Take carpentry as an example - When fixing nails into joints and sanding down rough edges, it becomes difficult to step back and admire the beauty of the finished product coming together. When writing this annual report, it gave me a chance to take a step back and reflect upon the progress made by L.A.B. Through the projects we deliver, the people that we support, and the vision that we have now, I can only look to the future with excitement of what is to come.

Measuring progress in our world can often be difficult... Is there a way to gather data on the amount of smiles created, happy moments shared and knowledge taught? Not always, but through the rest of this report, my intent is to share with you all as accurately as possible where we are working, why it is necessary and how we are creating change.

As L.A.B enters another year, with many more projects lined up, it seems that 2024 and 2025 may finally be the years that we look towards expanding our UK administration side. But with the increasing costs of life in the UK, we'd much rather keep the majority of our spending towards our international projects, as we always intended to do when L.A.B was founded back in September 2017.

As we've now reached the halfway point in 2024, 2025 fills me with excitement. When I write our next annual report, I hope to be writing from the new Sunrise Centre in Madagascar, as we're soon to be building a permanent and ongoing support facility, purpose-built to accommodate the needs of people with disabilities on our beloved island of Nosy Be. I also hope that our Ny Fianarantsika program is expanding onto other island across the Nosy Be archipelago. I also hope that our work in Guatemala will be prospering, supporting more villages around Lake Atitlan.

Thank you all sincerely for the support you have provided us, long may it continue.

THE DETAILS...

Our aim always has been, and always will be, to dedicate the vast majority of all the funding we receive, directly upon our projects. This may not mean to say that every penny directly contributes towards a textbook or a school dinner, but it does mean that all funding is spent in relation to this project - Paying teachers salaries, renting classrooms, staff travel, emergencies, materials, transport and more - We make sure that we stick to our aim.

MADAGASCAR

As it always has been, our work in Madagascar remains the highest priority of L.A.B. Here, we remain working across Madagascar's largest island - Nosy Be. Nosy Be is home to around 70,000 people, and situated in the North West of Madagascar.

Our current programs take place across Nosy Be, but in the future we aim to replicate these models into different areas of Madagascar. With the programs that we deliver, we aim to reach the most disadvantaged of individuals, specifically those that don't receive any support from elsewhere. Currently, our 3 programs in Nosy Be are reaching 2 demographics of people - Children / adults with disabilities and their families and children that don't attend school.

Our 3 programs across Nosy Be are:

- **The Sunrise Centre**

The Sunrise Centre is Nosy Be's first centre for the support and education of people with disabilities, and of the first in all of Madagascar. Here, we provide free education, life skills, new opportunities and work based training. At the Sunrise Centre, taking care of our 40+ students, there are 5 full-time employees, with over 20 part-time employees, all of which being family members of our students, that we have employed through our families co-operative.

- **Tsareee! Social Enterprise**

The idea for Tsareee! came around after realising that beyond the Sunrise Centre, there were no future opportunities for people with disabilities. So, we created this enterprise, through which we create profit-generating start ups, managed entirely by people with disabilities.

- **Ny Fianarantsika**

Ny Fianarantsika, meaning 'our education' is our program to support out of school children across Nosy Be. Rather than enrolling students into schools, which would lead to high levels of dropping out, instead, we bring the schools to the students. Our team of 4 teachers, visit 5 different locations across Nosy Be, from rock mines to rural villages, reinforcing knowledge on basic skills, such as reading, writing and number work.

MADAGASCAR

THIS YEAR AND
THE NEAR FUTURE.

Through 2023/2024, our work in Madagascar has expanded across every area, and looking into the near future, we have many projects throughout 2024/5 that will ensure we can keep making an impact to those in need through education and sports:

- **Ny Fianarantsika:** With the ongoing success of this model of delivering free education to out of school children in Nosy Be, we are currently in talks with a range of NGO's and other non-profits across the entirety of Madagascar to share our curriculum and educate out-of-school children. We are looking into alternative methods of supporting those in rural areas too, such as educational radio broadcasts, worksheet deliveries and visits from a 'mobile library' too. For the thousands of children in Madagascar who do not receive an education, these methods of support may be a beacon of hope for sharing basic academic skills.
- **The new Sunrise Centre:** The current Sunrise Centre facility is rented and does not belong to LAB. The lease of the centre is due to expire in July 2024, and therefore, we would be required to move into our own facility.

