A food and farming marquee allowed local producers to promote their foods, and sell direct to the public. Local crafts people had a specialist area in which to show off their talents, and sell their wares. Modern and vintage machinery was displayed, with appropriate information provided. The show also provided a convivial atmosphere for people to spend time and talk.

The show was able to make a donation of £3000 to Devon Air Ambulance trust





Thanks to good weather approx. 2500 members of the public attended, similar to 2019, but all entries and trade stands were down. Classes for horses, cattle sheep, fleeces, dogs and handicrafts were held, and information provided to the public during the judging of these.

Specialist sheep and cattle marquees provided detailed information on various aspects of animal husbandry.

A food and farming marquee allowed local producers to promote their foods, and sell direct to the public.

Local crafts people had a specialist marquee in which to show off their talents, and sell their wares.

Modern and vintage machinery was displayed, with appropriate information provided. The show also provided a convivial atmosphere for people to spend time and talk.

The show was able to make a donation of £2000 to Parkinsons UK


