Our Charitable Objects:

To advance education for the public benefit among children and young people aged 4 and above and adults in all aspects of the performing arts by the provision of workshops and opportunities to participate in artistic performances.

Established in 1945 by Bertram H. Holland, Stretford Children's Theatre became an integral part of the community for over 35 years. However, it ceased operations in the early 1980s. In 2015, a dedicated group of local individuals successfully revived the theatre, choosing one of its original venues, Stretford Public Hall, as the backdrop for its resurgence.

Stretford Children's Theatre [SCT] is dedicated to offering accessible, high-quality drama experiences for individuals aged 4 and above, extending to adults within our community. Our drama sessions are delivered by professional theatre practitioners, specialists at working with our different age groups. We think we meet our aims at every session we deliver and hope that everyone feels the same. If you feel differently please speak to the any member of the Board or staff and highlight any concerns you may have.

As a foundation CIO, we are governed by our Constitution. If you wish for a copy of the Constitution which details more information about our group's governance and rules, please ask any of the Board Members who can give you a copy, it can also be found on our website.

We have had no serious or reportable accidents or incidents this year.

Our public liability insurance is held with Markel Insurance.

All our drama practitioners are DBS checked and follow our child protection policy and procedures. All our policies can be found on our website.

We conduct risk assessments for each group, and each place we visit to ensure everybody's safety.

We continuously review policies during the year, our financial controls are monitored and adjusted accordingly to ensure robust processes are adhered to and trustees remain accountable.

A Year in Review

We would usually look to put on a performance from the start of September to be staged in December of that year. This year the landscape for our group was wholly different, and we weren't really expecting that! The world post Covid was a difficult place where any funding for arts projects was difficult to win as more funding was put to mental health projects and first response groups.

We learned pretty early on that funding for 'extra curricular' projects would be challenging and made the decision to ensure the group remained solvent. This unfortunately meant that the performances would be on hold until funding had been secured. The financial picture of the group illustrates our resilience during this year and our adaptability as a board to provide longevity to the charity. Despite the challenges faced, we think we did ok!

We have been supported by a variety of funders and unusually this year the funds have come from first time funders. The majority of the donations received were from a local charity who have wrapped up their operations. This money allowed us to continue our operations until the end of the financial year and was gratefully received by our charity.

Whilst we have had no big performances in the year, some of our groups held sessional performances for their parents and carers to share the work they had done over the year.

Our annual award ceremony was held on Thu 20th July 2023 where we celebrated the achievements of our attendees. Awards were given out by our patron Thomas Roberts who came to visit us and Ella Brady in our senior section was bestowed with the Bertram Holland Shield Trophy. Each section gave a main trophy to a worthy winner and then smaller ones to all.

We have opportunities for volunteering within our groups, as well as wider opportunities within the charity, and we love assisting our volunteers to be the best they can be and for what they help us to achieve.

Stretford Children's Theatre - 12 week Young Person Volunteer Programme

This programme will give a minimum of 22 hours volunteering over 12 weeks. There will be more opportunities for the young person to volunteer if they so wish such as coming to observe a board meeting, or carrying out a fundraising project for the group, and the programme can be extended to 6, 12 months or longer if so desired.

Our experienced Board members, Sessional Leaders, Sessional Manager and Fundraising Staff will support the young person whilst they are volunteering with us and ensure they are well looked after, safe, happy and learn as much as they can. We are based at Stretford Public Hall in the heart of Stretford town centre and the building is fully accessible.

This would be a perfect placement for those doing the Duke of Edinburgh scheme or a young person wishing to enhance their CV for college or university or their first job. We ask that the young person is aged 14 years as a minimum.