Knowing this, Jacob's Well Charitable trust have agreed to provide us with £23,000 in funding, allowing us to construct a permanent facility, upon which there will be no expiration date, and we will be able to support the disabled community of Nosy Be forever. In early 2024, a personal supporter of the Sunrise Centre learned of this issue, and visited Madagascar to purchase 1656m² of suitable land, upon which we'll build the new centre. Due to the upcoming expiration date for the lease of the current facility, we are beginning the process of construction as soon as possible, and aim to have an opening ceremony in late September/October of 2024. Within the new Sunrise Centre, we will have a dedicated agricultural space, which will be funded by the donations made from the family of the late Charles Dickinson, a fellow British man living in Nosy Be who unexpectedly passed away in March 2024.

With the construction of the new Sunrise Centre, we become increasingly closer to our overall goal of creating a 'blueprint' for effectively supporting people with disabilities in Madagascar, which can likely be replicated in the future, either by ourselves or by other verified organisations.

GUATEMALA

In January of 2024, inspired by previous work in Guatemala, we decided to finally create a permanent project, on the shores of Lake Atitlan, in Guatemala's heavily mayan-influenced Solola region.

In 2021, when LAB had previously delivered a '50-days of change' project in Central America, we met many children who were out of school, and speaking in a language that had no resemblance to Spanish. After conversating with these children, we learned that the language they were speaking was called 'Tz'utujil', and is one of many ancient Mayan language stil spoken around Lake Atitlan. Alhtough this was the first language of all of these children, upon some small testing, we realised that none of the children had any literacy skills in this language. This provided us with the inspiration to return and make an ongoing difference.

The project that we have created is named 'Escuelita Rixiin Ya', which means 'Little School on the lake' in Tz'utujil. Through this project, our local teacher makes regular, scheduled visits to 2 key locations, providing free basic education and access to other cultural activities. The main aim of this project is to improve the literacy rates of Tz'utujil in communities where it is commonly spoken, especially amongst children, as there is a constantly decreasing incentive to teach the language in local schools.

Upon conducting the initial surveys for the project, we interviewed 58 children, aged between 6-16, of which only 48% of them could write thir name, and only 27% of whom had any skills in literacy.

Since beginning the project, the students have made great progress in literacy skills, which is soon due to be measured through informal testing. Alognside the academic progress, students have also had access to sports, permaculture, arts, music, yoga and other holsitic activities, which makes the Escuelita one of the only projects in the area specifically focusing on the pursuit of culultural activites and the preservation of literacy skills in the Tz'utujil language.

IN SUMMARY...

Looking back, we're extremely grateful for the support we have received, which has enabled us to support hundreds of people in both Madagascar and Guatemala on a limited budget.

After evaluating the average costs of both projects, we are striving to receive £30,000 per year in unrestricted funding, which will be used to cover all of our operating costs - From trustee expenses, to project costs. This is our financial goal going forward.

We are still looking to create new systems, to expand our work and to bring direct and meaningful support to individuals in need, in areas where our services are most required.

As mentioned, it's difficult to measure to the actual impact of our work in statistics and data, but, here, we'll share some of our favourite facts from the past year:

- 40 + STUDENTS AND FAMILIES WITH SUPPORTED AT THE SUNRISE CENTRE.
- 130 + OUT OF SCHOOL STUDENTS SUPPORTED THROUGH THE NY FIANARANTSIKA PROGRAM
- OVER £1000 PAID TO WORKING FAMILIES OF STUDENTS AT THE SUNRISE CENTRE
- 50 + ILLITERATE STUDENTS SUPPORTED IN GUATEMALA
- OUR AVERAGE WAGE IN MADAGASCAR IS MORE THAN 1.5X THE AVERAGE.
- THE SUNRISE CENTRE IS THE ONLY KNOWN FACILITY THAT PAYS PARENTS TO ATTEND & SUPPORT.
- OUR ESCUELITA RIXIIN YA' PROJECT IS THE ONLY REGIONAL PROGRAM WHICH AIMS TO SUPPORT THE LEARNING OF THE ANCIENT TZ'UTUJIL LANGUAGE.
- WE'VE FORMED PARTNERSHIPS WITH 2 INTERNATIONAL UNIVERISITES, BOTH IN CANADA AND THE UK.

