The Trustees together with a very supportive management committee were elected by the members at the 2024 AGM and have remained active participants throughout a busy year establishing the new workshop at Anstey Park and refurbishing the original premises in the car park at All Saints Parish Hall, Alton.

The Trustees have recognised that as our membership increases there has been a need to formalise additional policies and procedures in the management of the facilities and administration of the organisation. Workshop managers have been appointed, health & safety procedures improved and mandated, and a Safeguarding Policy established and approved with help from East Hampshire District Council (EHDC). A structured approach has been adopted for the receipt of donations and fund raising activities with a close working relationship between the Fundraising Coordinator and Treasurer. The formal appointment of a Project Assessor has endeavoured to manage the scope of community projects undertaken, the risk assessment and liability aspects of the work carried out, while also responding promptly to enquiries.

From April 2024 the Anstey Park premises were leased from Alton Town Council and shared with a Brazilian Jujitsu Club. The arrangement has proved excellent with our Men's Shed using the building during the day and the sports club in the evening, providing better security and overall use of the facilities. We are fortunate to have a retired architect join our management team enabling us to submit professionally drawn plans to enhance and maintain the building and grounds. These were appreciated and welcomed by Alton Town Council and have been submitted to EHDC for formal approval.

Financially, by arrangement with Alton Town Council, the premises lease has been substantially reduced in return for a commitment to maintain and improve the fabric of the building using available grants to meet updated energy and safety standards. Local companies have generously supported the establishment of the new workshop and considerable quantities of donated tools and equipment have enabled a fully functional workshop to be established in what was an empty three garage space. The All Saints Car Park Shed is being refurbished to provide an exciting new dimension to our activities. A "Technical Hub" encompassing computer controlled 3D printers, routing and laser cutting equipment; much of which has been donated or purchased with funds raised by the sale of upgraded equipment.

The additional space and extended opening hours has enable the membership to increase with nearly fifty paid up members registered at fiscal year end and new enquiries being received each week. Projects have been pursued on behalf of the town and EHDC district councillors and relationships established with the East Hants Armed Forces Veterans Association through which we encourage veterans to join us.

The Alton Men's Shed now holds a well recognised highly valued reputation around the Alton area and is constantly promoting good working relationships with other groups. Attendance at the "Alton Community Exchange Meetings" has built bridges with other community groups including the "Social Prescribers", "Alton Lions", "Community Cupboard", "Food Bank", "Andy's Men's Group" and several other wellbeing focused organizations.

Responsibility for running a growing organisation has identified a need for further management policies which the Trustees aim to address while continuing to ensure the voluntary nature and wellbeing of participants continues to be recognised.

Since last summer we have enjoyed the use of our new Edgar Hall workshop and facilities. Last August we officially opened our shed and welcomed many guests, including Damien Hinds MP who cut a chain with bolt cutters to mark our grand opening. We are grateful to the many local organisations and public bodies who have donated funds and awarded grants to us which we are putting towards the refurbishment of our workshop. We are currently installing a new floor and will soon be taking delivery of a circular saw and dust extractor. We have also been overwhelmed with the public's generosity in donating surplus tools.

Over the last year the improved facilities at Edgar Hall have attracted new members as we approach around forty members in total. We continue to improve the layout of our workshop and now have six workspaces to accommodate members' projects. We continue to attract many enquiries for practical help from local community groups, which reflects the raising of our public profile within Alton. Amongst the many projects we have undertaken are notice boards, furniture repairs, wheelchair ramps, planters and raised beds, as well as many odd jobs for disadvantaged residents. At present we have quite a long job list to construct items for local schools and care homes. As before, we have run our child friendly woodwork activities, particularly with the youngsters at Alton Beavers. Our Christmas reindeer and snowmen were particularly popular.

Alton Men's Shed is much more than a practical group and we have welcomed new members who have joined us particularly for the comradeship and social activities we provide. We continue to hold our well attended monthly coffee mornings and as we now get on top of the workshop practicalities we plan to run more social events. Visits to places of interest include Farnborough Air Services and Basingstoke's Milestones museums and of course our annual barbeque and Christmas lunch. We have just taken delivery of a new gazebo which we will soon be taking out to various fetes and open days to promote our shed. Our members have also been busy making many craft items that we will be selling to raise funds.

It has been a busy and successful year for Alton Men's Shed culminating in us signing a new long term lease with the town council. As we say farewell to Dementia Friendly Alton we welcome Alton Brazilian Jiu Jitsu Club who will join us in sharing Edgar Hall. With our shed now fully established and our future secured, we look forward to serving our local community.

The trustees are pleased to report that it has been a busy and exciting year for Alton Men's Shed. The last year has seen an increase in our membership as more men and women have discovered our range of activities. We have also recently received the keys to the former St John Ambulance centre situated at Anstey Park.

Of particular note has been the popularity of activities such as our monthly Sheddners' gatherings with a breakfast in a local café and a coffee morning in the parish church hall. Local walks have proved a useful form of exercise and our Christmas lunch and a summer's day outing to the Amberley Heritage museum proved very popular. This is an important aspect of our charitable aims and we look forward to planning more activities to promote inclusion, friendship and wellbeing for those feeling isolated.

