We are deeply grateful to every donor, partner, and volunteer who made our mission possible.

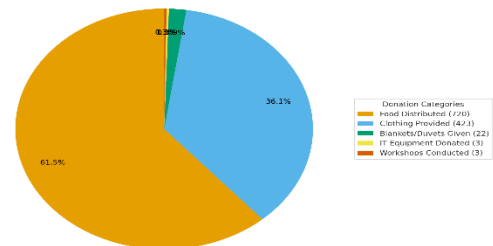

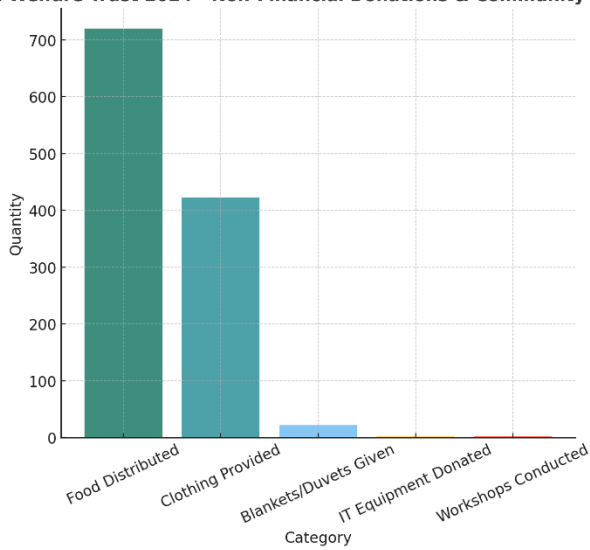

Furthermore, three individuals donated IT equipment to help students continue their education, ensuring they could access their studies and online resources without interruption.

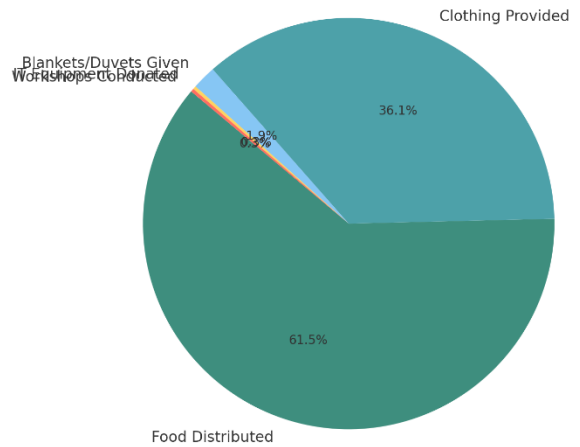

## Visual Data Overview

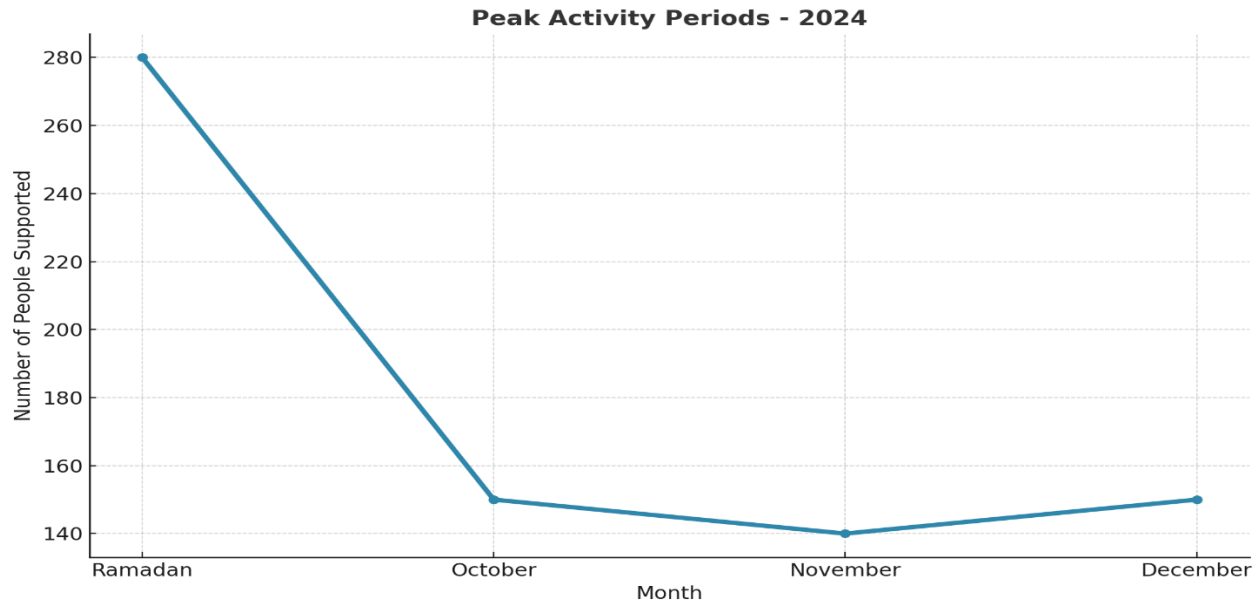
**Beka Welfare Trust 2024 - Non-Financial Donations & Community Activities**

The Trust operated on a modest scale during 2024. All expenditure was directed towards charitable activities.

The Trust recognises that in future, small essential items such as a computer or office tools may be required to record donations and prepare reports. These would be treated as necessary support costs to enable effective delivery of charitable work, not as overhead or personal benefit.

### Reserves Policy

At year end, the Trust held reserves of £6,715.64 which will be used to continue welfare activities into 2025. The Trustees aim to maintain adequate reserves to provide stability and meet ongoing commitments.

### **Structure, Governance and Management**

Beka Welfare Trust is governed by its constitution and managed by its Trustees. The Trustees have met regularly throughout the year to monitor charitable activities and financial performance.

## **Independent Examiner's Report**

Currently, we are talking with Rubi Gul Aghosh ( Orphanage) to work with partnership. However, they are also struggling with proper Charity Bank account. Once the matter is settle, we start proper operation in Pakistan.

fulfilled. We are still encouraging people to help in regards of tuition fees, buy schoolbooks and uniform to the most needy and deserving students.

## **Swindon:**

Within Swindon we encouraged our local community, business to provide food, clothes, blanket and other stuff to keep warm and healthy homeless and rough sleepers in Swindon. Local residence and business appreciate it and they starts providing food, tea, coffee, water, Warm clothes and shampoo, toothpaste and brush etc. People like to buy things rather than donate money. We encourage them to get involve and make people lives better.

In Winter we provide 2 time a day and 4 time a week to 16-20 people in Swindon Area. These were rough sleeper and homeless people in the street.
