<b>Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year</b>	<p>Camden Fencing Club is one of the UK's most successful fencing clubs offering lessons in sabre to children, adults and veterans. We welcome beginners and experienced fencers of all ages covering a broad range of abilities from those starting the sport to members of the GB national teams. Our programmes are aimed to help people realise their true potential.</p> <p>With professional coaches we run 4 youth and 3 adult sessions per week as well as one competitive session each month. We have over 200 members and visitors participating in our Club.</p> <p>Camden Fencing Club has worked hard create a programme to support fencers on the journey to the Olympics and support the Club.</p> <p>The London Borough of Camden is concerned about inactive youth and we are delighted that they have agreed to support CFC to provide after school fencing sessions. Evidence suggests that fencing is uniquely positioned to attract an inactive population that is uninterested in sport and inactive population. Fencing is a strategic sport, almost like a physical form of chess. It teaches young people to think for themselves and to analyse the way other people think.</p> <p>We continue with Muslim Women Fence in conjunction with the Muslim Sports Association and Camden Muslim Women's Project to engage Muslim women in sport. This is a targeted approach - giving Muslim women the opportunity to stay physically active and socialise at the same time. Many of our participants have young children and welcome the time to do an activity which engages them physically and mentally.</p> <p>Fencing is an activity that gives girls the opportunity to master challenges, boosting their self-esteem and resilience. Fencing takes attention away from looks and instead puts the focus on physical fitness and improving technique.</p> <p>We would like to recognise the Winton family, ING and parents who have supported the Club through donations to support the Club as well as talented fencers to compete in the UK and abroad. We are excited that competitions are recommencing - not only for our fencers but also for the Club to host competition events – with our first competition scheduled for October 2022.</p>

<b>Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves</b>	<p>Membership fees and donations were stronger this year. However sponsorships and grants were lower. Expenses were higher as with Covid 19 the Club needed more equipment, space and coaching staff. As competitions restart the Club also supported young competitors by providing coaching. Expenses are 43% higher.</p> <p>The Government has stopped funding Fencing. Camden Fencing Club continues our reciprocal arrangement with elite fencers for training and coaching which has been very successful in helping these fencers on their Olympic journeys in the past. CFC has restarted this programme in 2022.</p>