We must mention our extreme gratitude towards the Aeonian Foundation, whose generous unrestricted grants have provided us with the vast majority of the funding necessary to implement these projects.

Whilst our work was coming to an end in Mexico in June/July, August of 2022 saw our return to Madagascar. After 4 years of absence, it was incredible to finally return to the big island.

In Madagascar, our mission remained the same... Alongside the various free education and sports programs we delivered, our most significant and overriding objective, was to create the first facility for the education and support of people with disabilities in Nosy Be, Madagascar. Thankfully, on the 17th of March 2023, the Sunrise Centre was opened.

Between our work in Madagascar, we also visited Kenya in May 2023. We worked in Eldoret town, where we investigated the potential for a future project, given the ongoing poor treatment of street children at the hands of local authorities.

But, our work has not been all outside of the UK & Europe, we have also made some impact here too! Through our partnership programs, we have connected with X1 special needs school in the UK, X1 Primary school in Dublin, Ireland, X1 primary school in Barcelona, Spain and finally our partnership with Bishop Grosseteste University in Lincoln, UK, where we welcomed X12 SENDI students who worked as volunteers to our Sunrise Centre.

With all that we have achieved this year, we are more motivated than ever to continue our work across the world, bringing free education and sports projects to areas where it's most needed.

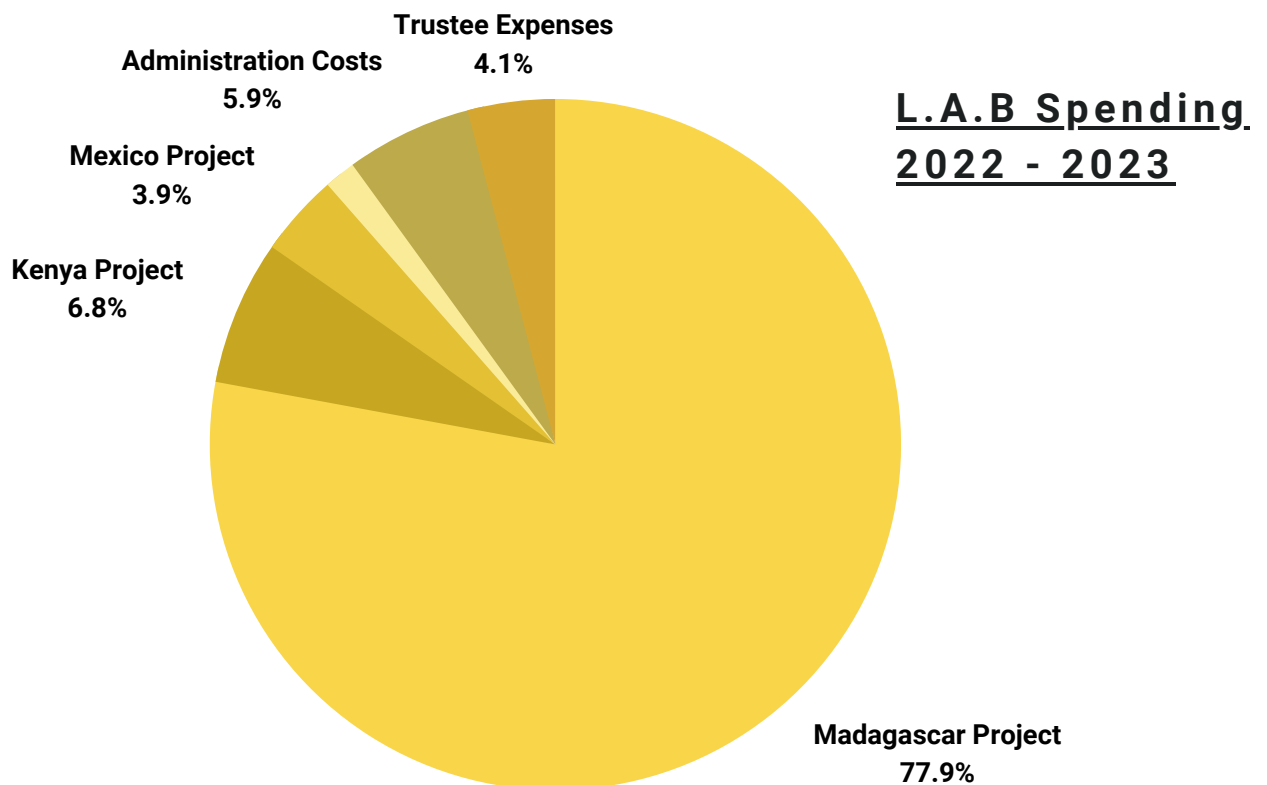
L.A.B ANNUAL REPORT



April 2022 - August 2023

In the 2022 - 2023 period, we raised a total of **£14,932**, which was raised through personal donations, grants and our partnership with Bishop Grossetese University. In March of 2023, we received the news that the Aenionan Foundation wished to support L.A.B with **£10,000** in quarterly donations, to be used towards our Madagascar project. To date, this is the largest commitment to funding that we have ever received.

Within the same period, we also spent a total of **£15,099**, of which **88%** was spent directly upon one of our 3 projects - Madagascar, Mexico or Kenya. Surprisingly, in the same period of time, we also lost a total of **1.4%** of funding (£222) to transactional fees when withdrawing funds overseas. Recognising this, we have found alternative methods to transfer funds overseas. In total, our 2022/2023 funding was spent in the following ways:



