TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 1ST APRIL 2025

Introduction:

The main activities of the ministry this year were the relocation of Evangelist Giles Stevens and his family to the USA; the transfer of funds from Vinesong Ministry to TGM; and the launch of the Make America Born Again mission.

Below is a more detailed report of ministry activities:

Monthly Ministry Activities:

January

- Arrival in Fort Myers and integration with Vine Church leadership team

February

- Mission to Trinidad & Tobago – Outreach event led by Danny Stevens in local schools brought 800 decisions for Christ; other events held in a cricket stadium, a local park, and various churches brought many others to salvation and the infilling of the Spirit.

March

- Launch of the 15-week Spiritual Maturity Course for in-person and online students. 93 registrations.
- Attendance at the ARC church-planters to conference to learn from with effective local ministries
- Attendance at Vine Ministries Pastors Empowerment to assimilate with immigrant Vine churches in the US
- Preaching series in a local American Congregation – The Church of All Nations in Boca Raton.

April

- Giles & Silvia trained and ordained as official US chaplains giving them access to hospitals, schools, prisons and other settings to minister.
- Tour of Vine Churches in Florida – Tampa, Davenport, Port Saint Lucie.
- Rebranding of Vine Youth Movement with the name “Free Radicals”.

May

- Youth Camp in Tampa Florida
- Youth Encounter & Adult Encounter Weekends in Fort Myers with record attendance.

June

- UK Tour including TGM Evenings of Hope in London and Dorset, Special Services in Clapham and the West End, and Training Day at Vine Bible School in Swindon. First ever service where Giles preached along with all three of his sons – Titus, Daniel, and Pedro – at Fountain Church in Ashford Kent.

July

- Ministry Day for staff at South Florida Bible College. As a result Pedro Stevens was offered a scholarship as a student athlete and schools evangelist.
- Launch of 15-week Leadership Training Course for in-person and on-line students.

August

- Launch of bi-weekly Life Group in Naples, Florida.
- 7 Good Things Campaign in Vine Fort Myers – seven weeks of outreach meetings in Life Groups and Sunday services.

September

- Titus Stevens holds mass crusade in Northeast Brazil with 15,000 attendants
- Pastors Empowerment and Event in Seattle, Washington

October

- First ever Men's Conference – "Forged by Fire" – held in Vine Church, Fort Myer
- Legendary Men's Event in Atlanta, Georgia. 350 men spent four days in the wilderness to survive the challenges and encounter with God. Many were radically transformed.

November

- Launch of the Make America Born Again (MABA) mission in Fort Myers Beach and Downtown Fort Myers.
- Youth Encounter & Adult Encounter Days held at Vine Church Fort Myers.

December

- Mission to Brazilian cities – Iguape, Sao Luis de Montes Belos, Sanclerlandia.

- Pastors and Leaders Conference in Goiania, Brazil
- US Christmas Tour – An evening with the Stevens Family in Florida and Atlanta.

Vinesong Fund Transfer

The trustees of Vinesong Ministries, a UK Charity that oversees the missions of Vinesong Gospel Choir, determined to close the charity due to the retirement of the founder and leader John Watson and to transfer some of its assets to TGM due to the communality of ministry objectives.

At the trustees meeting of 8th November, the trustees of TGM agreed to accept a transfer of funds from Vinesong Trust to the amount of £500,000. This was done in accordance with Charity Commission regulations which allow for transfers of funds between charities of similar charitable objectives and in lieu of the fact that Vinesong Ministries is closing.

Whilst the funds are to be given for the general objectives of the ministry, TGM used £220,000 + fees to purchase a retirement apartment and part of the remnant to pay a pension of £1000 and utility bills for missionary John Watson until his death. It was agreed that part of the other funds would be used towards TGM ministry objectives especially to cover the relocation costs of Giles Stevens to the USA.

Make America Born Again (MABA) Launch

On arriving in the USA the ministry has sought to find effective strategies to lead Americans to Christ. Giles made it clear that the only reason he was leaving Brazil for the States was in order to 'have fruit among' them. He felt strongly that just as the Lord had led Paul to leave the abundant spiritual harvest in Asia in order to reach into the heart of the Roman empire so too the Lord was leading him to leave the big church environment in Brazil to reach the US – the Rome of today in terms of influence. Indeed, he was coming to the US to: "Make America Born Again."