Practical activities have kept members busy in our local shed, with mornings proving so popular that the shed has become overcrowded. Help for the local community has seen us undertake a diverse range of practical projects such as:

30 memory boxes made, one for each resident of a local care home; town centre notice boards refurbished and hundreds of numbered plaques for allotment plots; numerous planters and compost bins for local gardening initiatives; bird, bat and hedgehog boxes; heavy duty planters constructed to screen a school playground from a busy road; many repairs to garden furniture and 'odd jobs' as well as the personal projects of our members. A new venture has seen us running fun woodwork activities with local Beavers and Cub Scouts to build bird boxes, bug hotels, picture frames and planters. A craft session is also held fortnightly for residents in supported housing.

As we come to the end of this year we are pleased to announce the most encouraging development in our history as we begin to move into Edgar Hall with local charity Dementia Friendly Alton. DFA is a local voluntary group running activities to provide support to local people and their families affected by dementia. We thank Alton Town Council and the trustees of DFA for facilitating our shared tenancy of Edgar Hall. This former St John Ambulance centre not only provides us with ample garage space to replace our cramped shed, but also the scope to expand our social activities with comfortable rooms, kitchen and toilet facilities. The last few weeks has seen our members busy as we begin to decorate the rooms with DFA and move our tools and benches to create a new workshop.

Alton Men's Shed faces many practical and financial challenges as we start our new year in Edgar Hall. Our trustees and members look forward to working in partnership with DFA as we commence a new era in supporting the local community.

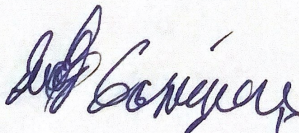

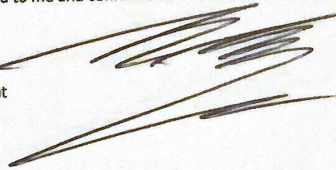

Trustees Report

April 2022

With the reduction in Covid restrictions Alton Men's Shed has emerged from lockdown with renewed vigour. Following last October's AGM five trustees were appointed together with a new committee to lead the charity forward and to welcome back our members. An enthusiastic team cleared out our Queens Road shed ready to resume practical activities. It is pleasing to see enthusiastic members working in the shed on a wide range of community projects and we have further improved the range of tools and machines within our reorganised shed.

We are pleased to note that post Covid we have successfully promoted the social aspects of our charity's aims. We are grateful to the Local Parish Church for offering us free use of their hall and we now have a regular well attended 'Shedders' social morning. This is an important aspect of our project as we wish to provide opportunities for isolated men and women to socialise and feel part of a wider community. To this end we have enjoyed a recent trip to a museum and now have future events planned. Members have taken the initiative and enjoyed walks and meeting in local cafés. AMS continues to be an active participant on the Hampshire Men's Health Forum, a regional initiative that promotes men's health and wellbeing.

Our charity's local links have been successfully re-established with the town council and a wide range of organisations who have in turn supported our role in the community. Recent projects have included work for the local church, schools, care homes and dementia support groups as well as many other charities and individuals. All of these were for public benefit

Given the enthusiasm of our current members and ever increasing interest from potential members we are very conscious of the limited space in our present shed. We are therefore researching opportunities for new space that may arise within Alton, especially with the recent surge in new building developments. Our finances remain steady and we maintain modest reserve funds to help finance a move to a new location should the opportunity arise.

In conclusion, after a difficult start the Trustees of Alton Men's Shed consider a great deal has been achieved building on the enthusiasm of our members and local community supporters. We know there is still work to do and we look forward to making significant progress in the year ahead.

Trustees Annual Report 2021

With the pandemic during the last 12 months, and the membership generally over 70 years of age, it has been limiting to achieve our community benefits. Compounded by the fact that the Chairman stood down from the day-to-day running of the charity in March 2020, due to health, the other trustees closed the activities down without regard to Government directives and the Charity Commission's encouragement to continue their public benefit, they should also have undertaken an AGM and dealt with membership fees.

Much larger projects requiring greater numbers have been completed with diligence and social distancing. Between lockdowns last summer, refurbishment of outside furniture and the store shed at the community hospital was undertaken for the "Friends of the Hospital". More recently restoration of a barn was achieved for the "Riding for the Disabled" at Broadlands Medstead. Both of these projects were possible as they were outside.

The difficulties of Covid 19 were compounded by 4 of our Trustees resigning, leaving only 2 remaining in post, requiring an urgent appointment in October, we are therefore most grateful for the support and effort being put in on our behalf by Brian Cooke of UKMSA.

With the support of Alton Town Council, we were able to rent the Charles Read Pavilion from January to May this allowed us to do some indoor work again socially distanced and with good ventilation and the necessary Risk Assessments (ML). Projects included a storage Box for Bushy Leaze School, two glazed notice boards for Froyle Parish Council and some Garden Furniture refurbishment. The Trustees wish to acknowledge the help and support of 2 members over this period.

Although this time has been challenging it has also been a learning curve to keep active not only on projects for trustees but to get involved with Zoom meetings with UKMSA, upgrading our skills with issues like Men's Health and wellbeing, Health and Safety and Risk Assessment etc. Ian also had invites to be a guest speaker on two Men's Shed Zoom slots regarding "Self-Build" and a link into West Sussex Men's Sheds run by W.S.C.C. in Chichester.

We would also like to acknowledge the financial support we continue to receive from District Councillors for equipment purchases as well as funding for some community projects. We have also set up a 'Just Giving' page on our Web Site, which has a two-fold benefit, firstly gifts to the charity itself and to fund community projects as necessary.

It is anticipated that open meetings will resume soon so that new interest can be generated to assist all older members of the Alton District Community reducing loneliness, anxiety and isolation.

Thank you again for the many supporters and encouragers in the town.

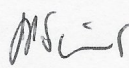
