THE TRUSTEES SECURED INCOME FROM DONATIONS OF £7,666 AND EXPENDED £6,995 DURING THE YEAR, WHICH WAS MAINLY GRANTS OF £6,320. THIS RESULTED IN A SURPLUS OF £671 WHICH WAS ADDED TO PRIOR YEAR SURPLUSES. AT THE END OF THE PERIOD, THE CHARITY HELD UNRESTRICTED RESERVES OF £16,699 WHICH THE CHARITY WILL RETAIN FOR FUTURE PROJECTS AND LIABILITIES DUE. THE CHARITY DOES NOT HAVE A POLICY ON SETTING ASIDE RESERVES BUT ALL RESERVES WILL BE UTILISED FOR FUTURE CHARITABLE EXPENDITURE.
