The focus is on work for the children and youth in two deprived areas of Sutton Coldfield and Walsall Wood. Many of these children and youth come from homes where there are problems such as substance abuse, physical abuse, culture of dependence on state benefits.

We are involved with a wide range of young people in our work through the different programmes that we run. Below is an overview of the different projects we are running.

Youth Group - The object of this work is getting to know the young people and building relationships with them. With this type of work the focus can vary from the mundane to the deeply significant. We aim to be good role models and to encourage them in the issues of life. For us it acts as a contact point so that we can move them into one of the other groups that has a more structured direction.

Deeper - This works to engage with teenagers and run a structured programme of work for them to get involved in. The degree of interest varies from person to person, but a prerequisite of being part of this group is that they listen and get involved. When an individual shows interest and commitment to this group we try to 'grow' them into the young leaders group.

Young Leaders - This group is set up for those who have shown an active interest in developing and growing as people. The aim is to give young people the tools to be the leaders of society by teaching them various lessons and giving them opportunities to serve within the local community. This takes the form of serving within specific church run activities or community-based activities such as gardening/labouring and helping to run community days.

The trustees confirm that they have paid due regard to the Commission's guidance on public benefit.

The work of the church continues in the two areas we cover – Sutton Coldfield and Walsall Wood.

We are very encouraged by our youth group; they are progressing well with their studies within the church and have led several Sunday Services, and have preached. We held an event at Walsall Wood where young people from other churches joined in, and along with our young people, enjoyed a time of praise and worship followed by games. The event was such a success it is to be repeated on a regular basis.

We have had business meetings and joint services with other churches in the East Sutton Churches Together (ESCT), developing our relationships and community work.

Again, we held our Christmas Event with other churches in ESCT and local community groups, working together to provide a special evening for the needy families and children on Falcon Lodge (an economically deprived area), which included Father Christmas giving out free gifts to the children.

We are still working in the two areas of Sutton Coldfield and Walsall Wood.

We have been very encouraged by the young people of the church wanting to organise a Celebration Evening for the youth from the local churches and also reaching out to the young people in the community. We are now engaging with a new youth worker with the intention of making further inroads into the local community.

Over the last year we have deepened our relationship with the local churches in the East Sutton Churches Together having joint business meetings as well as zoom prayer meetings. This is to further our churches working together in the community.

A very successful Christmas Event was held with the local churches working alongside other community groups, over 350 people attended the event and 150 needy children receiving a gift from Father Christmas.

At Walsall Wood we are endeavouring to restart the youth club with the help of the youth worker and local volunteers who have expressed interest.





**Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year**

Due to the effects of Covid our work with the young people has been somewhat reduced. Although our goals still remain the same we are endeavouring to rebuild the work in the two deprived areas in Sutton Coldfield and Walsall Wood where the problems are still the same i.e. broken families, substance abuse etc.

In rebuilding we are now working with other groups in the two areas to reach children, young people and adults. This helps us all to strengthen the areas where we are weak using shared resources.

We now have a group of young people who show potential to become leaders both in the church and in society.

Youth Group - The object of this work is getting to know the young people and building relationships with them. With this type of work the focus can vary from the mundane to the deeply significant. We aim to be good role models and to encourage them in the issues of life. For us it acts as a contact point so that we can move them into one of the other groups that has a more structured direction.

Deeper - This works to engage with teenagers and run a structured programme of work for them to get involved in. The degree of interest varies from person to person, but a prerequisite of being part of this group is that they listen and get involved. When an individual shows interest and commitment to this group we try to 'grow' them into the young leaders group.

Young Leaders - This group is set up for those who have shown an active interest in developing and growing as people. The aim is to give young people the tools to be the leaders of society by teaching them various lessons and giving them opportunities to serve within the local community. This takes the form of serving within specific church run activities or community-based activities such as gardening/labouring and helping to run community days.

Schools Work - This takes the form predominantly of assemblies, clubs and mentoring individuals. Our goal is to reach every young person in Sutton Coldfield.

We are encouraging the young people to take part in our church services, which they are enjoying doing.

Our youth work is proving successful with the meetings each week on zoom. With two new qualified youth workers on-board they are bringing a new dimension to the teaching. We plan to meet regularly for social events and day trips out.

The work continues with the Churches Together in the East Sutton area, with a monthly prayer meeting, a newly formed Ministers' Meeting where they can pray for the area and fellowship together. Plans were also made for a joint Easter Passion Play in the area.

In conjunction with the Chosen Veterans Support Group the church raised funds for medical supplies, toiletries, clothing, baby products, food etc. for the relief effort in the Ukraine. Two of the Veterans drove a van over to the Ukraine border to deliver the much-needed supplies.

We feel that despite some restrictions the church has had a very successful and eventful year.



Our church service and prayer meetings are now on Zoom and we are reaching people who do not attend any church. Being on Zoom keeps us in touch with our congregation and enables us to ensure that any requirements are met and people do not feel totally alone at this time.

Although we have no Sunday School meetings the young people each played a role in our Zoom church nativity, which we all enjoyed.

We no longer have a youth worker employed by the church, so reaching out to the young people under the pandemic restrictions has been difficult. Similarly, we have not been able to hold our youth meetings, coffee mornings, services etc at the Well because of Covid restrictions.

Our Christmas Event had to be cancelled this year also.

We have continued to encourage other churches in the East Sutton Churches Together and are now holding a Churches Together prayer meeting monthly, which is proving to be a great success.

We continue to support the Chosen Veterans Support Group and veterans have been reached wherever there has been a need, either with food parcels or with PTSD help.

The pandemic has given us time to reflect on new projects and how we can strengthen existing projects. These we are eager to implement when restrictions are lifted.
