

Club Secretary Report

AGM – 5th July 2022

Last season we looked forward to an easier time in 2021/22 following the previous two that were affected by the pandemic. This has clearly been a more straightforward season but the impact on grassroots football is still being felt.

Volunteers have been lost to the game as work, family and other interests have become more important over this period. Issues affecting the workforce and the adverse financial situation will bring about more consolidation within Clubs and Leagues.

The Chelmsford Youth League has folded into the BCFA Youth League at the end of the season and open-age Leagues are struggling for numbers. Across the Country, following the pandemic, two issues emerged. There has been an increase in poor discipline and behaviour and match officials have been in short supply. This Club has always expected everyone to be respectful, disciplined, and responsible. Poor behaviour will not be tolerated as it has a negative impact on volunteers and makes it harder to retain those match officials.

Hutton FC continues to field around 65 teams, and around 900 players registered to the Club. We have over 2,700 twitter, 938 facebook, and 580 Instagram followers. There are 120 plus volunteers in the Club and the estimated social value we deliver for our community is £1.9m per annum.

The priority for some time now has been to improve facility provision and the progress on the new ground is vital to that. Once established the Club will need to obtain funding to further develop this site.

Our player pathway for female and male players has really moved forward over the season with our Under 17 Girls stepping up to play for both First and Reserve Ladies teams and our older male youth players moving into the new Under 21 team.

The Club has now established itself in the Eastern Junior Alliance League and we need to start bringing our younger youth teams through into that League. Next season we see the Club enter a team into the Junior Premier League for the first time.

I want to say a big thank you to all the Club Trustees, John, Peter, Vicky, Kathryn, Tom and Darren and to the Football Management Committee, to James, Kate, Stuart, Mark, Billy and Steve. In particular I want to thank Paul Mulley who not only audits the accounts but also prepares our VAT returns and is helping improve our financial processes and returns.

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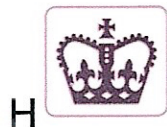
