subject to any maximum.

Organisational structure:

The board of trustees manages the charity, and aims to consider only strategic decisions at its meetings. Trustees are aware that any conflicts of interest are declared and minuted. Decisions are referred to the full board for approval or determination at quarterly meetings. Ad-hoc committees are set up when need arises.

Risk Management:

The major risk to which the charity is exposed, as identified by the trustees with support of The East Riding of Yorkshire Council, have been reviewed and systems have been established to mitigate those risks. Financial targets are reviewed on a regular basis with remedial action being taken immediately. External grant funding is sought in order to deliver additional projects and also contribute to the sustainability of the organisation.

Objective and Activities

As set out in the Memorandum of Articles, the Charity's objectives are:

- a) To promote the Christian faith.

The Trustees have given regard to the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit.

For the year ended 31 December 2020****1. Accounting policies****1.1. Accounting convention**

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (effective 1st January 2019) – (Charities SORP (FRS102)), the financial reporting standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) and the Companies Act 2006.

Wings Prayer House meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy note(s).

1.2. Company Status

The charity is a company limited by guarantee. The members of the company are the directors named on page 3.

1.3. Going Concern

The Trustees consider the Charity to be a going concern. The accounts have been prepared on this basis.

1.4. Income

Income is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the item(s) of income have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Income from government and other grants, whether 'capital' grants or 'revenue' grants, are recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the grants have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably and is not deferred.

1.5. Fund accounting

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors. Restricted funds are accounted for separately to each other and to the core funding of the Company.

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in the furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

1.6. Expenditure and irrecoverable VAT

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to make a payment to a third party, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is classified under the following activity headings:

- Expenditure on charitable activities includes the costs of all activities undertaken to further the purposes of the charity and their associated support costs.

The Charity is not VAT registered and irrecoverable VAT is charged as a cost against the activity for which the expenditure was incurred.

1.7. Allocation of support costs

Support costs are those functions that assist the work of the charity but do not directly undertake charitable activities. Support costs include back office costs, finance, personnel, payroll and governance costs which support the Charities activities.

All activities undertaken by the Charity are in furtherance of the charitable objects therefore all support costs have been allocated to charitable activities. A full breakdown of all costs related to Charitable Activities has been provided in Note 6.

1.8. Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life (except as detailed below) as follows:

Office Equipment	25% on the straight line basis

1.9. Operating leases

Rentals applicable to operating leases are charged to the SOFA over the period in which the cost is incurred.

1.10. Debtors

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount due after any trade discount offered. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid net of any trade discounts due.

1.11. Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and cash in hand includes cash and short term highly liquid investments with a short maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition or opening of the deposit or similar account.

1.12. Creditors and provisions

Creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors and provisions are normally recognised at their settlement amount after allowing for any trade discounts due.

2. Income and Expenditure Account

The Company is a charity and so achievements cannot be measured by normal commercial criteria. Accordingly, the Directors consider that it would be inappropriate to present a Profit and Loss Account in one of the formats set out by the Companies Act 2016. Therefore, as permitted by the Companies Act, in order to reflect the special nature of the company's activities, the Directors are of the opinion that it would be more appropriate to present an Income and Expenditure Account.