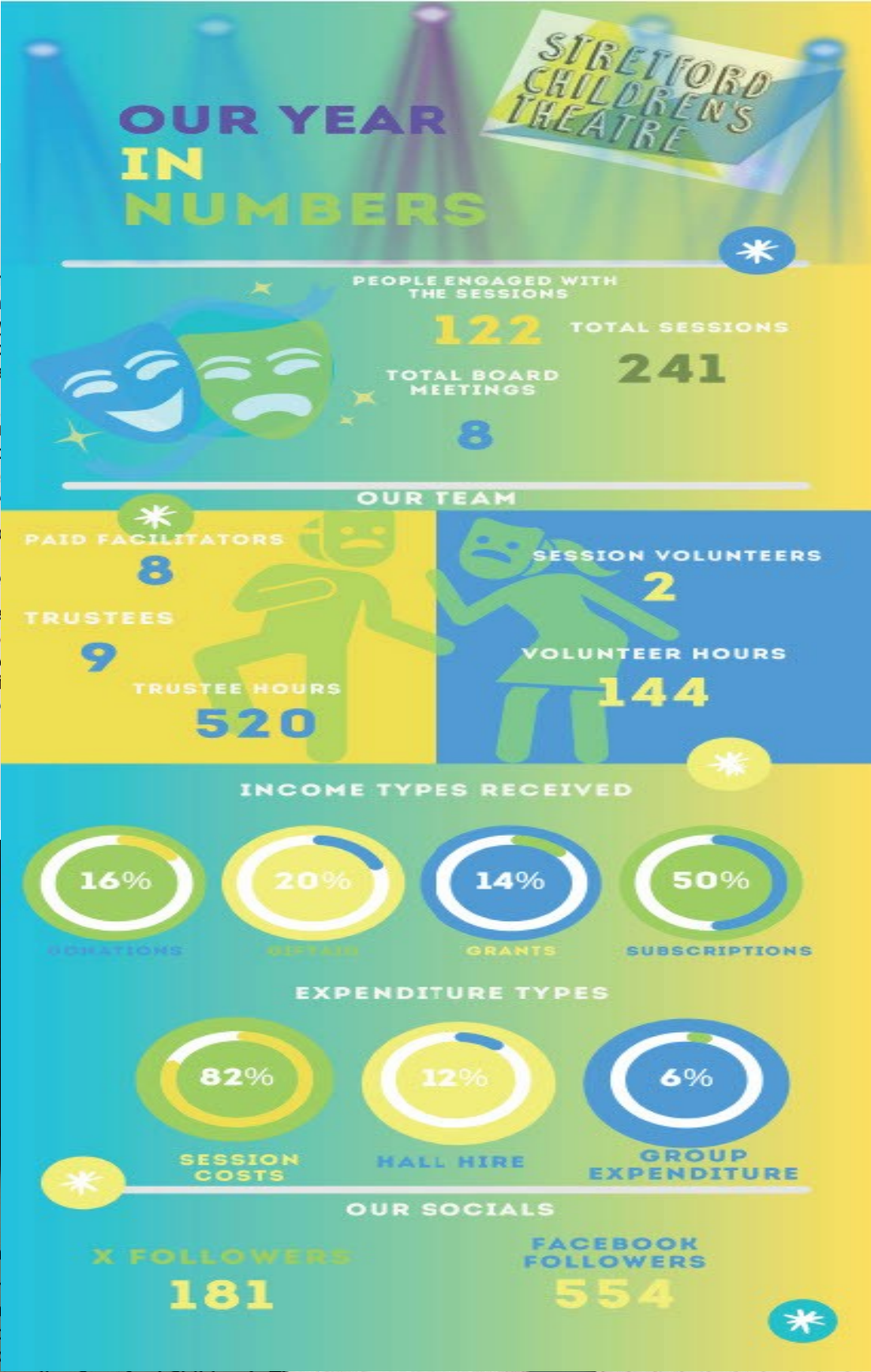
Week		More Detail
1	Initial Meeting with Board Member – 1 hour	This meeting will be about what the young person hopes to achieve whilst volunteering with us, and how we can best support them, and introductions to the team and sessions themselves. Plus identifying any specific additional areas they are interested in, planning how they might gain experience in those areas with SCT.
2	Understanding our charity – 2 hours	Who we are; why we formed; our history; vision/values/aims; what we do; what a board does; our constitution; The Charity Commission & our responsibilities; policies and procedures; managing personnel/ volunteers; management systems (DSM, Go Cardless, iZettle); financial management; funding/ fundraising; health and safety; safeguarding; monitoring, evaluation; measuring impact.
3	Sessional Volunteering – 2 hours	These weekly volunteering sessions will be spent in either the infant or junior drama sessions assisting the Sessional Leaders and the attending children.
4	Sessional Volunteering – 2 hours	
5	Sessional Volunteering – 2 hours	The young person will never be left alone with the children and will not be responsible for anything other than their own behaviour. We would expect them to follow all our policies and procedures as discussed with them in weeks 1 and 2.
6	Sessional Volunteering – 2 hours	
7	Sessional Volunteering – 2 hours	These sessions are fun and consist of drama games and often involve producing pieces leading up to a performance – we hope the young person would get fully involved in these sessions.
8	Sessional Volunteering – 2 hours	
9	Sessional Volunteering – 2 hours	A board member is usually available weekly and as such progress reports will be gathered and any issues for the young person or Sessional Leader will be addressed as they arise.
10	Sessional Volunteering – 2 hours	
11	Sessional Volunteering – 2 hours	All Sessional Leaders are DBS checked, and SCT is fully insured and has strict H&S and safeguarding policies in place.
12	Close out meeting with Board Member – 1 hour	

The sessional volunteering hours are either Thursdays from 4-6pm or Thursdays from 5.30-7.30pm.

