The charity is currently working with the Lennox Trust to provide respite breaks for children who have, and have had, cancer and their families. In the year to September 2020, these breaks were badly impacted by COVID, but we still managed to give breaks to several families, with touching and grateful feedback.

We took advantage of the breaks between families to install a bathroom for disabled use, important given the physical difficulties faced by some of the children. (This represented the principal expenditure of this charity).
