Para 1.20	<p>Another successful year of homing dogs at Wolfies Legacy.</p> <p>Wolfies Legacy was set up with an idyllic view in mind. One where neglected, disabled and unwanted dogs become companions to lonely or disabled humans that felt something was missing in their life. This dream has become reality. This year we have seen many dogs re-homed, but one case stands out considerably.</p> <p>This was Teddy (who is now named Ricky).</p> <p>Teddy came to us from a home in Norris Green, Liverpool. Norris Green is a poorer council estate and the family who bred Teddy found they didn't have the money to pay for Teddys treatment once he was diagnosed with hydrocephalus. We were fortunate enough to use Leahurst small animal teaching hospital, which is linked to Liverpool University on the Wirral. We were also lucky in meeting Prof Tim Bentley, a pioneering specialist, who donated a magnetic shunt to drain the spinal fluid from Teddy's brain, down a tube to his abdomen.</p> <p>The surgery was a great success and Teddy was adopted. To put the cherry on the cake, Teddys new keeper moved to Thailand to join her son, so now our little boy enjoys every weekend at the beach.</p> <p>I am very proud of this charity's achievements. We have matched families and dogs and improved everyone's life. Our oldest adopter was previously 92, and his dear wife has a three legged dog to protect her since Brian's passing.</p> <p>There isn't an adoption donation for our older adopters, but rather a personal relationship and understanding that when the dog needs to he can come back to the charity.</p> <p>We give our time freely at Wolfie's not just for the benefit of the dogs but for those who need a silent friend by their side.</p>

This is also a great opportunity to meet up with ex-Wolfie's dogs, and some of them have been known to win an award or two whilst taking part, such as Albert who came 2nd in the best rescue, Well done Albert!



Each year Wolfie's Legacy endeavours to place dogs needing homes with people who equally need a dog.

We continually hear of retired people who have lost the benefits of companionship through the workplace, say they would like a dog but are unable to exercise one.

This is where Wolfie's Legacy can help, so many of our dogs can live happily with just a garden for exercise, and they will provide the companionship required.

Very often the dog becomes the most important thing in that person's life. For example, Annie, who lost her husband and was feeling scared and vulnerable, adopted DouDou who gave her a reason to get up in the morning (her words). Or Helen, a single parent whose daughter Sophie went away to University, Aaron filled her day becoming a child substitute.

Dogs are a valued member of any family, but so much more so when they are needed.

At Wolfie's Legacy we consider our aim to be making a union between a needy dog and someone who needs a dog the goal.

Our Facebook group "Wolfie's Legacy" was also set up to provide a child friendly space for families to share their adopted dog and view others. Over the last year we have gained more followers on our Facebook page and this has become a valuable marketing tool for others to see what it means to own a disabled dog and what that dog could give them in return.

Here they can post pictures, ask advice and share days out and holidays. It's surprising how well travelled a lot of our dogs are.

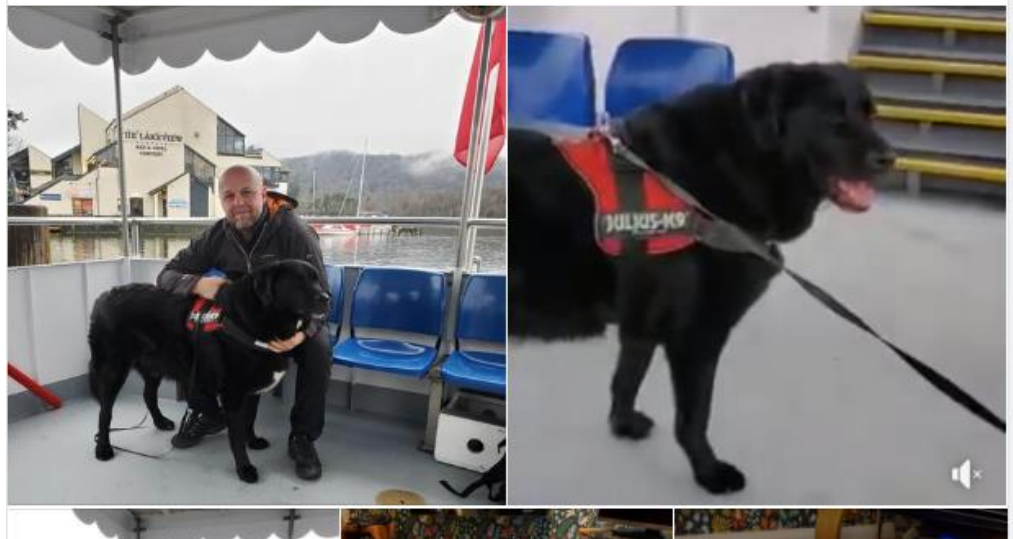



Wolfie's Legacy have always aimed to benefit the public by providing interaction with canines, even when their circumstances may not allow them to own a dog.