MADAGASCAR



The Sunrise Project

Our work in Madagascar takes place on the island of Nosy Be, in the North West of the country. Here, we bring free education and sports projects to people in need. In March of 2023, we opened the Sunrise Centre, which is the first centre for the education and support of people with disabilities in Nosy Be.

At the Sunrise Centre, we have created a unique system, where we employ the parents of our students alongside local teachers to create a happy, safe and prosperous atmosphere. Since our opening, we have achieved and maintained a 100% satisfaction rate among students and parents. Despite having no framework or guidance to follow, our curriculum has proven to be a real success at the Centre. We follow a life skills / basic education program, which focuses on teaching the students the most essential skills. By working in close partnership with the parents too, we also create X2 personal objectives per student which we aim to achieve over the course of the academic year.

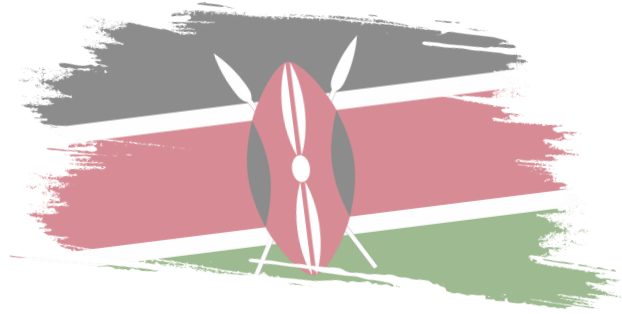
Alongside the Sunrise Centre, we have also created a program called 'Ny Fianarantsika' (Our Education) where we target out-of-school children across Nosy Be, particularly those who are involved in child labour, and bring the free education to them. Each week, 80+ unschooled children in 2 key areas across Nosy Be receive an education thanks to this program.

Additionally, from December 2022 - April 2023, we hosted an English as a foreign language course open to both adults and children in Nosy Be. The course proved to be extremely popular and well received by the local population in Nosy Be. Our average attendance on this course was 61, with 51% of those attending being female and 54% being under 18 years old. At the end of the course, we hosted a basic exam, where 65% of those who tried, passed with more than 60% in reading, writing speaking and listening

Going forward, we aim to continue with the Sunrise Centre and Ny Fianarantsika programs, whilst also opening up an advanced English course for those who passed our basic course.

KENYA

The Street Children of Eldoret



Since the creation of L.A.B in 2017, we have always had a vested interest in supporting the street children of Kenya, particularly in the town of Eldoret, where there a large number of children concentrated into one town.