*"Now I do not want you to be unaware, brethren, that I often planned to come to you (but was hindered until now), **that I might have some fruit among you also, just as among the other Gentiles. I am a debtor both to Greeks and to barbarians, both to wise and to unwise. So, as much as is in me, I am ready to preach the gospel to you who are in Rome also.**"*

Romans 1:13-15

After some months of prayer, fasting, and study of local church growth, a strategy came into Giles' heart to bring people to Christ through the power of persuasion as well as proclamation. He noted that whilst Paul is known as the great proclaimer of the gospel, seven times in the Book of Acts it mentions Paul persuading people to believe in Christ. The MABA initiative was thus born to have both micro and macro gatherings.

The macro gatherings are rallies held in town squares where the gospel is proclaimed.

The micro gatherings are held in public spaces around a table where passersby are asked if they agree or disagree with a gospel truth thus engaging them in conversation. In Christ-like fashion the discussion is to attract sinners and to alert the self-righteous!

The term MABA is similar to the conservative political movement but not the same. Our advertising clarifies that MABA is spiritual, not political and based on the revelation that the heart of the human problem is the problem of the human heart.

Pilot micro-events have been held at Fort Myers Beach and at a fair in downtown Fort Myers. Others are planned for Lakes Park and Florida Gulf Coast University. Results have shown that the strategy is very effective.

Some instances are listed here:

- **An atheist** answered the question. Though he was not open to persuasion, those who listened in realized the blindness of his perspective.
- **A Catholic family** realized that sacraments can't save and concluded that justification was by faith alone.
- **A same-sex couple** felt the freedom to come to the microphone and discuss the way to get to heaven with us.
- **Two former addicts** agreed with our statement that they did not deserve to go to heaven. Then they gave powerful testimonies of their transformation through God's grace.
- **A team of tennis players** from a local college tournament poured out questions and then, satisfied with the answers, asked how they could be born again.
- **A street preacher**, who normally terrorized passersby so that they fled from him, was amazed at how we were attracting the same people. He listened and learned and wants to join us next time.
- **A teenage girl** was convinced of her need for Christ and believed on the spot. Her elder sister watched and listened and then joined her sibling.

- A **number of people** said they were going to heaven because of Jesus, but could not explain why. We helped them understand that it is through Christ's work, not theirs, through His goodness, not their own. They were so thankful that they could now explain their faith more clearly to others.


Plans for 2026

2. OTHER STRATEGIES

- Schools Work – Daniel Stevens, our schools evangelist, launched his initiative called Aviva Schools. At general assemblies he presents a motivational word to help students overcome anxiety, depression, and suicidal tendencies. These have been particularly fruitful. In three months he had over 3000 students give their lives to Christ.
- Radical Tours – Titus Stevens, our university evangelist, in conjunction with his brother Daniel, has launched Radical Tours. These mobilize youth groups to make presentations in schools and hold youth rallies in town squares in the evening. Many churches in various cities around Brazil have asked for them to come. It is noteworthy that Titus was elected as President of the Student Association at Oral Robert's University, an announcement made by University President Dr Bill Wilson. His position and responsibilities will give him further influence and connection with ministries in the US and around the world.
- MasterClasses – we continued until April with our monthly online masterclasses for an English-speaking group and for a Portuguese-speaking group.
- Radio – our weekly radio broadcasts continues to air on Wednesday mornings at 9am with a word of encouragement and prayer for listeners.
- Booklet Distribution – we continue to distribute freely our evangelistic booklets. These have been handed out in schools and hospitals as well as from house to house.

3. RELOCATION:

We are now planning to relocate from Brazil to the USA in order to initiate an International Mission School in conjunction with The Vine Church, Fort Myers in Florida. The school has been accredited to offer diplomas for its English Language Course and is applying for the same for its Bible Seminary Course. This being the case we will be able to receive foreign students on the F1 Student Visa to come to study. The English course will be accompanied by an option to join our regular devotionals and other activities in the church. On the granting of status for the Seminary, we will offer select places to international students as well as local Americans with a full-time ministry call. Our vision is to train them to return to their nations and start new churches. Being based in Southern Florida also facilitates our international travel and means that we would be able to travel to South America and Europe, Africa and Asia faster and cheaper.

