An amount of £6,287.50 (2024: £6500) was paid to Daniel Budhi, husband of Louise Budhi, a trustee of the CIO for services provided to the CIO in relation to youth sessions, and management provided. This was allowed under the constitution of the CIO under Section 6 (2b).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The objects of the CIO are:

- To advance the Christian faith for the benefit of young people in accordance with the statement of faith appearing in appendix 1 throughout the world and in particular (but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing) in Doncaster and its environs;
- the advancement of the Christian faith mainly, but not exclusively by means of proclaiming Christian messages of an evangelistic and teaching nature throughout the

world and in particular (but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing) in Doncaster and its environs;

- to demonstrate, promote and encourage Christian values, including Dignity, Empowerment and Partnership to all young people throughout Doncaster and its environs;
- the advancement of the education of children and young people through support and mentoring in schools, colleges and other educational establishments, through lunchtime and after school clubs, street based youth work and other youth provision to develop their physical, mental and spiritual capacities, that they may grow to full maturity as individuals, and that their condition of life may be improved;
- to relieve poverty and sickness thereby demonstrating the Christian faith by promoting overseas service, education, practical action and working with those affected, either directly or through relevant relief agencies.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Since no longer having yearly interns in 2024, and becoming a more equipping and resourcing ministry rather than a direct on the ground ministry organisation, we have really resourced the church this year.

In this period alone, we have had 4 mission teams from Florida, Michigan, Texas and Northern Ireland running week long missions. A total of 57 people coming from other parts of the world to serve here and be a part of outreach to young people, children and families. These weeks consist of running schools programs, and outreach events in evenings in local churches.

In total throughout these weeks, we have engaged with hundreds of people who wouldn't usually come to church, in 1-1 conversations, in our programs, or fun events. What has been great to see is seeing young people who come to church here being inspired by the faith of people their own age from other countries. The goal of these weeks is also to strengthen the churches they are a part of when they come here.

Alongside these teams who come for only a week at a time, we have also developed a long-term partnership with Greater Europe Mission (GEM). This year, GEM sent us 3 young adults for 2 months in June and July to help us do outreach in our local community. Each week they ran sports camps and rap sessions in 6 different schools, inviting young people to local youth groups. In total they saw over 70 young people cross-over into local church youth groups. Alongside their work, they worked with the church to disciple 1-1 young people. At the end of their time with us, they baptised 2 young people, with more having made decisions to follow Jesus too.

We continue to resource churches with teams, and develop our partnership with churches and organisations based in the USA. As our partnerships grow, we will not only be able to continue providing people resource to churches, but we will be able to expand our capabilities.

Our football arena, speakers, lighting equipment etc still continues to be well used by churches.

PUBLIC BENEFIT

Our main aim is to provide religious activities in communities, especially where religious activities are inaccessible to children and young people. Religious activities have included running a weekly youth group in 6 different locations; resourcing churches with our football arena; planning and providing events; mentoring young people 1-1 and in small groups and taking young people on trips.

We are also now working with young adults in training, to further the work of the local churches to young people.

Alongside our main aims, we have supported other churches and christian charities in their outreach to young people. Much of the work we have provided for them, they would have been unable to provide themselves.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

In the year we received £29,282 and we had expenditure of £36,518 leaving us with a total loss of £7237. Our end of year balance (£2463) means that we will need to cut our main outgoings and increase our income. This was a larger year in terms of teams, and we did need to provide more resources. Now we have those resources, we will be in a better financial position in the coming year. We still want to expand the great work we are doing so we see bridging this gap as a priority. We are thankful for all the church and individual support we receive to continue our vital work with young people.

The charity does not currently have a policy on reserves.

