In doing so, all Trustees have taken account of the guidance on public benefit issued by the Charity Commission.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

A major change this year has been that, as the result of a Kenya National Government decision, pupils are now expected to stay on for 3 more years within a new Junior Secondary School. It was felt important that we should offer this to the pupils in order to remain competitive.

This has brought some major changes and financial challenges to the school, including the construction of additional classrooms and latrines plus the recruitment of additional teachers. The parents have agreed to fund one teacher. This long-term financial commitment shows their eagerness to support the school.

The establishment of a Junior Secondary School within Barbara Leighton Academy has also required the provision of a new Science Laboratory and enhanced IT facilities, including an expanded Computer Laboratory.

The funding of our Feeding Programme for all pupils remains a top priority for the trustees and we have also been keen to fund participation in extracurricular activities, including local sports competitions and the establishment of a Scout Troop.

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

For the second year, our Final Year pupils (Grade Six) completed their primary education – under the new CBC curriculum - and left to continue their education in local secondary schools. Under the terms of the former 8.4.4 curriculum, our STD 8 pupils also completed their primary education and left to continue their education in local secondary schools. **The Trustees continued to prioritise the inclusion of all pupils in the Feeding Programme** and, when funds permit, invest in improving the **Textbook: Pupils ratio** in each class.

As in previous years, we contribute funding to the annual **Graduation Ceremony**, which celebrates the transition of pupils from Nursery (PP2) to Primary (Grade One) education.

Funds were also allocated to support various extracurricular activities, including touring places of interest in and around Kisumu (airport, wildlife park, Lake Victoria etc), participation in local sports competitions with other local schools, and the formation of a **BLA Scout Troop**.





Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Having managed the period of Covid-19 so effectively, our mission partner (**Yala Widows & Orphans Support Project**) pushed on to achieve our target of recruiting 120 pupils to **Barbara Leighton Academy**.

This involved further investment in the construction and fitting out of another classroom. The extension of electricity to all classrooms, combined with the purchase of additional computers and Wi-Fi equipment, meant that all pupils benefited from vital IT access across the entire curriculum.

The Trustees continued to prioritise the inclusion of all pupils in the Feeding Programme, even though the combination of war in Ukraine and Climate Change resulted in significant increases in the cost of basic foodstuffs.

Our Final Year pupils (Grade Six) completed their primary education and left to continue their education in local secondary schools.

Having made some progress already, our main target for future investment is in improving the Textbooks: Pupils ratio in each class.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Thanks to the preparatory work, completed during the school closure in 2020, **Barbara Leighton Academy** re-opened successfully in 2021. The school remained open during the year in spite of the rates of **Covid-19** cases and deaths in Kenya increasing sharply, prompting Government action, including the closing of churches for a time and extension of the night time curfew.

The strict measures implemented by **Edward Wata (Director)** and his team to create a **Covid-19 secure environment** continued to ensure no cases were recorded at the school.

With the construction of another classroom completed, the local reputation of **Barbara Leighton Academy**, as a provider of good quality nursery and primary education, continued to grow and pupil numbers increased to 110.

The Trustees continued to prioritise the inclusion of all pupils in the **Feeding Programme**.

The great efforts of **Edward Wata** and his team were rewarded by the granting of **Full Registration status** by the Ministry of Education in April. **Additional Project Funds** were raised and applied to the repair of the **Access Road and School Latrines** – all damaged by especially heavy rains.

Further investment in **IT Equipment** was identified as an increasingly urgent priority for the coming year, given the application of computer skills across the whole curriculum.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

In January, the new school year began very positively, including the recruitment of 20 additional pupils from the local village community, many of whose family backgrounds were especially deprived – including genuine malnutrition and the lack of proper healthcare. Total pupil nos increased to 83.

All too quickly, in common with so many countries around the world, Kenya had to face its own Coronavirus Crisis. Although the numbers of reported cases and deaths remained small, by comparison to the UK and other countries, the Kenyan Government acted quickly to close all schools mid-March and impose a night-time curfew, amongst other measures.

Our pupils were obliged to stay at home and could not therefore access the e-learning provided by the government because their parents lacked radios or smartphones, which were the gadgets used to access the e-learning resources.

Thanks to the generosity of our donors, our special appeal was fully funded, which enabled us to provide the equipment needed to enable pupils of **Barbara Leighton Academy** to access the government's e-learning resources - including Radios and Smart Phones.

Our Teachers, who continued to be paid, also provided written learning resources and visited pupils at home to guide them in the use of these online and offline resources.

The Feeding Programme - with food collected from the school for consumption at home - continued to ensure that all pupils were adequately nourished.

In anticipation of schools re-opening in 2021, extra measures were implemented to ensure that the school site could be made as Covid-19 secure as possible, including:-

- Reconfiguration of existing buildings and purchase of additional desks etc to accommodate social distancing within classrooms
- Installation of additional water storage and handwashing facilities
- Provision of face masks – made by local Widow Groups, who benefit from the additional income
- Purchase of thermo guns to check the temperature of everyone entering the site