At the time of writing, we have had our documentation approved by the Immigration Department and have been advised by the attorney to return to the UK to interview at the US embassy in order to receive our visas.

During this application period we will serve churches in the UK and Europe and hope to move to the US from London by the end of 2024.

INTRODUCTION:

As detailed below, we have held dozens of events throughout the year 2023 that have included conferences, crusades, encounters, church services, regional tours, and online training. These have been attended by groups from a few dozen to thousands depending upon the occasion and location.

1. REPORT ON CAMPAIGNS & CONFERENCES

- FEBRUARY 2023

Tour of Hope PARANA – Londrina, Ponta Grossa, Goiatuba, Curitiba.

This was a short tour over 6 days with day and night events held in local churches. Thousands packed into the conferences in each place. The presence of the Lord was often manifest leading to hundreds being drawn into deeper commitments. During the services in a poor area of Curitiba, many demons manifested and were cast out. In Ponta Grossa the whole church was filled with the Spirit after a series of remarkable healings took place.

- MARCH 2023

Activate Conference ETHIOPIA – Addis Ababa & Hawassa (Pastor Suraphel)

It was our first event in Africa for over twenty years. I was surprised at fervour of the local believers who came to the events which started at nine in the morning and often continued until nine in the evening without stopping. The pastor wept as he translated my messages. He later said that even though his people thought he was crying because of his intimacy with the Lord, he was actually crying because my messages made him realise that he could know the Lord much more deeply. From packed out meetings in Addis we travelled up country to Hawassa. It had rained when we arrived at the airport and now it rained again. This was the first rain they had had for months. The locals took it to be a sign from heaven that we had been sent from God. Here five thousand people crammed into a hanger. There was no room for other thousands who stayed outside. Again the people were fervent in worship and shouted "Amen" loudly each time they heard a promise of God. My son Daniel, who was accompanying me, preached an evangelistic message. Over 500 were saved. Later thousands were filled with the Spirit.

- i. Activate Conference UGANDA – Kampala

From huge crowds I flew to Kampala to hold a mini-conference with the Vine Church. Two bishops participated in meetings. At the end one stood up and declared that the message that I was preaching was needed throughout all the churches in the country because of the mix in doctrines between law and grace; and the Spirit of God and the familiar spirits.

- ii. Activate Conference UEA – Dubai

This conference was difficult to hold and required us to hire an underground venue. Principally it was attended by the immigrant community who were reluctant or nervous to attend and some of which only attended because of the provision of refreshments. I preached about the grace of God, and it melted their hearts. At the end they were so desirous that I stayed on or returned quickly. One Muslim came who had married a Brazilian Christian. I had made friends with him and chatted over dinner the previous night. He did not respond publicly when I gave an appeal for those to commit their lives to Christ but in the prayer time he came forward and kissed me on the cheeks whispering that he believed what I had taught. Later I understood that it would have been dangerous for him to make a public confession.

- APRIL 2023

- i. Prayer Campaign – FULL HOUSE

We spent 21 days in prayer and fasting for God to fill His house, the church, with His presence and new souls.

- ii. Activate Conferences TOCANTINS – Palmas & Gurupi

These conferences are designed to be mobilise believers into the precious work of soul-winning and to be a fore-runner to a large scale evangelistic event. Two days of ministry left the local believers full of the Spirit and rejoicing in the Lord having been activated in the call to the ministry and spiritual gifts. The strategy to activate the believers in the area of evangelism is to use our Manual of Good News Houses. Guided by this, each cell group starts an evangelistic meeting in the house of an unbeliever. Over the course of seven weeks, one of the seven Good Things written in the manual is presented. In this way a new cell group is birthed in a new house.

- iii. Evangelistic Campaign TRINIDAD & TABAGO

I travelled with my daughter Jemimah to the island of Trinidad, where a local crusade had been organised by Rachel & Wayne Williams from Florida upon the invitation of a dozen local churches. We joined a team from the US which included two other preachers. During the daytime, we evangelised locally and at night we preached at the venue. The spiritual atmosphere was quite closed and the churches somewhat divided. On the first night, Pr Mark Boykin of All Nations Church Boca Raton asked if I would preach in his stead as his throat was sore. I preached with as much faith and fire to break the atmosphere which, thank God, I did. Whilst not large numbers, many came forward to be saved and then were filled with the Spirit as the week progressed. Pr Boykin was so impacted by my preaching that he asked me to help him with a new TV channel that he is launching in the US and the 10/40 window.