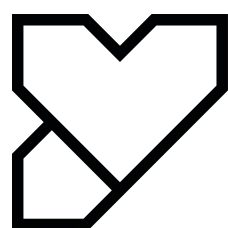

- to relieve poverty and sickness thereby demonstrating the Christian faith by promoting overseas service, education, practical action and working with those affected, either directly or through relevant relief agencies.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

In the 2023/24 period, we continued to partner with churches do outreach in communities, and mentor young people. Our interns continued to partner with 7 different churches across 6 locations. We continued to run both outreach and discipleship groups and continued in 1-1 mentoring. Throughout the year with our various partnerships we were seeing around 150 children and young people every week.

Throughout the year we've been able to take young people on trips and give them regular opportunity to hear about life and faith in Jesus and build other friendships with other young people from other youth groups.

Our football arena has continued to be a hit and has been hired out by churches on numerous occasions. It's great to see an accessible resource being used by churches as they seek to connect and reach people within their community. We have increased our resources alongside the football arena this year with axe throwing and an American Football target too so we can offer a whole range of activities when running events.

In June we welcomed 'The Church at the Cross' from Florida, USA for a missions week. Across the week we went into 8 primary schools and 2 secondary schools, and hosted numerous events on the evenings. This included a family outreach in Hexthorpe seeing well over 100 people; children outreach programmes, worship events and a youth outreach event. This week was a catalyst for a number of people being connected in with the groups that churches run on a weekly basis. We look forward to working with the Church at the Cross again in future years.

As part of our growing links with USA, we are expecting to host 2 teams in 2024/25. We are also looking at welcoming some summer interns for a couple of months too.

Due to having no interns from September 23, we made a decision to move more into equipping resourcing local ministries in order to have a more multiplying effect. This lead us on the exciting initiative of creating our own Doncaster Youth for Christ training app to train local youth workers in all aspects of youth ministry. This was a busy time of putting the app together, creating content but also linking with other national youth work organisations to input into the app too. This initiative has allowed us to widen our network with others, and receive more resource for ministry here in Doncaster.

PUBLIC BENEFIT

Our main aim is to provide religious activities in communities, especially where religious activities are inaccessible to children and young people. Religious activities have included running a weekly youth group in 6 different locations; resourcing churches with our football arena; planning and providing events; mentoring young people 1-1 and in small groups and taking young people on trips. Alongside our main aims, we have supported other churches and christian charities in their outreach to young people. Much of the work we have provided for them, they would have been unable to provide themselves. The launch of our training app will further support youth work across the City, providing accessible training to volunteers and staff.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

In the year we received £11,564 and we had expenditure of £16,637 leaving us with a total loss of £5073. Our end of year balance (£9670) however remains healthy for the amount of work we are able to provide at this time.

At our current income/expenditure we can continue for a number of years in our current capacity, however we still want to expand the great work we are doing so we see bridging this gap as a priority. We are thankful for all the church and individual support we receive to continue our vital work with young people.

The charity does not currently have a policy on reserves.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

In the 2022/23 period, we continued to partner with churches do outreach in communities, and mentor young people. We saw both of our interns leave at the end of July, and were replaced by another 2 interns in September 2022 which allowed us to develop new partnerships and build upon the work we were doing.

Our interns have partnered with 7 different churches in 6 different areas throughout their time with us, providing weekly children's and youth groups; outreach and discipleship opportunities and mentoring programs. Throughout the year with our various partnerships we were seeing around 150 children and young people every week. This is a step up from last year where we were working in 3 different areas on a regular basis with around 60 young people and children each week.

Throughout the year we've been able to take young people on trips and give them regular opportunity to hear about life and faith in Jesus and build other friendships with other young people from other youth groups.

Our football arena has continued to be a hit and has been hired out by churches on numerous occasions. It's great to see an accessible resource being used by churches as they seek to connect and reach people within their community.

One of the key aspects of our ministry is the year out program. By creating a diverse range of opportunity for young adults we are able to train well those who work with us. Our 4 interns throughout this period have benefited greatly from the opportunities they've been given.

PUBLIC BENEFIT

Our main aim is to provide religious activities in communities, especially where religious activities are inaccessible to children and young people. Religious activities have included running a weekly youth group in 6 different locations; resourcing churches with our football arena; planning and providing events; mentoring young people 1-1 and in small groups and taking young people on trips.

