Report of the Trustees For The Year Ended 31 March 2024

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2024. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

Zac Forskitt died in 2016 of cancer and BacZac His Legacy aims to improve the life conditions of young adults with cancer through the discrete gifting of high street cards and hospital food vouchers. Vouchers are currently gifted at City Hospital Nottingham and Leicester Royal Infirmary. In time it is hoped to widen this network, to include other hospitals. BacZac His Legacy wholeheartedly believes in the psychological benefit of the 'unexpected' gift. Such gifts boosted Zac's spirits, helped him retain a positive outlook and reminded him that others cared. This in turn lifted family and friends around Zac.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

During the period the charity has provided £700 (2023: £1,380) in gift cards and £0 (2023:£0) in food cards.

The charity did not make any grants to individuals this year £0 (2023: £1,200) but has managed to fulfil a long held desire to acquire a holiday lodge for respite care and relief. This cost £248,775.00

Use of funds

During the year the charities own fundraising events cost £2,923.54 (2023: raised £4,775.19).

External fundraising events raised £5,122.34 (2023: £1,585)

Principal funding sources

The charity's principal funding sources are from charitable donations and fundraising events.

BacZac His Legacy has a long term aim to provide respite holidays for young adults and their families.



Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of BacZac His Legacy

Independent examiner's report to the trustees of BacZac His Legacy ('the Company')

I report to the charity trustees on my examination of the accounts of the Company for the year ended 31 March 2024.

Responsibilities and basis of report

As the charity's trustees of the Company (and also its directors for the purposes of company law) you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the requirements of the Companies Act 2006 ('the 2006 Act').


The members have not required the company to obtain an audit of its financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2024 in accordance with Section 476 of the Companies Act 2006.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