- JUNE 2023

- i. Activate Conference – Ethiopia

I returned to Ethiopia as the local pastor said his people wept when they heard I might come. I could not resist this even though it was so expensive and trying to travel there. The services were in amongst some of the poorest people imaginable with a very simple education so that I was forced to deal with the very basics of Christianity. However, the response of the people was heart-warming.

- ii. Activate Conference – UGANDA - Kamapla

My colleague Pastor Suraphel had organised this conference to minister to Ethiopian and Eritrean refugees that had fled to Uganda. The majority of these were desperately poor and without work. My heart broke for them, but the Lord gave me an mighty anointing to preach to them for many hours each day. Titus, my son, admirably supported me in these labours. I noted, not for the first time, that he is able to present deep gospel truths in clear, concise ways, and, with each sermon, is better at bringing people to a point of decision. His sermon on "Grace that teaches us" was remarkable.

- iii. Church Event SOUTH AFRICA – Johannesburg

Taking the opportunity of being in Africa we dropped down to Johannesburg on our way out where I met up with an old friend and colleague in the ministry who had the honour of being the great-grandson of the renowned apostle of faith Smith Wigglesworth. Taking on from his parents he now leads a thriving multi-racial community of believers on multiple campuses. I ministered on living a life full of the Spirit from beginning to end.

- JULY 2023

- i. Tour of Hope GOAIS – Goianesia, Goias Velho, Neropolis, Sancerlandia, Nova Veneza, Goiania

For this tour we received five Americans and one Englishman to join a team of twenty young Brazilian evangelists. The tour took us to six cities over the course of ten days. Each day the team evangelised on the streets and held gospel events at night in town squares and football fields. Many came to the Lord at the events and the team was so thrilled with the experience that they want to repeat it as soon as possible. We travelled between cities in a hired coach and slept in houses, hotels, and camps. My campaign organiser quit a few days before the campaign and left me with much organisation and administration to do. But the Lord graced me and all things fell into place without stress.

- SEPTEMBER 2023

- i. Conference RIO DE JANEIRO

I have been received well here over the years and this time was no exception. Many were filled with the Spirit.

- ii. Evenings of Hope UK & GERMANY – London, Swindon, Yeovil, Germany

I was glad to minister to my own country folk in the UK and to see that the church that I planted in Swindon ten years ago continues to flourish. I met with members of the folk who have remained faithful and also many new folks. The services were filled with Spirit, and I was received with much joy. Similar in London and Shaftesbury we enjoyed rich fellowship in the presence of the Lord, and many feasted upon the words of grace that I shared. One service was held in the house of former trustee Pip Earl and the other in the café of a fellow evangelist Dominic Muir. My experience in Germany was refreshing too. Ministering to mostly Brazilian immigrants I noted how they had kept their fervour for the Lord and were so hungry for the things of God. Some Germans are being won to the Lord but mostly through marriage and these seem still to be quite reserved in their expression of faith.

- iii. Association of Campaign Evangelists NORWAY

It was a long way to go and a great expense to get there but I felt privileged to be invited again to a select group of campaign evangelists and to share with them. My topic was: How to grow in the anointing. I preached a good hour and then many younger evangelists crowded around me for another hour or more to ask questions as they had been stirred when they saw the correlation between grace and glory in the scriptures. All seemed to bask in the revelation. That said, some days later, I received a very critical communication from an older American evangelist who accused me of teaching heresy and abusing the good will of the board of trustees by mentioning the doctrine of the eternal salvation of the believer. In response I communicated with the board and asked them if this accusation was just and whether my doctrinal position on this or mentioning of it was a problem for them. They have yet to give me a formal reply.

- OCTOBER 2023

- i. Activate Conference – IPATINGA – Pr Ricardo

I returned to a city I had been to years before and seen a great outpouring of the Spirit. The new pastor has done a fine work in building up the church, though there was little intense expression in among the believers. This soon broke under the presence of the Holy Spirit and by the end of the conference the atmosphere was electric.