We originally visited Eldoret in 2019, with the intention of creating a future project there. However, we have never managed to get anything off the ground. Throughout the entirety of this time, we have maintained contact with local partner organisations in Eldoret.

In early 2023, our partner organisations reached out to us to make us aware of alleged abuse taking place against Eldoret's street child community. Upon hearing this, in May 2023, we returned to Eldoret with the intention of understanding what was truly happening.

Our return to Eldoret was nothing short of shocking...

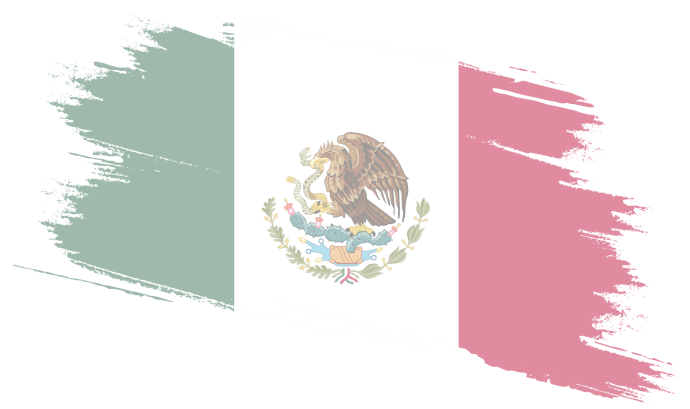
Many of the street children that we visited had been physically abused - We saw evidence of recent beatings against them - Broken limbs and open wounds were commonplace. To help raise awareness of this situation, we have made a short documentary named 'What happened to the Street Children of Eldoret?' which has been released to various media channels.

To raise further awareness of the situation, we are also working with journalists at The Africa Report, who are soon to be publishing an article based on the evidence that we have provided them.

Going forward, we are unsure of what our future work in Kenya may hold - We are aiming to provide occasional small support to our partners on the ground, but in terms of creating a more permanent project, it is looking unlikely at this time.

MEXICO

Escuelita Project



As highlighted in our 2021/2022 annual report, when working in Mexico, we created a unique project to help support children who are out of school. Beginning in the community of Mazunte, we started the 'Escuelita' (Little School) project, where we provide free education across basic literacy and maths skills to children who, otherwise, would not be receiving an education.

going forward, this has inspired us to create a future project in Mexico and Central America, where we aim to create a number of *Escuelitas* across the country.

The concept for the project is as follows:

- We identify an area where there is a high number of children that are not attending school.
- We find a suitable location to host the *escuelita* 2-3 times per week.
- We employ a local teacher and do an informal inscription for all those who wish to attend.
- Free classes begin - Students learn essential academic skills - reading, writing & numbers, whilst also doing arts, sports & story activities.
- Student progress is monitored and evaluated, and personal targets are set for the student to 'graduate'
- Parents regularly attend & assist with the classes, eventually creating a teacher & parent co-operative.
- We seek local businesses to support the local *escuelita* co-operative so that their work can continue.

We intend to begin seeking funding for this project towards the end of 2023.

GOING FORWARD

2023 - 2024

In the 2023-2024 period, we intend to continue on the same trajectory as 2022 - 2023. Whilst still prioritising our Madagascar project, particularly the Sunrise Centre, we also aim to seek funding from other areas to allow us to create new projects across the world.

We intend to create partnerships with more schools and universities across the world, where we can connect students to ignite cross-cultural learning.

We intend for other organisations to take inspiration from the work we're doing, using our work as a 'blueprint' to be followed when implementing their own programs.

We intend to increase our presence in the UK, where we can create further partnerships, support more people and seek new sources of income to be used on future projects.

All in all, this year has been fantastic for all of us at L.A.B. Our greatest year to date, we can now only hope that this momentum remains as we continue to bring free education and sports projects across the world.

A huge thank you to everybody who has supported our work to date!

May our work continue for many more years!

On our upcoming international projects, the activities that we shall undertake for the benefit of the public are:


- Creating the first disability education centre in Nosy Be, Madagascar
