It is a forum whereby women who attend can feel safe to share their personal experiences and are able to build their awareness on various topics such as - mental and physical health, well being, mindfulness amongst others. The venue was in Harrow which gave the women a reason to come out and socialise with others, especially for elderly ladies and those living on their own for various reasons e.g. widowed, live alone etc. The difference these monthly sessions have made to the women who attend has been apparent right from the beginning. People have made new friends, they learn about how to take better care of their own mental and physical health, it gives them an opportunity to express themselves and the women have often expressed how appreciative they are that we started these sessions. They look forward to the next session and they sometimes bring in new friends and share about it which shows they see the value and want others to benefit too. There are wider benefits to society because we inform them about certain health conditions and bring in health experts, nutritionist, psychologist so that they can receive tailored community level awareness and in their mother tongue. It definitely eases pressure of health facilities when we provide preventative information. The women have also mentioned they feel happier and in turn benefits their families, friends and social circles as their own wellbeing improves they will improve that of others too.

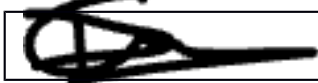

Para 1.20	The global pandemic meant that this financial period our charity couldn't be as active as we had hoped. Government restrictions meant all our projects and events planned had to be put on hold. Many of the beneficiaries who we work with are elderly Nepalese individuals, many of them living on their own. Covid-19 pandemic created this environment that added to their social isolation and loneliness. We have established that language is a key barrier for most of these individuals in their daily life. With changing guidelines, constant barrage of news in the media and new information, it caused confusion, uncertainty, and fear for many of us but it was even worse for isolated seniors who didn't speak English. Each AFNO team member had list of 3 or 4 elderly individuals and were responsible for providing regular welfare calls to our beneficiaries during the national lockdown. These welfare calls were to query after their health, provide them with information regarding any new guidelines, and support with anything else they needed. AFNO also organised one hour yoga sessions every Sunday, tailored specifically for seniors. This was done remotely. Regular exercise is beneficial for both mental and physical health. During covid-19 lockdown restrictions, this was one way to reach some of the isolated elderly individuals and involve them in some sort of physical activity that could be done at home.

Achievements against objectives set	Para 1.41	AFNO aims to promote health and wellbeing of the elderly among the Nepalese community. Due to the Covid-19 restrictions, many elderly individuals were even more isolated. AFNO arranged for welfare calls to provide any support if needed, provide information, or just social chat. AFNO also started weekly yoga sessions tailored for seniors remotely via Viber. During lockdown restrictions this provided a way to encourage physical activity in the comfort of their homes. This also provided a social connection for these individuals and many looked forward to the yoga sessions every week.
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		AFNO keeps an open phone helpline for any of our beneficiaries to contact us with any request of help and support. We continue to assist individuals in one-on-one support that could range anywhere from interpreting letters, to questions regarding medical appointments, benefits queries or housing support etc.

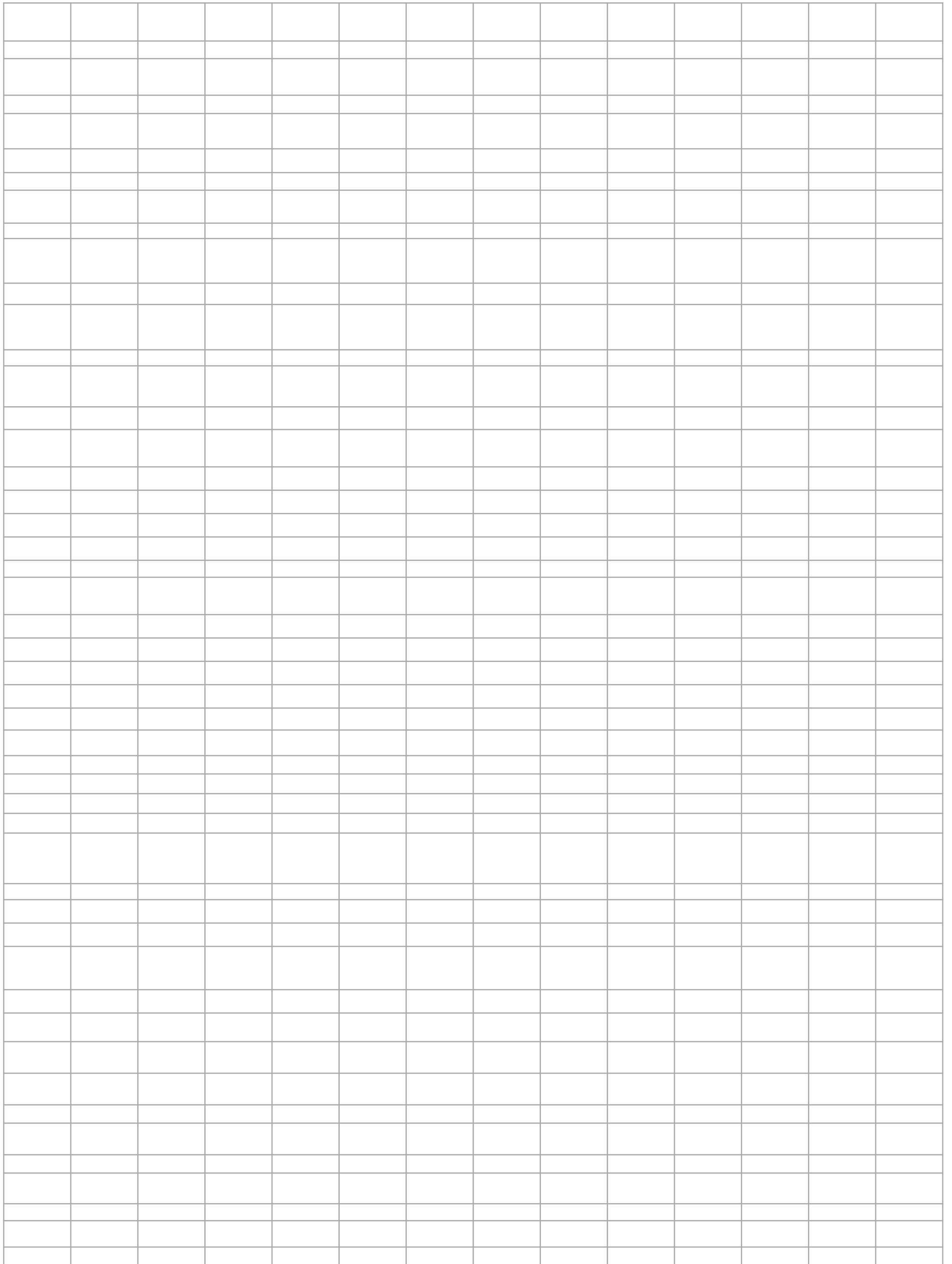