- ii. Tour of Hope IBERIA – Lisbon, Faro, Viano de Castelo, Valladolid, Madrid, Torreveja

I returned for another tour in Europe, this time of the Iberian Peninsula. Ministering mostly in Brazilian immigrant churches that were most lively. I was pleased to note that these churches were making inroads to the local communities and winning the local Portuguese and Spanish. In the Costa Blanca, a small Russian group had also joined the church. I preached in Portuguese that was translated to Spanish in the pulpit and simultaneously to Russian through headsets. Whilst not expressive, it was clear that the Russians hearts were being affected.

• NOVEMBER 2023

- i. Activate Conference – CUIABA – Pr Fernando

Although tired from my recent overseas trip and after only two nights at home with my wife and children I headed off to the neighbouring state, in a very poor area. It was a burning 42 degrees C (107 F) when I stepped out of the airport terminal. However, I was glad I went. The people were hungry for the word and fervent in worship. A group of small children (4 years old and upwards) were baptised in the Spirit with the evidence of speaking in tongues, prophesying and declaring God's goodness. I held the microphone to one child and as he spoke in tongues the whole room seem to fill up with the presence of the Lord.

• DECEMBER 2023

- i. Vine Leaders Conference – GOIANIA – Pr Aluizio

I am now in the process of helping to organise a large conference in my home city of Goiania with Pr Aluizio of the Vine Church who has agreed to receive two ministers from Africa that I have recommended – Pr Surphel Demissie and Pr Peter de Fin.

2. NEW INITIATIVES:

I have launched a monthly MasterClass on Evangelism in both Portuguese and English. These meetings take place live on Zoom. Later the recording was shared on the WhatsApp Group. There are currently 540 participants in the Portuguese-speaking group and 92 in the English-speaking group.

Another new initiative is the weekly radio broadcast that Silvia and I are doing on the local radio station Vinha FM 91.9. This is the third largest station in the region. Being digital it also has a wider reach. Our objective here is to share a short word about Christ to inspire faith in the hearts of listeners and then to pray on air for listeners. The audience also can send in specific prayer requests to be prayed for in person given the time.

A new opportunity has been presented to me. As well as Pr Boykin inviting me to be an anchor minister on his new TV channel, Pr Marcio Alves from The Vine Church in South Florida has asked if I will join him as the lead pastor of the American church (his own being Brazilian). In this capacity I would work part-time for the church and part-time in missions. I am interested to pursue this option as both these opportunities could mean that I am able to reach out to more poor people in Asia and Africa through TV and social media and that I would be able to preach in English.





Director's Report
Year to 1st Apr 2021

Introduction:

From January 1997 to April 2020, thousands of believers were trained and empowered during our conferences and thousands of others have been saved and healed during our evangelistic events. However, with the advent of the Corona Virus Pandemic and the subsequent lockdowns virtually all of our ministry events were cancelled or postponed.

However, in many ways we discovered that this worked out for the good of TGM and its ministry objectives for we were in a position to explore new means to reach and train people. In short, our ministry, which had been very focussed on physical events – whether it be conferences, crusades, or seminars - now launched the same types of events online.

Our decision to build a studio at the beginning of 2020 proved to be vital in achieving this. It put us in a position to be able to immediately start to minister online through video and audio messages.

In short despite the lockdowns the TGM ministry has advanced significantly over the period.

2020

The highlight of 2020 was an evangelistic initiative called “The Challenge” (O Desafio) whereby thousands of young people were equipped to share their faith with one person every day for 100 days. We communicated with young people through WhatsApp and Telegram groups and sent them daily teachings and tools for them to witness to their friends. This, in part, led to the baptism of 15,000 people on 21st November.

Also throughout the year we launched 7 Good Things campaigns. The material has now been used in various languages and implemented in Brazil, Peru, USA and the UK as well as some African and Asian countries (see below).

2021

Our main initiative in 2021 was to launch our international network of evangelists with a goal to preach the Gospel in 198 nations by 2030. Based on the prophetic vision of John in Revelation 7:9 we believe that it is clear that people from every nation, tribe, and tongue are saved before the return of the Lord. As each of these groups are seen in the throne room of God, it is evident that they are believers and therefore they have heard and believed the Gospel. It is equally evident that therefore a preacher has shared the message of salvation with them.

As a ministry we are therefore focused on getting the gospel to each nation through the means of a network of trained evangelists, outreach events, and online evangelistic strategies.

Our goal for 12 international evangelists was achieved and now for 2022 we are in the process of expanding this group to 24. See below:


