THE TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH APRIL 2021

The trustees present their annual report together with the unaudited financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30th April 2021. The Trustees confirm that the Annual Report and financial statements of the charity comply with the current statutory requirements, the requirements of the Charity's governing document and the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005.

REVIEW OF FINANCIAL POSITION

The financial statements covered the operation of Compassionate Believers Prayer Movement and they have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the 2005 Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP)

For the year ended 30th April 2021, the financial activities show total incoming resources of £ 1,575 (2020- £2,417) which is the total tithes and offering donations received from members. This was disbursed mainly on charitable activities and total expenditure amounted to £ 832 (2020- 3,474) We closed the year with a net operating profit of £743. The limited activities for this year was due to ongoing COVID-19 19 pandemic

STATEMENT OF TRUSTEE'S RESPONSIBILITIES

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustee's report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law.

Charity law requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charity for that period.