We can accommodate 2 volunteers on each of the sessions at any one time. Other volunteering opportunities are also available that do not involve being in the sessions, such as communications & social media, fundraising, policies and procedures if that is of interest to any of the young people.

DAISY'S STORY

Daisy likes to have fun and has a playful side to her, but she is also quite anxious and struggles with self-doubt.

Daisy's anxiety and self-doubt was paralysing. In the past, she often gave up when she thought she could not do something.

Her parents and grandparents have noticed how much her confidence and self-belief have increased since attending our sessions, and this is also being reflected in her school work.

Now, her anxiety affects her work much less because her confidence and self-belief have improved so much.

JACK'S STORY

Jack is one of Stretford Children's Theatre's original members and his confidence and abilities have greatly improved since he joined. He often speaks rapidly and sometimes 'fumbles' his words which lowered his self-confidence. Our supportive environment means Jack can slow his speech down and concentrate on his enunciation.

Jack's parents are proud of the changes they have seen during his time at Stretford Children's Theatre. Jack's father told us he loves attending because it's so inclusive and helps Jack to express himself. As Jack is at an all-boys school, it's important that he mixes with girls in a semi-social setting, which is exactly what Stretford Children's Theatre allows him to do.

ORLA'S STORY

Orla is one of our original members and has dyspraxia. This means she has challenges around spatial awareness and learning skills. She also has some difficulties with social skills, which led to her being bullied at primary school.

Drama enabled Orla to cope with the profound negative effects of the bullying and gave her techniques to deal with it. Being in a group of like-minded people who don't judge or tease benefits her greatly.

The physical challenges Orla faces are never belittled by the group or facilitators, and she has found ways to work around them and ensure she is able to fully join in all the activities.

Both her parents report that there has been a great change in Orla's confidence and abilities. Her confidence has improved so much that she took part in our 'Misguided Misfits' film project, something she would never have been able to do previously.

Treasurer's Report

This fiscal year posed financial challenges for our organization due to changes in the grant application landscape, resulting in the loss of grants we had previously been fortunate to receive. Despite these challenges, there has been a remarkable overall income increase of £6,550 compared to the prior year, representing a substantial 63% growth. This significant boost is particularly noteworthy as it alleviates the burden on our financial obligations.

The primary contributor to this increase is a substantial sum of £4,464 from GiftAid. Notably, we made two claims during the financial year, spanning both the 2021/22 and 2022/23 periods. This decision was strategic, aimed at ensuring the continuity of our classes until the year's end.

In addition to the positive impact of GiftAid, our organization experienced a noteworthy surge in donations, witnessing a remarkable 215% increase from the previous year, amounting to £3,622. The bulk of these funds, generously donated by The Stretford Youth Theatre, have been received with gratitude. We extend our heartfelt thanks to all involved for their consideration and support. SCAN TO DONATE



In the past year, our organization faced challenges as the cost of living increased in our community, leading to a decline in monthly subscription values towards the year's end. Overall attendance dropped by 11%, largely anticipated due to the absence of performances. However, swift actions were taken, and we're pleased to report that our groups have now returned to full capacity.

Financially, we received support from Trafford Council, amounting to £1,999, earmarked for our adult group's induction as a new group. As of August 31, 2023, £408 from this grant remains to be spent in the current financial year. Additionally, we secured £1,000 in funding from Caddick for core costs such as hall hire, session leaders, and managers. These funds, received in late August, will be utilized in accordance with the agreed-upon terms during the current financial year.

Total expenditure saw a 37% increase, stemming from the irregularities in our activities in 2021/22 due to Covid regulations. Although our costs appear higher now, if our classes had been consistent back then, the expenses would have remained the same, barring an increase in sessions.

To enhance our capabilities, we expanded our session staff to include a session administrator. This support not only facilitates applications for additional grants but also ensures the upkeep of our website details.

In terms of our balance sheet, as of August 31, 2023, our bank holds £1,244 in total. This comprises £835 in unprotected funds (free reserves) and £409 in protected funds (remaining from the grant received from Trafford Council).

Our trustees are committed to a reserves policy, retaining funds to cover 12 weeks (one academic term). Despite challenges in the past financial year, we aim to restore reserves to the agreed-upon value in 2023/24. This plan involves increasing grant applications to cover core costs and allowing subscription revenue to replenish the deficit by the end of the financial year.

A disclosure notes that one trustee received £450 as a session leader, distinct from trustee duties. Despite our income falling below the £25,000 threshold for independent examination, we voluntarily subjected our accounts to an independent review. This choice reflects our commitment to transparency, accountability, to give confidence to our stakeholders.