Alongside our main aims, we have supported other churches and christian charities in their outreach to young people. Much of the work we have provided for them, they would have been unable to provide themselves.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Throughout the year, the pandemic has played a major role in how we have been able to conduct youth work in Doncaster. Self Isolation measures had for the most part still been in place for those who had Covid-19 symptoms. However, despite some of the set backs, we have been able to develop our work.

One of the first things we were able to do was purchase a new football arena. We made the decision not to buy a van as the football arena would allow us to do the same job but allow for easier transportation. It's easier to store, easier to set up and transport and makes it easier for volunteers and churches to borrow it for ministry opportunities. Throughout the year, the football arena was used in schools and youth groups. It was loaned out to churches for events and became a hit everywhere it went as we sought to develop relationships with young people and churches. Our football cage was donated to Integrate Youth for Christ in Norwich so they can continue to provide detached youth work.

At the end of July 2021, our home grown year out decided to do another year with us. In September 2021 she was joined by another year out who did an internship with us from USA. Their role was to help develop our work with churches in communities, reaching out to young people. They mentored young people, building their confidence and skills for life, and worked in many of our groups, even running one of their own groups of young people with one of the churches we partner with. Having 2 people this year has allowed us to expand our reach across Doncaster and partner with new churches.

This year we partnered with a local church in Hexthorpe from October 2021. This expanded our work to now working also with children. On a Monday evening we run 3 different groups that run from ages 4 all the way up to 19. Those groups are designed to help young people grow spiritually. Our main work now consists in 3 areas of Doncaster on a regular basis working with young people.

This was also the first year since the pandemic that we were able to take young people to Youth Events. We partnered with churches to take young people to various events both in Doncaster and in Sheffield.

PUBLIC BENEFIT

Our main aim to provide religious activities in communities, especially where religious activities are inaccessible to children and young people. Religious activities have included running a weekly youth group in 3 different locations; resourcing churches with our football arena; planning and providing events and taking young people on trips.

We have mentored a number of young people this year, and supported them in small groups.

Alongside our main aims, we have supported other churches and christian charities in their outreach to young people. Much of the work we have provided for them, they would have been unable to provide themselves.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Due to a donation given in year end March 2021, we have been able to continue our activities and expand our work. This has however meant we ran at a small loss. In the year we received £9633.06 and we had expenditure of £13,982.18 leaving us with a total loss of £4249.12. Whilst this could be concerning, this does leave us with a balance of £18343.29 going into the next financial year. At our current income/expenditure we can continue for a number of years, however we still want to expand the great work we are doing. We are thankful for all the church and individual support we receive to continue our vital work with young people.

The charity does not currently have a policy on reserves.

Our third year as a centre started in a national lock down due to the covid-19 pandemic. This quickly meant that we had to change our plans and change the way we work to best support young people at this time.

All of our groups moved online, and weekly we engage with numerous young people, continuing to support them in their faith journey and development. As restrictions eased towards the summer months, we were able to meet in person, however sessions quickly moved back online as the autumn and winter came. Throughout the year we have been able to stand alongside young people and encourage them in their one of their hardest years. We have had numerous messages from parents thanking us for being there, a constant whilst everything else closed down.

We purchased some filming equipment in the year as we moved online, and we were not only able to create our own resources and sessions for young people to engage with, but we were also able to help other churches provide content for both children and young people. This became a large part of our role throughout the year.

In September 2020, we had our first year out placement. Our student stayed the year with us, working with young people in schools and communities. She mentored young people, building their confidence and skills for life, and worked on many of our groups, even running one of her own groups of young people with one of the churches we partner with. Our hope is that we will increase our capacity through 'The year out' programme in the coming years.

Whilst we haven't been able this year to hold any events or have any mission teams over to Doncaster. We have throughout the year worked tirelessly 1-1 and in small groups. We have been able to strengthen our relationships with the churches we work with and the young people we work with.
