

The cervical kits were provided by NHS former regional centre for cervical smears. Individual members of the CMIPD, God's Vineyard Ministries, and Shalom Health International contributed to the transportation of the materials.

The project involved the:

- a. Formation of a team of health professionals, including gynaecologists, pathologists, and other health professionals.
- b. Establishment of a "Cervical Smear Taker's Manual" in the United Kingdom, coordinated by Mr. Kunle Ajayi, a Consultant Obstetrician and Gynaecologist.
- c. Establishment of a standard protocol for pathologists to use in processing and interpreting smears. Professor Kunbi Banjo, a Gynaecology pathologist at the University of Lagos Teaching Hospital, and Dr Rotimi Olorunda, Director of Pathological Services at Leeds Royal Infirmary, Leeds, UK, collaborated on the project.
- d. Training for all of the Project's various Teams at the State and Teaching Hospital levels.
- e. Development of cervical smear screening systems by various state and teaching hospitals.
- f. Development of a campaign of information dissemination aimed at raising awareness and mobilizing target women to participate in the screening process in all local governments throughout the states.
- g. Development of the system of transporting the slides to the pathologists. The creation of a system for transporting slides to pathologists.
- h. Pathologists generate results.
- i. Gynaecologists treat abnormal smears as needed.
- j. Audit of the screening results and their management.
- k. Production of results. Cervical smear screening will be maintained in the various beneficiary states.







Public Benefit