We have attended several large events to educate children about disabled dogs. One such event was Dogfest in June, where over two days there was a gate of thirty two thousand plus.

We have also introduced dogs at our local pet superstore, where we will be covering every other weekend until Christmas. Our aim is ultimately to ensure homes for the dogs, but we find some of the dogs make wonderful ambassadors for the charity, and so for a while they will work, to teach the public that there is a dog for everyone, and a keeper for all dogs.

This year we met a wonderful older gentleman who told us that nobody would let him own a dog because of his age, he is eighty-four years old and he is also registered blind. We had in our care at the time an extremely beautiful female dog of ten years named Marta. They were made for each other, and the gentleman's seventy nine year old wife takes Marta out for strolls each afternoon. His wife is a very slim and fit pensioner. The gentleman had asked for a fluffy dog so that he could run his hands through her fur, that way he felt he could see her.

It is now proven that dogs are beneficial for our health and wellbeing; we try never to turn down a potential adopter, but rather match a dog with similar needs to theirs.

Also this year we placed a miniature poodle with cerebellar hyperplasia, into a home with two sons with autism. The boys are now both in their early twenties. One with a mental age of seven, and this dog has become the most important part of his day. He has managed to get a placement on a special needs farm due to his love for animals. He calls it work and he has become a far more confident person because of it. We hope in the following year to find many more opportunities to show the dogs and teach the benefits of keeping one.

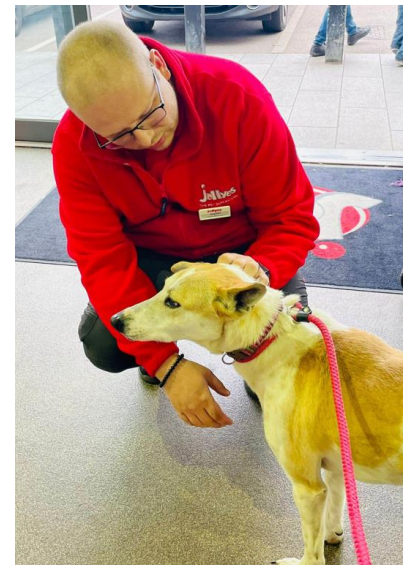



One of the aims of Wolfie's Legacy has always been, to enrich the lives of people who have previously enjoyed the companionship of a canine family member; yet because of their own disability, ill-health or circumstance are no longer considered by other shelters.

Never were we more needed than in 2020, when the country came into lockdown because of the pandemic. Now thousands of families wanted a dog. We were only too aware that many many dogs would be returned when restrictions lifted. We also realised that for a lot of "grown up" families life would never be the same again. The pandemic made a lot of people realise the importance of that word "family" and of course no family is complete without a dog. We decided to focus on the older families, those with children home from University, mums and dads who have accepted early retirement, or redundancy. They all pass the same comment, "now we are free" we want a dog. Strange when we are under restrictions, that many feel for the first time in decades that they are free.

Our role has been to find that extra family member and we have had many many families thank us for doing just this. Examples of happy adopters such as Dionne and her daughter; a one parent family who adopted Silka a blind dog from North Macedonia. Silka has made them proud by bonding with her family enough to become their "jogging buddy". Then there's Milly, again partially sighted. Milly is a therapy dog for the two autistic teenagers in Lisa's family. Cooper, again blind and the companion to Jocelyn who can no longer work due to a brain injury. The list continues.

Sadly our plans to work with ex-servicemen, haven't as yet come to fruition; like a lot of things in 2020 they have been put on the back burner. Regardless, this has been a successful year for homing dogs with needy people. To close, I will quote the words of a couple who have adopted a deaf dog from Korea. "He makes life better, just by being in it".

2021 will see the start of our plans to set up a first-of-its-kind rehabilitation and adoption facility, specifically for dogs with disabilities.


